
## DP World launches multimodal service connecting Chennai to Delhi NCR

# MSC behind 50% of Asia-Europe fleet growth



At the start of February, 431 container ships were trading between Asia & Europe, representing a capacity of 6.33 Mteu (22% of the cellular container fleet). During the past 12 months, the Asia-Europe fleet has grown 19%.

## Air cargo rates soar: India, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka witness surge

India, Bangladesh, and Sri Lanka witness sharp spikes in air cargo rates fueled by robust demand for apparel, while global air cargo enjoys a positive start in 2024 with double-digit demand growth (+11% YoY) in February. Factors like the Red Sea disruption and e-commerce surge challenge pre-pandemic trends. Notable increases in spot rates include South Asia to Europe (+34%), China to Europe (+11%), and China to the US (+15%), prompting shippers to consider alternative hubs. As airlines prepare for summer schedules, a potential +50% capacity increase in transatlantic air cargo is anticipated.

## DHL 2023 consolidated net profit down 31%

DHL Group reported a 13% decline in revenue to €81.8 billion for 2023, with operating profit down 25% to €6.3 billion. Despite market challenges, free cash flow exceeded forecasts at €3.3 billion. CEO Tobias Meyer highlighted continued investment in network and e-commerce capabilities. Express revenue fell by 10%, while global forwarding revenue dropped by 36%. E-commerce revenue increased by 3%, but profit declined by 25%. Looking forward, DHL forecasts an EBIT between €6-6.6 billion for 2024 and aims for €7.5-8.5 billion by 2026.
