### California Propositions Fall 2024

#### Prop 2 - No

This bond measure is for remodeling schools. School building maintenance should be part of the state's annual budget.

#### Prop 3 - No

California law allows same-sex marriage, but the California Constitution still states that marriage is between a man and a woman. If approved by the voters, this Constitutional Amendment would take away that language.

#### Prop 4 - No

A \$10 billion bond to fund various activities aimed at conserving natural resources and responding to the causes and effects of climate change. Bonds are the most expensive way to fund government spending. *Water and wildfire mitigation are necessities, not luxuries.*

Changes the state constitution to make it easier to increase bond debt, leading to higher property taxes. Shifts the financial burden from the state to local communities, increasing costs for homeowners, renters, and consumers.

### **Prop 6 - No**

Amends the California Constitution to remove the current provision that allows jails and prisons to force incarcerated persons to work during their sentence.

### **Prop 32 - No**

The state minimum wage likely would be about \$18 per hour in 2026. After that, it would go up each year.

### **Prop 33 - No**

Even though rent control holds down prices in the short term, it also reduces supply as owners withdraw from the market. Reduced supply eventually leads to higher prices than before rent control was implemented.

### **Prop 34 - Yes**

Prop. 34 will close a loophole that allows corporations to spend this money on things like buying stadium naming rights and multi-million dollar CEO salaries. It requires that 98% of the revenue received from federal discount prescription drug programs go directly to patient care.

### **Prop 35 - No**

An existing state tax on health plans would end in 2027 unless the Legislature continues it. The new rules would not become law. Would provide healthcare to illegal immigrants. It needs to be rewritten.

### **Prop 36 - Yes**

Retail theft has greatly increased since Prop 47 was passed. Prop 36 reverses Prop 47 and restores stiff penalties for stealing.

### **Local Ballot Measures**

#### **Hemet Measure N - Yes**

Increases Hemet's transient occupancy tax by 2% which is paid entirely by overnight hotel guests. Puts pressure on downtown hotel slumlords.

#### **Romoland School District Measure I- No**

Increases property tax and authorizes debt through bonds
