

Ode to a Pug Rhyming Words

Words that rhyme share similar (or the same) sound, usually in the final syllable.

Read the following stanzas (a stanza is a part of a poem consisting of two or more lines arranged together as a unit) from *Ode to a Pug*. For each stanza, write two words that rhyme.
