

Dear Friends,

On the first Sunday in February, Feb. 2, we will step away from the usual Epiphany lesson in Luke to another lesson, The Presentation of Our Lord. This is a special Sunday when we remember Jesus taken to the temple for his official presentation at 40 days old. Feb. 2 is about 40 days away from Christmas Day. Jesus would have been six weeks old, and his mother ready to go for her purification so that she could be "clean" and enter into worship again. This is not to be confused with Jesus' circumcision, which happened when he was eight days old.

Feb. 2 is the date for The Presentation of Our Lord, Candlemas, and the only holiday for this date that sticks in people's minds -- Groundhog Day. Besides the biblical emphasis for the first one, all are dated in such a way that the sun is beginning to linger a little bit longer each day. We are halfway between winter and spring. So Britain started with hedgehogs, and Americans threw in groundhogs to give some hope that spring was coming soon. Whether the hedgehog or groundhog sees its shadow or doesn't, we all know that spring is just going to arrive when it arrives!

Candlemas is known in the Shreffler household as the day we really need to get the tree and Christmas decorations down! In some Celtic and other British traditions, Candlemas is the final day of the Christmas season. Candlemas commemorates the purification of the Virgin Mary (after childbirth, according to Jewish law) and the presentation of Christ in the Temple. New candles were always blessed at this festival. The blessing of candles did not enter into common use until the eleventh century. The celebrant, in a stole and robe of purple, standing at the epistle side of the altar, blessed the candles, which traditionally were of beeswax. Participants would also bring in their own new candles for blessing.

The story of The Presentation of Our Lord is told in Luke 2:22-40. According to Mosaic law, a mother such as Mary who had given birth to a male child was considered unclean for seven days; moreover, she was to remain "in the blood of her purification -- i.e. outside the temple -- for 33 days more. If the woman had borne a daughter, the time that she was excluded from the sanctuary was doubled. When the time was over, the mother

was to bring to the temple a lamb for sin. If she was not able to offer a lamb, she was to take two turtle doves or two pigeons. The priest prayed for her, and so she was cleansed. Mary complied. She redeemed her first-born from the temple and was purified by the prayer of Simeon in the presence of Anna the prophetess.

Simeon and Anna are two of my favorite characters. God had promised Simeon he would not die before seeing the Lord's Anointed. Simeon knows exactly who this baby is. He sings what we have called the Nunc Dimittis -- Lord, now you dismiss your servant in peace. We sang this for years at the end of Holy Communion. But his blessing and his words to Mary carry a bitter prophecy: "This child is destined for the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed -- and a sword will pierce your own soul, too." How often Mary must have thought of those words. Anna, too, who may have been 84 or as old as 107, depending on your translation, also knew who the child was, and she rejoiced, telling anyone who would listen about this child.

But who listened? Or who just saw these people from throw-away generations -- the elderly and the child -- and did not pay attention to the importance of this day. We, though, will take a day to remember Simeon and Anna, favored of God to meet his child.
