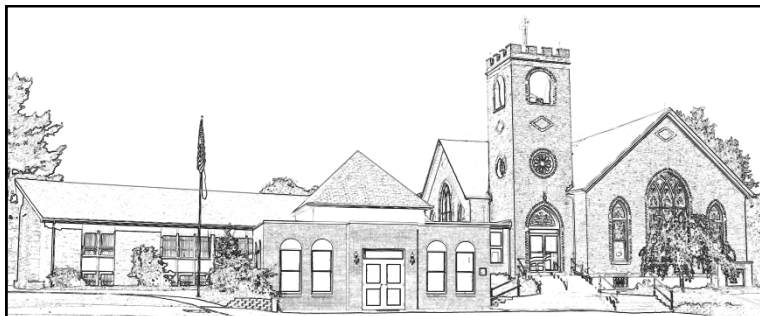

## Transfiguration of Our Lord

We end our Epiphany season on Sunday, March 2, with the Transfiguration of Our Lord. We remember when Jesus went up the Mount of Transfiguration with Peter, James and John. He then appeared to them in glowing white garments and speaking with Moses and Elijah – men who personified the Law and the Prophets, and long since dead -- about his "exodus" or his departure and death in Jerusalem. Once they come back down the mountain, Jesus sets his face toward Jerusalem, where he knows he will suffer, die, and be buried. This is our transition to Lent.

On Transfiguration Sunday, churches all over the world either "bury" or say farewell to Alleluia. We will put our "Alleluia" banner away for the Lenten season, and the word "Alleluia" will neither be said nor sung during the solemn time of Lent. This is our time to celebrate the ways Christ has made himself known to us.

## Midweek Lenten Services

"Savior\*Servant\*Friend" will be the theme of our Midweek Lenten services this year. The Midweek services will be held at 7:00 p.m. each Wednesday, beginning March 12.

Lent provides us with a perfect chance to explore the extraordinary attributes of our Savior, Servant, and Friend, Jesus. It is a time to marvel at the many blessings we received when he laid down his life for us on the cross and then rose victorious from the grave. Each service in this series dwells upon a different aspect of our greatest Friend and what each characteristic means to us as his followers and friends.

Dear Friends,

As I am writing this, I am looking forward to seeing my almost 17-month-old granddaughter soon. My daughter has always been faithful in taking time off work to travel to Ohio for her grandfather's birthday. He will be 94 on Feb. 28. Their whole family will come as well as my brother from Missouri and my nephew from Washington D.C. My nephew was just fired as an attorney for Health and Human Services, so he has nothing else to do but travel to Ohio. But that's a story for another day.

But back to Seraphina, who looks so innocent with her big blue eyes and the soft curls on the back of her head. She is not. Like Jesus, we know not to put the Lord God to the test with our sins. Seraphina doesn't know that. But what she's finding out now is that she faces consequences. And she does not like this new reality. She spent many months being a cute baby. If she wanted to throw a toy, she threw a toy. If she wanted to pull the cat's tail, she did. She was told "no," or "be gentle," and she would usually stop, but she really had no consequences. When she had her pediatrician visit at 6 months old, the pediatrician said that at the 9-month visit, they would discuss discipline. This rather shocked Rebecca. She couldn't imagine why a 9-month-old would need discipline or what that would look like. We were in Tennessee when Seraphina was 9 months old, and Rebecca related the story about the pediatrician after Seraphina banged loudly on her high chair tray in a restaurant and shrieked when her food was not coming fast enough. "Now I know what they were talking about," she sighed as she pulled her daughter out of the high chair, stood her up on her lap and said firmly, "No ma'am! We do not do that! If you keep it up, you're done with dinner." Now, Seraphina says an indecipherable word that means food and makes the sign for "more." Way better!

Children are not completely innocent, and they have to learn, and so Seraphina is learning, but not particularly with good grace and happiness. Rebecca told me one day Seraphina had had a time out. I asked what a time out for a 1-year-old looked like, and evidently she stands with her hands on the wall for one minute. She *hates* it. Her sins have, again, been throwing toys, a providentially short time of biting, hitting her dad on the shin with a hard toy, throwing food, and pulling the cat's tail.

## From the Pastor



Although Rebecca says now that the cat and Seraphina are "thick as thieves" and gang up to get into trouble together. Last week, the whole family had the flu, but Seraphina, who had it first, recovered first. Rebecca said, "She should have had at least four time outs today, but Christian and I were too sick and exhausted to do anything."

Both in the Old and the New Testaments, writers say that whom the Lord loves, he also disciplines. Rebecca and Christian love Seraphina with all their heart, just as Pastor Ron and I loved Rebecca. But we had to discipline, and so do they. We didn't want a spoiled princess in our house, and neither do they. God loves us so much, and yet we continue to sin. We continue to defy God. I think that right now, God would like to give the entire world a big time out. Ash Wednesday is coming up. We will confess our sins and ask for God's forgiveness. We will come up to receive ashes -- a part of the punishment God gave to Adam and Eve -- from dust you came; to dust you will return. Lent is a solemn time of contemplation, of humbling ourselves before our Lord. The weeks will pass until it's Good Friday, and we ache with the knowledge of Christ's death on the cross. Christ took our sins upon himself because we just can't seem to stop sinning. Even knowing his sacrifice, we can't seem to stop. We're not toddlers. We know exactly what we're doing. But thanks be to God, Easter comes, and we celebrate the Resurrection and the gift of being a new creation and having new bodies when we join God.

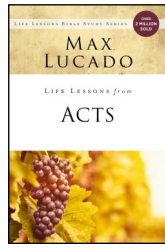
Toddlers are cute but exhausting. Imagine God trying to look after 7 billion toddlers!

Page 12 - Spiced Nuts - Add 1 ½ tsp. Worcestershire Sauce to the ingredients and add with the spice butter sugar mixture.

Page 40 - Golden Oat Pancakes - The milk amount should be 1 1/3 cups.

Page 60 - Strawberry Spinach Salad - The minced onions should be 1 ½ tsp. and the Worcestershire Sauce should be ½ tsp.

Page 129 - Cocoa Mocha Roll - Please add 1 tsp. baking powder to the dry ingredients. Pastor Laura inadvertently left this out.

Page 131 - Fay Nolte's Coffee Cake - Put in well-greased pan. On top of the dough, sprinkle sugar and cinnamon and place around dots of butter to make "suckers." This is what makes the coffee cake so good!

Page 144 - Blackberry Cake with Icing - The sugar amount in the cake should be 1 ½ cups sugar.

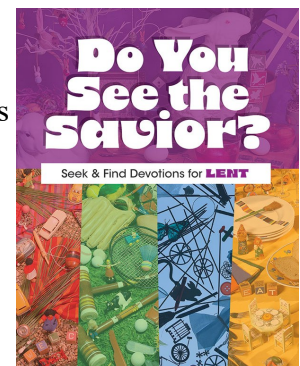
*Note on the devotions: The adult devotions and the Bible study have the same name, so make sure you're picking up the right booklet!*

### Southern Ohio Synod Assembly

The Southern Ohio Synod Assembly will meet Friday and Saturday, June 6 and 7, at the Africa Event Center in the Columbus Zoo and Aquarium. Registration will open on March 1. The theme is "Anchored in Christ; Freed to Serve." The theme verse is the Great Commission from Matthew 28:16-20.

This year's assembly will be held in person for all voting members and visitors -- no streaming. The main event will be the election of the Southern Ohio Synod Bishop. Our present bishop, Pastor Suzanne Darcy Dillahunt, has announced that she will stand for re-election, but others may join her before the synod assembly. All voting members must register before arriving. They will not have on-site registration. Early Bird registration will be from March 1 to April 15, and regular registration will be from April 16 to May 9. No registrations will be accepted after May 9.

Peace should have one lay male voting member and one lay female voting member. If you are interested, please see Pastor Laura before the April 15 Early Bird Registration deadline. Regular registration is \$65 more, and although this will cost you nothing as it is included in our already approved budget, we want to be good stewards of the church's resources.
