My mom and I were always
Team Real Christmas Tree. No
matter how much I loved going
to see my Grandma and
Grandpa Leach at Christmas,
the aluminum thing with the
bright lights was **NOT** a
Christmas tree. My dad, who
was the one who had to struggle
the trunk into the holder, was
Team Artificial. He lost that
battle every year.

And then came 1987, when my family found their children scattered. My youngest brother, Craig, worked for the government in Battle Creek, Michigan. My brother Dave and his wife Terese had a two-month-old baby boy, Joshua, and they lived in St. Louis where he was a cartographer for the government. I was on an internship in Staten Island, NY. Craig would be able to be there for Christmas, but not the rest of us. Dave and Terese didn't want to travel with their little one (thank goodness Rebecca and Christian had no such worries!), and I obviously had church duties (fun fact: our church secretary got mad at the pastor and quit on Christmas Eve with no bulletins done for Christmas Eve or Christmas morning). I would have vacation time for a week in January.

So Team Artificial won that year, but for a very sweet reason. My dad said, "We don't know from now on when our family will be with us to celebrate, but now we'll have a tree decorated whenever they come."

We try to celebrate with my dad on Christmas Day or as close as we can come. This year, my brother and hopefully the two oldest nephews who couldn't make it this week, will come the first week of January. We will celebrate Christmas and Rebecca's and Christian's January birthdays the second week of January. Christmas with family is not always celebrated on Dec. 25. I was used to this because growing up in Kettering, I had one set of grandparents in Athens and one set in Upper Sandusky, so we were often switching where we would be. Because of Christmas duties, we would go to my parents' house for an afternoon Christmas dinner, and we
