

I might have mentioned once or twice, or ten times, that Thanksgiving is my favorite holiday. At least it was when my mom was in charge and I only had to bring scalloped oysters and a couple pies. My mother delighted in having family over for major holidays. It would be good to have her joy—always. Now we pack up our car with turkey and trimmings and drive to my dad's, where I take care of the meal, with Rebecca's help with the sides. Not sure she'll have time to help me this year! But I digress.

I always loved our Thanksgiving Eve services at church, with some of my favorite songs. I loved the Perry Como Thanksgiving show on TV, where he sang "Bless This House." I loved helping my mom as both a child and adult. I loved that there were no presents to buy and that after the big dinner and the dishes were done, it was time for games.

In 1990, as a newlywed, I hosted my parents, my youngest brother, my mother-in-law, and my brother-in-law for Thanksgiving weekend. I was a little stressed as it was my first time to fix the turkey, and I also decided to make two pumpkin pies from scratch, having received two pumpkins from parishioners. I assume it was parishioners. The pumpkins were left on my porch along with a lot of zucchini and summer squash. The pies were delicious. It was a beautiful fall day, and my mom and mother-in-law took a walk into downtown Pomeroy. And in the evening, another clergy couple and a couple from my church joined us for games. This year, I have so much to be thankful for—it has been a better year. We reduced our number of ER visits from four (all Pastor Ron) to one this year (me, after breaking my head open in March, leaving a lovely scar). We reduced the number of hospital stays from four to one (all Pastor Ron). Last year, January through August was a nightmare. Just when Pastor Ron seemed to be

doing really well, gout and cellulitis struck the Monday before Rebecca's Friday wedding, and we had to take the walker with us to the resort. But he was able to discard the walker to dance the Father-Daughter dance at her reception to Billy Joel's "Lullaby." We were able to laugh hilariously at Christian's and his mother Stephanie's Mother-Son Dance to "Time Warp" from the Rocky Horror Picture Show. Rebecca and Christian had a gorgeous day for their outdoor wedding, and we got to spend time with friends and relatives. My great-nephew, Liam, not quite 3 at the time, decided to go through with the whole ring bearer thing. "I will be brave, Dad," he announced to my nephew. Of course, it helped that Mom was at the end of the aisle with a Snickers bar. It was a wonderful weekend, and God truly blessed us.

But who would have known how quickly we would be blessed again? Four weeks before their first anniversary, Rebecca gave birth to our first grandchild, and she and Christian showed us last week what wonderful parents they are, and how when one is at the end of his/her rope, the other takes over. We have been blessed with a tremendously healthy and bright girl who makes her needs loudly known if clues have not been picked up on, who stares at us in wonder with her dark blue eyes, who smiles at a sweet dream in her sleep. This will be a Thanksgiving to remember for our family as my father will be surrounded by his two great-grandsons and his first great-granddaughter for the first time. I am

- □ 1 box Cake Mix
- □ 1 can/container Icing
- □ 2 cans Fruit (15-20 oz)

Place each meal in a box or bag along with \$12.00 in an envelope for meat and perishable items. Please tape the envelope containing the money inside the box where it is visible.

If shopping for the items is not possible, you may donate money and volunteers will do the shopping for you. We are asking for \$25 to cover the cost of the items.

Our LYO members and volunteers will sort and deliver the boxes to the pantry at Sardinia Hope after worship on Nov. 12.

Psalm 23


The work of the shepherd in this time, has passed, but
