


LYO Yard/Rummage Sale

"Then he said to me, 'Mortal, these bones are the whole house of Israel. They say, "Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are cut off completely." -- Ezekiel 37:11 NRSV

Dear Friends,

My devotions today focused on "The Valley of the Dry Bones" from Ezekiel, a very familiar story that gave rise to some spirituals. It makes me hum that song from Girl Scouts and Sunday School: "Dem Bones Gonna Rise Again." Or "Dem Bones, Dem Bones, Dem Dry Bones." You can understand why this Scripture was so important to the slave community. And it usually shows up around the Day of Pentecost because of the breath of the Holy Spirit that made the bones live.

The full story is told in Ezekiel 37. In the fall of my senior year of seminary, I was part of a small group from the "Prophets of the Exile" class. Ezekiel was our prophet. We had a presentation to put together, so we used our strengths. For some reason, I can't remember what Brad did, but it was probably outstanding. Randy put together a presentation using U2's "Joshua Tree." Curt painted the most incredible illustration of the Dry Bones. And I preached on Ezekiel 37. We got an A. So I had time to immerse myself into Ezekiel 37:1-14.

The Spirit of the LORD sets Ezekiel in the middle of a valley full of dry bones. "Mortal, can these bones live?" God asks. "O LORD GOD, you know," Ezekiel responds. Then God tells Ezekiel to prophesy to the bones: "O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. I will cause breath (also translated spirit) to enter you, and you shall live. I will lay sinews on you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live; and you shall know that I am the LORD."

Ezekiel prophesies, and there is a noise, a rattling, as the dry bones come together. They have sinews and are covered with flesh. Ezekiel prophesies again, and breath or spirit comes into them, and they live and stand on their feet. And we find that these bones represent the whole house of Israel. They are exiles in Babylon, and Ezekiel is an exile with them. They say that their bones are dried up, and their hope is lost because they feel that God has cut them off completely. But God

says, "I will open your graves and bring you up from your graves, O my people. I will put my spirit within you, and you shall live," and God will bring them back home to Israel.

So this is basically a resurrection story and sometimes shows up in the readings for Easter as well. God's Holy Spirit will enter and revive the dry, hopeless bones of Israel. God promises them a new life, and God keeps God's promises. This spoke to me today as my future in the next few days and weeks seems unknown. Our summer plans sometimes look like dry bones. And I know I'm not the only one who sometimes keeps praying and wondering what God's plan is and how to move ahead. It's easy to lose hope in the short term, but I have to keep my faith in those long-term promises of God. If you are struggling right now, my prayers are with you. Remember that God will put his Spirit within us, and we will live.

For many, many years our Sunday School and the members here at Peace have supported the Wernle Youth and Family Treatment Center, also known as Wernle Children's Home. We have received word that Wernle has now closed, so the board decided to help children in Adams County.

The Sunday School offerings for the first Sunday of the month will now be divided between Graceworks Lutheran Services and Adams County Children's Services in West Union. The About Us page for the Adams County Children Services says:

"Adams County Children Services is a public children services agency based out of Wilson Children's Home, in West Union, Ohio. Adams County Children Services is the agency responsible, by law, for helping children who are at risk of being abused, neglected or dependent. Whenever possible, our goal is to keep the children in their homes. However, when necessary, the children may need to be placed in an alternative setting until they can be reunified safely with their family."

Sunday School offerings on the fifth Sunday of the month will continue to be used to support our students in Bariadi, Tanzania. Gifts for Bariadi can be given to Debbie Mitchell, the Sunday School Treasurer, at any time. The Sunday School will also continue to collect and recycle aluminum cans to support Bariadi.

Sunday School offerings received on the second, third and fourth Sundays will be used to support Sunday School projects, benevolence and Bariadi.

As part of the Gathering, we lift up offerings in three distinct ways, In-kind offering, Saturday morning offering, and a special offering. Each of these offerings support unique missions and values of the ELCA and the Gathering. At this time, we'd like to share more information about the In-Kind Offering with you.

In-Kind Offering:

If you recall when we went to Houston in 2018, we collected books and you could have books shipped directly to the Gathering. For this trip, they would like to assemble Hurricane Relief Kits.

In the aftermath of a storm, hurricane, or tornado, New Orleans residents regularly find themselves without electricity. This quickly becomes a health crisis as people try to manage life in the hot, humid Gulf Coast summers. City leaders and community organizers identified the eight most-requested items to help residents as they wait for the power grid to be restored.

The goal is to create 3,000 disaster relief kits filled with these items to help New Orleanians get through the days immediately following a natural disaster. It takes about \$100 to create an entire disaster relief kit.

Each region is asked to bring a different item to build our kits. We have been assigned to Region 6 and are asked to collect AA batteries.


