To Area Residents and Business Owners:

We hope that you, your families and colleagues are staying well.

By now, everyone has been inundated with a confusing array of emails and advisories about how to navigate the new challenges of daily life and running a business during the coronavirus Covid-19 shutdown.

In this Guide, we seek to provide focused and comprehensive information about staying safe, obtaining essential goods, services and assistance - - and, whether you remain on the job, are working from home, or are in transition - - a directory of local businesses that are open (with their current days/hours of operation and offerings), where you can find needed food, services, gifts, and products.

We urge residents to support our local businesses with purchases of products, services and/or gift cards during these difficult times.

Many businesses have remained open (within the parameters allowed by law) - - but many with limited offerings and hours - - and are trying to keep going, and pay their staff, until it is safe for the restrictions to be relaxed and eventually lifted. **Small businesses need our help!** All local businesses have been adversely affected. The promised stimulus funding and other government funds have, for the most part, either not yet materialized for some, or have only been available in smaller amounts - far short of the needs to sustain a business.

The changes recently made to PA unemployment compensation under the CARES Act, which expands coverage to self-employed individuals, independent contractors and others not

previously covered, may help some small proprietors and other individuals who have been adversely affected by the virus. **See Unemployment (Expanded Recipients), Pandemic Unemployment Assistance, below.**

We will revise this Guide periodically as needed, but information may become outdated as the crisis evolves. *Please check City and business websites and social media posts for up-to-date information.*

General Information, Staying Safe

City Covid-19 Information

Go to 'Search', and type Covid-19 in the search bar to access information. For regular texts about the City's response to the Covid-19 crisis, testing sites, free food for children, students, and seniors, baby diapers and supplies and other important information, text COVIDPHL to 888-777 to sign up to receive the information.

Covid-19 Testing and Symptoms

If you think you have symptoms that may be caused by the virus, your best option is to contact your own doctor to arrange a test. Symptoms can include fever, extreme fatigue, loss of taste or smell, a deep/dry cough, difficulty breathing, some digestive issues, chills, repeated shaking with chills, and for some, blood clots, at times pinkeye (although there are other causes) and, more recently discovered, various kinds of rashes and skin discolorations. For older individuals, family members are urged to watch for signs of apathy, loss of orientation, confusion, lethargy, nausea, vomiting, weakness, sleeping a lot more, not speaking, dizziness, and collapsing, which could be signs of the virus in the elderly (but, of course, all have other causes as well).

If you do not have a regular doctor or can't get help, there are several testing sites in the City being offered by various organizations - - even one in the neighborhood...

Jefferson Health offers mobile coronavirus testing at the surface parking lot at 10th and Sansom Sts., Philadelphia, across from the hospital. Patients with a referral from a Jefferson doctor may walk or drive up. Current hours: Weekdays 8AM-5PM, Sat 9AM-5PM, Sun noon-5PM. Other Jefferson sites also offer mobile testing. www.jeffersonhealth.org. For more testing locations, google ibx Covid-19 testing sites. Some test sites require pre-screening online in addition to a doctor's prescription.

Social Distancing

Obey all government directives and keep a safe 6+ feet away from other individuals when in public. When at a place of business, you and the businesses' employees must now wear a mask, and wearing a mask any time you are in public is further recommended, per recent State directives. Also, as more information is being developed about the spread of the virus, it appears that a greater distance may be advisable when you encounter a runner or a fast walker.

Exercising Safely Outdoors

MLK DRIVE OPEN 7 DAYS A WEEK, OTHER RECREATIONAL SITES...

Many City and regional parks are over-crowded, and individuals using them often do not keep a safe distance. In response, the City has closed Martin Luther King Drive to vehicular traffic, and it is now open exclusively for recreational use, 7 days a week. There is also a movement afoot to close the inner drives of the Parkway to vehicles, for recreational use, but the City has not yet acted on the request. Pennsylvania State parks are open for visitors, but facilities within them (offices, restrooms) are closed. They are often crowded, depending on the day/time. All New Jersey State, County Parks and golf courses are scheduled to reopen sunrise Saturday, May 2nd, but with no offices or rest rooms. Continued social distancing is required.

Unemployment (Expanded Recipients)

COMPENSATION NOW AVAILABLE FOR SELF-EMPLOYED, SOLE PROPRIETORS, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, GIG WORKERS, EMPLOYEES, AND OTHERS AFFECTED BY PANDEMIC...

Many people who have lost their jobs have had difficulty filing for unemployment, as the system has been jammed, and many have yet to receive any benefits. In the meantime, the State has significantly expanded the beneficiaries of unemployment compensation (under "PUA", Pandemic Unemployment Assistance, facilitated by the CARES Act), to cover self-employed individuals, independent contractors, part-time workers, gig workers, workers with insufficient work history to qualify under normal circumstances, and those unable to work because of the coronavirus: E.g., a person who has been diagnosed with the disease, is caring for someone with coronavirus, whose household member has been diagnosed with it, who has to care for their children since the schools are closed, his/her place of employment has closed because of the pandemic, and other changes. There are also changes to the amounts and other terms of compensation, all under the new federal CARES Act legislation.

The PA primary election has postponed until June 2, 2020, but it is not clear what the status of the pandemic will be by then. *Keep safe and still vote by requesting a mail-in ballot now*. Anyone can vote by mail now; you do not need to be absent from Philadelphia on Election Day. You can call 215-686-3469 to ask that a mail-in ballot be sent to you, but it is much more efficient if you do it on the website, where you can complete the application for the ballot directly, and then it will be mailed to you. *The last day to apply for a mail-in ballot is May 26, 2020. The last day to register to vote is May 18, 2020. Mail-in ballots and absentee ballots*

must be received by the County Board of Elections June 2, 2020 by 8 PM (June 9 for overseas and military absentee ballots); postmarks don't count.

Starting Saturday, May 2, online ordering will be available for curbside takeout of wine and beer and beer delivery.

Buy a gift card and the SGCDC will purchase a gift card in the same amount for its use after the crisis abates for business promotions and giveaways!

PA restaurants that have a restaurant or hotel liquor license and are selling prepared takeout food may soon be able to sell take-out mixed drinks, per State legislation that could be enacted by the end of the week of April 27. It is a temporary measure, for establishments that have lost more than 25% of their average monthly sales as a result of the coronavirus shutdown. Drinks are limited to 64 ounces, in sealed containers, and sales must stop at 11 PM. The provision will be limited to the duration of the pandemic and mitigation period, and until an establishment "exceeds 60% of its capacity". Other regulations also apply. Check with your favorite restaurants to see if they will be providing this service, and when.

As of Monday, April 27, most State stores are now offering curbside pickup, but the process may not be easy. Per LCB current website directives, orders must be made by telephone (no inperson, voicemail, or email orders for curbside pickup), starting at 9AM, Monday through Saturday. A limited number of telephone orders will be taken (from 50 to 100), on a first-come, first-served basis. Orders are limited to 6 bottles per customer, per store, per day. Credit cards only. No returns. Curbside pickups will be scheduled between 9AM and 6PM within a few days of placing the order. Customers must present ID at pickup. Go to the LCB website, above, for a full list of participating stores, phone numbers, and current procedures or call a store. The closest participating stores are listed above. Check the store you wish to pick up at for their hours and procedures.

Other: PA residents may now receive up to 36 cases of wine per year shipped direct to a home or business address by an LCB approved vendor, for personal use, and not resale. Check how quickly you will receive an order, and whether you must sign in person at the time of delivery. Proof of age of the recipient must be provided when ordering.
