



Our goal is to make the Canadian environmental community equal to its vital task. We aim to bolster Canada's environmental sector by providing capacity-building training and support to small environmental nonprofits. We offer training programs aimed at nonprofit leaders at every stage of their journey - from founders to executive directors to volunteers, board members, fundraisers and other staff. Our mission is to train 10,000 environmental leaders by 2030.

Since 2021, the Capacity Building Institute has worked to deliver its services to environmental organizations across the country. Along with GreenBooks (bookkeeping services), Eco Executive Director (administrative services) and Eco-Internships (staffing support), we make up Sustainable Capacity Solutions, a vibrant and growing network of social enterprise organizations tailored to the needs of Canada's environmental nonprofit community.

Hosted by Sam Laprade, the Capacity Series dives deep into board structure, mission delivery, engagement organizing, work culture and everything in between.




Our year at a glace

We launched our communications channels

In pursuit of our goal to be Canada's premier training support for the nonprofit environmental sector, we launched various social media channels. This includes a monthly webinar series, a growing YouTube presence packed with video content, and other media detailed further below.



We are growing



Capacity Building Institute formally incorporated in the summer of 2021 and hired its first-ever Executive Director in January 2022. Since that time, the team has continued to expand with new staff.

We strengthened our ties within the broader Sustainable Capacity Solutions group, formalizing our working relationship with Eco-Internships, Eco Executive Director and GreenBooks. We also strengthened our working relationship with the Canadian Environmental Network.

In 2021-22, the staff and board kick-started a strategic planning process to guide the organization through the next few years.






Ottawa Engagement Organizing Community of Practice

In partnership with the Gosling Foundation and Sustainable Eastern Ontario, Capacity Building Institute worked with six organizations from the Ottawa area to enhance their use of engagement organizing techniques in their environmental work.

Expansion

Since 2017, Capacity Building Institute has offered training to nonprofit environmental leaders. Over time, we have added new programming streams. 2021 saw the launch of our Capacity Series webinar, drawing hundreds of participants from across Canada. It also marked the start of our "Fundraising Intensive" program, targeted at fundraising professionals and other nonprofit executives.


New website

Funding Update


