"You did not choose me, but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last."
 -- John 15:16

Dear Friends,

We began reading the Gospel from John 15 at the end of April. As May begins, we continue. The Gospel for May 5 is a special one for me. When I was preparing for my ordination, this verse caught my eye as I was looking for ordination bulletins -- "You did not choose me, but I chose you...to bear fruit." I looked up the passage in the Bible, a continuation of last month's Gospel from John 15: "You did not choose me, but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last." It was my ordination Gospel lesson and the lesson on which my internship supervisor Paul Bodin preached.

Eight months later, when we married, Ron and I again chose John 15:9-17 as our Gospel lesson, read by my brother, Dave. This time we chose it because of Jesus' commands about love: "that you love one another as I have loved you."

This is a good Gospel for Rogation Sunday as we talk about abiding in Jesus as branches to the vine. I also think it's a good Gospel for Mother's Day. For good mothers, their love for their children comes as close to "loving one another as I have loved you" as I can think of. It's impossible to love each other with the same love as Jesus, and yet this is a command. We are commanded to love one another and at least aim in the direction of loving each other as Jesus loved us. And if you think that's too great a task, remember that even Jesus became impatient and frustrated with his disciples in much the same way as we become impatient and frustrated with our children at times -- and the same way we drove our parents crazy.

The other sentence that makes me think of mothers and children is this one: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." For most of us who are mothers, there would be no question that we would lay down our lives for our children. Does my child need an organ? It's hers. Mothers during the holocaust were human shields for their children. I have read stories of pregnant women with cancer who have refused treatment because it might harm their babies. Some recovered. Some were able to hold their healthy babies in their arms before the mothers died. Some were in comas when a

healthy child was born through Caesarean section. A mother who loves her child will lay down her life for that child.

Jesus tells us that if we keep his commandments and abide in his love, his joy will be in us, and our joy will be complete. Joy is not the same as happiness. The joy we have in Christ Jesus doesn't mean we will never be sad or even devastated. Joy is that feeling that we have obeyed Christ, that Christ is with us every step of the way, and that we know we are Jesus' friends. Jesus has shared with us everything about the Father. That makes us his friends.

Jesus says "I call you friends." You will notice by the greeting each month that I call you friends as well. What can we say about Jesus calling his believers friends? Those words warm our hearts, but they also challenge us to be the kind of friends on whom Jesus can depend. After all, no one can gladden our hearts like a friend, and no one can break our hearts like a friend. John, in his first epistle, advises, "No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us." Surely being a friend of Jesus works the same way. Our efforts to be a friend can gladden or break Jesus' heart. Please remember that we do not do this to make the team. Jesus has already chosen us. We befriend in Jesus' name to express who we are and declare what we believe and to bear fruit. We do it for the joy of it. Alleluia!

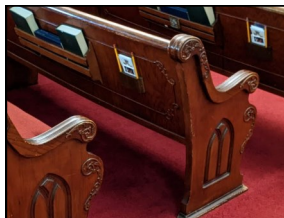

Evangelism Committee Changes Meeting Date

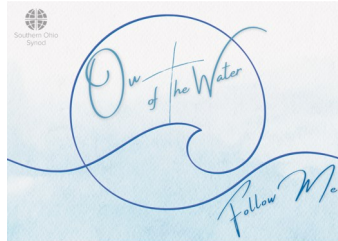

SOUTHERN OHIO SYNOD ASSEMBLY VOTING MEMBERS

The Southern Ohio Synod will hold its 2024 Synod Assembly on Friday, May 31, and Saturday, June 1, at Peace Lutheran Church in Beavercreek, OH. Friday evening is free and open to anyone and



will feature two series of workshops. You must register, but it costs nothing. The business meeting will take place on Saturday morning and afternoon, followed by a service of Holy Communion.

We need two voting members to attend on Saturday. The cost is \$100, but the church will register and pay for the pastor and the voting members to attend. The theme will be *"Out of the Waters... Follow Me."* The theme verse is Romans 10:14-17. A continental breakfast and lunch on Saturday are included. Pastor Laura will not be able to drive voting members this year as she is going to be spending Friday night at her father's house, which is near the site of the assembly.

If anyone is interested in more information, see Pastor Laura by Sunday, May 5, before the Church Council meeting. The registration deadline is Friday, May 10.

The synod will hold two PreAssembly Zoom Gatherings to walk through some of the content in advance of this year's assembly. Voting members should plan to attend one of these sessions: Monday, May 13, or Sunday, May 19, both from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. We will not be able to watch it at church on May 13 due to the Dorcas Circle meeting, but feel free to watch the Zoom meeting from the comfort of your home. Or you can watch on Sunday, May 19, in Pastor Laura's office with her. Voting members will receive the Zoom information via email closer to these dates.

Friday Night Workshops

As mentioned above, all Friday workshops are open to all and are free. Each workshop, except the Assembly Choir workshop, will be offered during each workshop session.

Workshop A: Who Is Your Neighbor? — Presenter: Pastor Katie Kerrigan, Director of Evangelical Mission and Assistant to the Bishop for Generosity. This workshop will introduce an intentional community listening process that will serve as a starting point for an ongoing process of listening to your neighbors in your community, getting to know them, and what they need, and discerning how your congregation can be a better neighbor.

Workshop B: Speed Coaching — Presenters: Southern Ohio Synod Coaches (Pastor Mike Weaver,

Coordinator). Experience the power of coaching by partnering with one of our certified Synod coaches for a free 30-minute 1:1 coaching conversation.

Workshop C: Hearing and Telling the Story of Jesus — Presenter: Pastor Tim Mentzer, Assistant to the Bishop for Leadership Discipleship, Engagement. Faith comes by hearing the Word of God. This workshop focuses on how to recognize the Word of God and how to tell the story of Jesus to others.

Workshop D: Keep Bringing the Good News of Jesus' Love: Leave a Living Legacy! — Presenter: Pastor Karl Biermann, Regional Gift Planner, ELCA Foundation. Pastor Karl will share stories of donors who discovered that they have more than they thought and that they can help others more than they ever dreamed.

Workshop E: Lutheran Advocacy in Ohio 101/201 — Presenter: Deacon Nick Bates (Hunger Network in Ohio). This workshop will be beneficial for both those who are curious about advocacy and seasoned advocates interested in receiving updates. We will discuss our Lutheran roots in advocacy and offer updates on redistricting reform, food security, school funding, and affordable housing.

Workshop F: Assembly Choir — Presenter: Linda Lally, director of music, Peace Lutheran Church, Beavercreek. This workshop will only be held during Session 2. Join us in this workshop rehearsal to prepare to help lead synod worship at the end of the 2024 Southern Ohio Synod Assembly. Linda Lally will direct our Synod Choir for this event. LYO Update

The LYO is now less than THREE MONTHS from heading to New Orleans for the ELCA Youth & Young Adult Gathering! As we are working to bring all the final pieces together, we wanted to share an opportunity with all of you!

As part of the Gathering, we lift up offerings in three distinct ways, In-kind offering, Saturday morning offering, and a special offering. Each of these offerings support unique missions and values of the ELCA and the Gathering. At this time, we'd like to share more information about the In-Kind Offering with you.

In-Kind Offering:

If you recall when we went to Houston in 2018, we collected books and you could have books shipped directly to the Gathering. For this trip, they would like to assemble Hurricane Relief Kits.

In the aftermath of a storm, hurricane, or tornado, New Orleans residents regularly find themselves without electricity. This quickly becomes a health crisis as people try to manage life in the hot, humid Gulf Coast summers. City leaders and community organizers identified the eight most-requested items to help residents as they wait for the power grid to be restored.

The goal is to create 3,000 disaster relief kits filled with these items to help New Orleanians get through the days immediately following a natural disaster. It takes about \$100 to create an entire disaster relief kit.

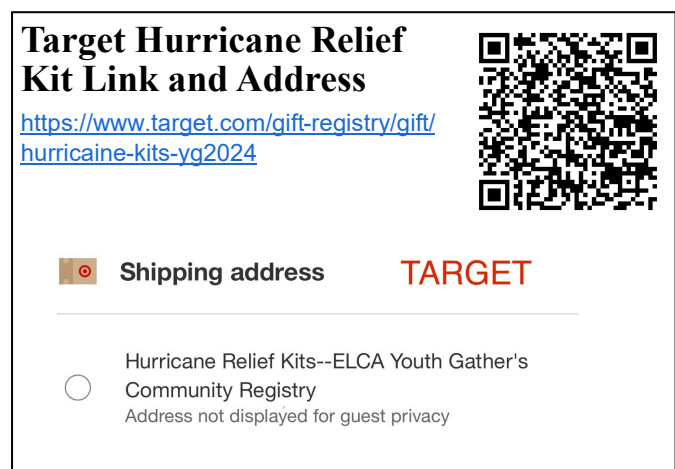
Each region is asked to bring a different item to build our kits. We have been assigned to Region 6 and are asked to collect AA batteries.
