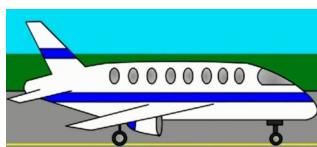

**“I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.” -- Psalm 139:14**

Dear Church Family,

The verse above is the theme verse for July's ELCA Youth Gathering and Young Adult Gathering to be held July 15-21 in New Orleans. The theme itself is “Created to Be”, inspired by the verse from Psalm 139 (one of my favorite psalms!). I can't believe that it has been 15 years since Pastor Ron, my parishioner Deb Niekamp, and I took five young people to New Orleans. This was four years after Hurricane Katrina, but New Orleans had only touched the surface of rebuilding. As we rode the bus through the poorer part of the community, we saw houses marked with X's or with numbers. We found out that an X meant no one was found in the house, and the numbers indicated how many were found dead -- usually drowned -- in the house.

But we also had a wonderful time as our group and a couple other groups rode motorboats out to an island in the bayou, where we planted wheat grass to help stop the erosion. The bayou islands were losing up to a football field a year. In the heat and humidity, we led by our efforts to stop the erosion started by Katrina. We enjoyed speakers and Christian bands at the end of each day. We had two times where we celebrated Holy Communion -- all 39,000 of us. We ate wonderful local food, we toured St. Louis Cathedral, and we enjoyed beignets and frozen cafe au lait at the Cafe du Monde (a must stop for anyone going to New Orleans). Perhaps the most important part is that our youth, who lived in an area that was 95 percent Roman Catholic, saw that there were thousands of other Lutheran youth just like them. We don't have many Lutherans in Brown County either, so this is a chance for our kids and young adults to learn from and teach other Lutherans.

Our youth -- Addy and Isabelle -- and our young adults -- Grace H., Grace R., Emma, Olivia, Lilie, Aiden and Trent, as well as Michael, who will join us from Resurrection Lutheran Church in Lebanon -- who attend this life-changing and faith-forming event will explore the many ways they are fearfully and wonderfully made, as well as what it means to be called into relationship with one another through Christ.

This year, we also celebrate the 50th anniversary of ELCA World Hunger. That is why the youth

and young adults who attend the gathering will have the opportunity to express their leadership in ELCA World Hunger as part of Generation Zero-Hunger. They will learn how to address the root causes of hunger and will be invited to support this work through their own generosity. To encourage their giving, donors have provided a matching challenge of \$250,000.

A rock, under the staff of Moses, gushes forth a stream of water (Exodus 17:6).

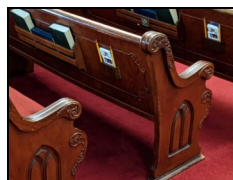


A tender sprig from the cedar tree (the promised Messiah) flourishes on the rocky mountain top (Ezekiel 17:22).

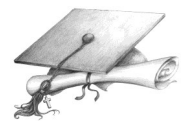
### A Place of Hope "Baby Shower"

## Interfaith Agape Pantry

With children out of school and families needing more food, nonperishable food items are flying off the shelves at the Agape Interfaith Food Pantry at Sardinia Hope Church. The pantry is doing well with monetary donations, but is running out of the actual food. It's not easy to go shopping several times a week!

Here are items that go in every box to the families:

- Cereal
- Crackers (any kind)
- Peanut butter
- Jelly
- Pork and beans, and other beans
- Soup
- Spaghetti, Ravioli and Beefaroni and Ramen noodles
- Pasta sauce
- Canned fruits and applesauce
- Corn, green beans, other veggies (peas, mixed veggies, etc.)
- Canned meats (chicken, tuna, etc.)
- Hamburger Helper
- Macaroni and cheese
- Mashed potatoes/boxed potatoes
- Toilet paper

The following items are distributed whenever they are available:

- Corn bread
- Rice
- Stuffing/gravy
- Cake mix and icing
- Laundry soap
- Toiletries
- Pancake mix

The pantry also gives out milk, bread, eggs, and frozen ground beef, hot dogs, and deer meat (seasonal).

Dorcas Circle collects these items every fourth Sunday. You can place them in the appropriate space in the large cupboard in the Access entrance area.

Peace is participating in the Agape Lunch Program, which feeds in-need children and some senior citizens in the Sardinia area. Together, the churches provide food for approximately 110 children and adults in the apartments, the trailer court and some homes.

The volunteers at Peace pack lunches on Thursdays at 6:30 p.m. in Frey Hall. We meet at the church at 11:30 a.m. on Fridays to deliver the lunches. Please check with Linda Sue Stephan about packing and distribution during the first week of July. Otherwise, we will pack at 6:30 p.m. on July 11, 18, and 25, and distribute lunches on July 12, 19, and 26.

## In-Kind Offering

In the aftermath of a storm, hurricane, or tornado, New Orleans residents regularly find themselves without electricity. This quickly becomes a health crisis as people try to manage life in the hot, humid Gulf Coast summers. City leaders and community organizers identified the eight most-requested items to help residents as they wait for the power grid to be restored.

The goal is to create 3,000 Disaster Relief Kits filled with these items to help New Orleanians get through the days immediately following a natural disaster. It takes about \$100 to create an entire disaster relief kit.

Each region is asked to bring a different item to build our kits. We have been assigned to Region 6 and are asked to collect AA batteries.

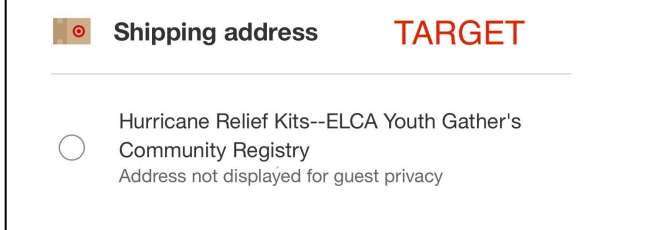

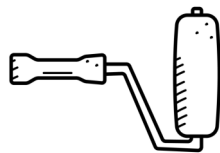

## Painting

The painters continue to work in the church. Go into the sanctuary to see what they have accomplished there!

We should be returning to the sanctuary soon. In the meantime, thank you for your patience as we've been worshipping in Frey Hall.

The Praise Band will continue to practice at 7:00 p.m. Wednesdays in Frey Hall until the instruments can be returned to the sanctuary.

Small cracks were visible in the paint running from floor to ceiling on the front wall of the sanctuary to the left of the chancel arch. As so often happens, scraping this area in preparation for painting revealed a deeper problem. The mortar coating on the interior brick wall was loose. The brick wall can be seen in the picture to the right. The damage was likely caused by water entering an uncapped chimney that runs from the basement just behind the inner wall. To repair this problem, the loose mortar was removed and fresh mortar was added. This chimney still serves as the vent for the church boiler so council approved adding a rain cap and sealing the chimney bricks. These repairs have caused some delays in the project.

President Travis Phillips called the meeting to order and read the mission statement.

Elizabeth Waits led devotions.

The Secretary's report was reviewed. Cheryl Phillips made a motion to accept the report and Linda Sue Stephan seconded the motion. A vote was taken, and the motion passed.

The Treasurer's report was reviewed. Elizabeth Waits made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report and Shauna Weis seconded the motion. A vote was taken, and the motion passed.

Natalie Vogel read Pastor Laura Shreffler's report in her absence.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

Church Property—There are three bids for painters. Another Darn\* Painter (Brad Howell) - \$17k (includes paint), good references. Small Town - \$15k and we buy paint, good references. Johnny Bohrer – no ceiling work. Linda Sue Stephan made a motion to move forward with Another Darn\* Painter and Paul Hertlein seconded the motion. A vote was taken, and the motion passed. This painter will be presented to the congregation at the Congregational Meeting on May 19, 2024.

Funding of painting and heat pump replacement: \$5,000 from Thrivent Mission Fund, approximately \$3,183 from the Building Fund (will use full available balance at time of payment), and approximately \$2,173 from the Church Improvement Donations (will use full available balance at time of payment). The remaining balance needed will come out of the Remembrance Fund. Elizabeth Waits made a motion to accept the plan to use these funds for the painting and heat pump replacement and Paul Hertlein seconded the motion. A vote was taken, and the motion passed.

Replaced light bulbs in hallway by Pastor's office.

Heat/Air by Pastor's office is down. Steve to call J&B. Boiler is loud – will continue to monitor.

Cracked toilet seat in women's restroom. Joan Yockey offered to purchase a new one and Steve Weddle will install it.

Gazebo cedar shingles – Joan Yockey gave an update on her research on how to clean them – sweep and no pressure washing – when to do this is TBD.

Steve to email council white paint samples for input. We will use Matte-finish paint.

Rope is broken on flag pole in the cemetery and the flags need to be replaced. Cemetery committee to handle these.

Tower/Bell needs research and work. Steve Bundy offered to help Steve Weddle inspect.

Cemetery—144 flags were purchased for Memorial Day. Happy Hustlers 4H group to place the flags.

Chuck has a guy out of Peebles repairing some headstones (2 are broken in half and 1 is leaning).

Finance & Investment—Nothing to report.

Evangelism—Taste of Arnheim was held on April 20.

There were 20 attendees and 9 workers. There was \$140 in donations and what to do with this is TBD.

Stewardship—Will meet on May 19.

Scholarship—There are four applications for the next school year (Grace Humble, Grace Ralston, Olivia Waits, and Aiden Fowler)

Christian Education—Money that has gone to Wernle in the past will now go to a children's home in West Union. Debbie Mitchell is now Treasurer. God's Work Our Hands day will now be on September 15. 8:30am breakfast, 9:30am presentation, 10:30am service. The speaker is Marge Beam's replacement. Church will pay for the speaker's hotel (the Bailey house in Georgetown will be recommended). Cheryl Phillips made a motion for the church to pay for the speakers hotel stay and Dorothy Carrington seconded the motion. A vote was taken, and the motion passed.

Worship & Music—Pentecost on May 19 – wear red. Memorial Day service – May 27, Legion will participate.

Youth & Family—Flower Sale was a success. Profit was more than \$1,400. Rummage Sale to be held on May 31-June 1 at Sue Bohrer's house. Will purchase and pass out Mother's Day flowers. A bake sale may be held in the future... TBD
