As a member of the Grizzly Orchestra, you are a part of something great!

- For 3 years in a row, 3 orchestras received sweepstakes at UIL, the highest rating!
- For 3 years in a row, we took a full orchestra, made up of students from orchestra and band, to UIL contest and received sweepstakes! We are one of 2 CISD schools with a full orchestra
- ★ The Grand Oaks Full Orchestra also performed at the CWM Pavilion for the Holly Jolly Pops concert!
- For 3 years, we had more than 10 students audition for and make the Region 9 orchestra!
- For 2 years, we had a student make the Texas All-State orchestra, performing at the Texas Music Educators Association (TMEA).
- Over the past 3 years, we had 50-70 students qualify for the State Solo & Ensemble Contest (TSSEC) each year, taking home 20-33 medals, more than any other Region 9 school!
- Over the past 3 years, at TSSEC 5 students were awarded the Outstanding Musician Award, which is only given to 2% of participants!
 - We performed in Carnegie Hall in NYC and Meyerson Performance Hall in Dallas! This year we will perform at Universal Studios!

From 7:15-2:35, students are not permitted to use cell phones. Per Orchestra policy, they are not permitted to use cell phones during after school rehearsals.


Cell phones are to remain in the student's backpack.





What is Orchestra Student Council?

Orchestra Student Council (Orch StuCo) is a group of student volunteers that organize and run orchestra related events. StuCo is very important because it is the backbone of the entire orchestra program. Every member is expected to be a role model for their peers and respectful to everyone.

What Are The Benefits Of Orch StuCo?

Orch StuCo can provide numerous benefits to your child. It can open up your child to a network of people inside and outside of orchestra. They can additionally get the following benefits below:

- Interacting with local feeder zone schools
- Earning volunteer hours*
- Gaining early access to upcoming events
- Making decisions for events and socials on behalf of the entire program*

Volunteer Hours

We will help out with orchestra related events for feeder schools like Clark, Cox, and York. Your child can sign up to help with these optional events. Hours earned can be used to apply for various clubs.

For some events, your student is required to help. These events include the orchestra banquet (spring semester), region (fall semester), and stage set up/break down during our GOHS concerts.

Making Early Decisions

Every meeting, we present a slideshow over any upcoming events that we need to plan for. We will make decisions on behalf of the whole orchestra.*

When it comes to socials, we plan the games, food, etc. Socials are events that ALL orchestra members can participate in. It allows for students to meet other orchestra members that they may not see in class.

ABOUT OUR TRIP

Airlines: We fly out of IAH. Details on the flight and airline will be available once we book the flight.
