



Dave Stetson Design/Project.

Material: Mr. Stetson uses an 'Amazon Basics' pencil

- 1. Rotate 2 corners away from logo to start.
- 2. Brow Line: Make a deep V-Cut, going all the way across the pencil, but, not as deep as the lead.
- 3. Make another V-Cut under the nose (straighter-in under the nose).
- 4. Make angled cuts on each side of the bottom of the nose.
- 5. Taper the sides of the nose next, cutting up along the sides, meeting in the middle. While making this cut, rotate to the side and make a small/narrow V-cut on each side, indicating the top of the brow.
- 6. Next, make an angled cut up into each side of the face for smile lines.
- 7. Pop out a tiny 'chip' cut on each side of the nose ("50-cent" cut).
- 8. Take a small corner off of the cheek on both sides.
- 9. Make a second thin V-cut on the side of each eye for wrinkle.
- 10. Make wider V-cuts above the brow on each corner to make eye-brows.
- 11. Most dangerous cut: Come into the eye, horizontally, and into the lead to make the eye, angle a second cut along nose, and remove chip (both sides).
- 12. Make two angled cuts below nose, to make the mustache; point the tip of the blade into the lead to make a shadow for the mouth.
- 13. Take a small chip out under the lower lip, to form the lip & chin.
- 14. Now, just shave off the length of the beard as you like. And, that's it! Use a pen to mark your initials (and add "IWG" if you like), and hand out to kids at events!
