



**"So faith, hope, and love abide, these three, but the greatest of these is love."**

-- 1 Corinthians 13:13, NRSV

Dear Friends,

Most of you are familiar with the above quote even if you are not familiar with all of 1 Corinthians 13, also called the "Love Chapter." When I have couples choose the lessons for their weddings, almost all will pick 1 Corinthians 13. Pastor Ron and I chose it as one of four lessons ourselves.

Even though 1 Corinthians 13 is a good lesson to our couples about exactly what love is, St. Paul did not write it for dreamy-eyed couples about to marry. Paul writes about *agape* love. The Greeks had at least four different words for "love," according to how it was used. And *agape* love is a self-giving love. It is not an "it's all about me" love. It is a reaching-out love. It is a word that is not just a noun or adjective -- but a verb. It is sometimes so easy to say the words "I love you," but so very hard to show them. I was slow to even say them to Pastor Ron because I had been the one to say them first in previous relationships that did not end particularly well. So I waited on him this time -- and he did say it first. And we try to say it before bed every night. But it doesn't always translate into action for me as often as it should. Lately, the action has been caretaking, and there were times more than 20 years ago that he had to take care of me for a bit as well.

We had a brief minute of possible unity in this country, but it turned out to be even more brief than I thought. Paul felt that the church at Corinth needed some shaking up because they were showing no love to the other members of the church. They would dive into the carry-in dinner, leaving little for those who had to work or those who were slaves and couldn't come to church until later. Some felt puffed-up (Paul's words) because they were sure their gifts were greater than the gifts of their fellow parishioners -- even though the Holy Spirit endows each of us with gifts to use for others on behalf of God.

What did Jesus talk about more than anything else in the Gospels? Loving one another. Love one another as you would have them love you. Love one another even as I have loved you. He says it over and over and over. Once more, for the back of the class: "Even as I have loved you, you

should love one another." Jesus also talks a lot about money. Jesus doesn't really talk about sex. Jesus talks about people who need our compassion.

As I said, in light of an assassination attempt, people called out for unity. And many people tried for that. But in the end, talk became ugly again, and unity a lost cause. And it will only get worse. But remember this: you and a friend are allowed to have different ideas. You do not need to like the same candidate for any office. And you can still get along. There are things I do not discuss with my father or brother, because in the long run, they have nothing to do with the loving relationship I have with both those people. I have seen people write things that are hurtful to me on Facebook, but I make the decision to just move on. Plus, you know, the "love one another" commandment that Jesus gives me. The Greatest Commandment is "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your strength, and with all your mind," and "The Second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'"

So over the coming months, please, please remember what Jesus has asked of us. Reach out in love. It's not easy. The first parishioners I ever lost, on the first anniversary of my being at that church, left because of my sermon on "Love One Another." It was also an election year.

## ELCA Youth Gathering and Young Adult Gathering


The LYO and young adults traveled to New Orleans on July 15 to attend the ELCA Youth Gathering and Young Adult Gathering.

## Generation Zero Hunger

“I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.”—Psalm 139:14

Families have now welcomed youth home from the first ELCA Youth Gathering in six years. The 2024 Gathering theme, “Created to Be,” was inspired by the verse above.

Many witnessed the energy and excitement of youth at the Gathering firsthand. Our congregation will get a chance to hear about the gathering on Aug. 11.

This year our church also celebrates the 50th anniversary of ELCA World Hunger — a ministry that reflects who we are created to be, as individual Lutherans and as the whole church. We believe that, through baptism, God calls us to “strive for justice and peace in all the earth” (ELW page 236). ELCA World Hunger has carried us forward in this mission, addressing the root causes of hunger at all levels — from policy change to community gardens.

Young people had the opportunity to learn about ELCA World Hunger and express their commitment to this mission by joining Generation Zero-Hunger. They learned about how they can play a role in bringing about a world with zero hunger and were invited to support this work through their own generosity.

As part of Generation Zero-Hunger, the LYO took our special offering for ELCA World Hunger to the youth gathering in New Orleans. The offering from Peace totaled \$646.

To encourage their giving, a group of generous donors is providing a matching challenge of \$250,000 in support of Generation Zero-Hunger. The youth raised nearly \$100,000 — now they need help to get over the line!
