

Dear Church Family,

When I attended Ruth Litzinger's funeral a couple weeks ago, my attention was caught by one of the songs. She did not have regular hymns at her funeral, but her family had picked out a song by Ed Sheeran—Ed Sheeran!—called "Supermarket Flowers in the Window". I really have not listened very much to Ed Sheeran, but I have liked a lot of what I've heard. In this song, he sings of his mother who has just died. She liked to have supermarket flowers in her kitchen window. The song is a tribute to this woman. And at the end, he sings, "Hallelujah! You're home!".

Ruth had struggled for a while with her health—she was 94 after all—and Rich's death two years ago sucked some of the life out of her. But just the thought of Jesus greeting her with "Hallelujah! You're home!" made me smile—and cry. Fonda Barr tells about Roland, just before he died, raising his hands toward the ceiling. I hear Jesus greeting him with "Hallelujah! You're home!".

My grandmother died on her 93rd birthday in 2002. She was my last living grandparent, and I was privileged to have her for almost 48 years. My grandmother had dementia for many years, and the current pastor at the Church of God really didn't know her. My Uncle Jim asked his pastor to do the sermon. He also did not know her. When I am asked to preside at a funeral of someone I don't know, I ask that family to meet with me. I want them to tell me what they would like people to know about their loved one. I also invite family members to speak. Evidently either the pastor or my uncle had failed to do their due diligence. I was also aggravated because the obituary was wrong and missing people.

As a pastor, I believe the point of the sermon is to share with the beloved the promises of God. But it also helps to talk about the loved one, who had good points but who also may have had a wart or

two. The pastor, blessedly, asked if anyone else wanted to say anything. I jumped up and I spoke about my grandmother whom I loved and who loved me above reason. The good and loving and religious person. That same person who told my dad he may as well as married a Catholic as a Lutheran (she made him so mad he immediately took Lutheran instruction on weekends, three hours away at Mom's home church). And yet, she loved my mom best of the daughters-in-law, and spoke to me of her patience. I talked about playing Aggravation and Trouble, and the arguments she and my grandfather would get into when she would knock him off the board. My grandfather was the most gentle of people, but at this point he would call out a threatening, "Old woman...!". My cousins and their spouses were laughing by this time. I told of going through the Sears Christmas Catalog pointing out things while she took notes. I said, "She was not an easy person, but I loved her with all my heart". Then I sang from memory the last verse of "Abide with Me": "Hold thou thy cross before my closing eyes; shine through the gloom and point me to the skies; heaven's morning breaks, and earth's vain shadows flee; in life, in death, O Lord, abide with me." My cousin Patrick came up and said, "I love you, Lauri. You are our keeper of the story." And my Uncle Walter, the husband of my grandmother's youngest sister, Aunt Helen (1941 Jackson County Apple Festival Queen!) and a United Methodist pastor, hugged me and said, "Your grandma is so very proud right now". Words matter. The hymns matter; the songs matter.

Henry Lyte wrote "Abide with Me" after leaving

his ministry "because of health". As we age, we become more and more aware of the challenges that arise physically and mentally. Our health may be tested or impaired, often leading to adaptation in our daily lives. And, as our world as a whole is changing so rapidly in these times, it is easy to lose one's footing, one's direction, one's confidence, feeling alone and forgotten in the midst of change and uncertainty. It is easy to lose hope. The words of "Abide with Me" are a plea for God's presence and a declaration of our faith that though the world around us is constantly changing, we may trust in God's promise to abide with us through all the hours of each day and all the days of our lives. The end of verse 2 is "O thou who changest not, abide with me". Though everything around us changes, God changes not.

We will remember many beloved members of our community or family whom we have lost on All Saints' Sunday. As you wrestle with uncertainty, change, loneliness, and grief, our prayer is that God assures you of his presence and grants you peace.

Agape Holiday Food Boxes

It is time to put together the Thanksgiving and Christmas Agape Holiday Boxes. Peace will take its boxes to the Interfaith Pantry on Sunday, Nov. 16, after worship and after the LYO makes sure each box has the needed ingredients and money. If at all possible, place one complete meal in one box or bag with \$12 cash in an envelope to help with the purchase of meat and perishable items. Please tape the envelope so it is visible in the bag or box.

If shopping for items is not possible or is difficult for you, you may donate money, and Agape will complete the shopping for you. We are asking for \$25 to cover the cost of the items.

Items to include for each meal/box:

- □ 2 cans green beans (14- to 15-oz cans)
- \square 2 cans corn (14- to 15-oz cans)
- □ 2 large boxes instant mashed potatoes
- □ 2 jars or cans or 3 packets of chicken or turkey gravy
- □ 2 boxes stuffing (dressing)
- □ 1 box cake mix
- □ 1 container frosting (icing)
- □ 2 cans fruit (15- to 20-oz cans)
- □ 1 large box or 2 small boxes gelatin (Jell-O)

Distribution dates for those requesting boxes will be Monday, Nov. 24, with times scheduled from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. A specific delivery time will be given when the box is requested. Christmas distribution will be Monday, Dec. 22, from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Council Minutes — September 14, 2025

Present: Steve Bundy, Cheryl Phillips, George Fowler, Connie Perry, Linda Sue Stephan, Marion Ralston, Natalie Vogel, Joan Yockey, Pastor Laura Shreffler, Elizabeth Waits, Zac Taylor, Dorothy Carrington, Sue Bohrer President Zac Taylor called the meeting to order and read the mission statement.

Pastor Laura led devotions.

The Secretary's report was reviewed. Cheryl Phillips made a motion to accept the report, and Linda Sue Stephan seconded the motion. A vote was taken, and motion passed.

The Treasurer's report was reviewed. Elizabeth Waits made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report and Marion Ralston seconded the motion. A vote was taken, and motion passed.

Pastor Laura Shreffler read the pastor's report.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Church Property—Elevator issue from the electric panel installation – It was determined that the mistake by Shafer H&C cost the church approximately \$1,500 in additional repairs. George has been in touch with Shafer H&C and their proposed reconciliation was to offer Peace a free one-year membership to Shafer Club. The membership will run from August 2025 through August 2026. The membership is valued at \$1,668. It comes with perks such as a 20% discount on repairs, a winter tune-up, a lifetime warranty on parts replaced, guaranteed priority service within 48 hours, and more. Everyone was ok with accepting this membership to reconcile the issue.

Soffit & Fascia issue – This is a carpentry issue and not a roofing or gutter issue. Winchester Roofing can fix the issue for \$6,487.93. The fix includes the removal and disposal of up to 31 linear feet of soffit and fascia along with the existing soffit framing, installation of all new soffit box framing, installation of new facia & soffit and the reinstall of the existing gutter. It has been recommended to get another bid to compare. Triple M was suggested.

Parsonage – drip/leak under the sink, more to come.

Cemetery—Trees haven't come down yet. George will check on the status; it was supposed to have been scheduled. Finance & Investment—Steve, Travis, Dan, and Zac attended a Thrivent Zoom call. Things are going well. Thrivent is "cautiously optimistic" about our future. We have an excess amount of money in one area. There is \$64,000 in a pool that is readily available to be used. Where the money sits, only \$25-\$30k is recommended. The excess will be moved so it can continue to make money.

Evangelism—Fair parade – pray for no rain. A driver has been secured for the parade.

Directory sign-ups are going well.

VA Home Bingo - more to come.

Stewardship—Group hasn't met recently, but they feel the church is currently doing well with stewardship activities. Scholarship—Nothing to report.
