City News:

Dog Impound:

Dogs loose in the city are normally picked up by police or animal control and taken to the Baker Animal Clinic. The city had a contract with the clinic, but the contract will end on 2/15/25 by the choice of the clinic. In the short term the city needs a new place to house stray dogs. The city is in talks with possible other sites. In the long term we need a stable solution. Several ideas were discussed at the council meeting last night. A potential solution is to open a county animal shelter. The city and county or a private entity like the Humane Society could operate a shelter. Best Friends representatives and New Hope (dog program with Baker Correctional) spoke about some possibilities, as well as several community members. The old kennels and runs at Donna's Grooming were discussed. Also, plans were made to create a Dog Board or Committee to help steer these ideas. If no agreement can be reached by the 15th, only vicious dogs and dogs that bite will be picked up. All parties want to make something work.

Housing:

The city with the help of R3 (Regional Rural Revitalization) put together a request for capital funding that will go to the state legislature. The city is asking the state for \$3 million and R3 for \$1.8 million. This money will be used for infrastructure like roads, sewer and water, sidewalks, etc. This will bring the costs of new construction down. The 6 subdivisions being submitted for this money are construction ready. Projects can begin withing 60 days of funding if approved. If all subdivisions are built it would add 88 dwelling units (DU) to Baker City. A DU is a is a single unit that provides living space for one or more people. These can include single family, duplex, condominium, townhouse, etc. It is estimated Baker City will need 234 DUs by 2040.

Health:

Immunizations:

Baker County Health Department (BCHD) and Baker 5J remind you that <u>school exclusion</u> day is February 19th. Make sure you student is caught up on vaccines. The Vaccines for Children program means any child can get their immunization regardless of ability to pay. Call BCHD at 541-523-8211 for an appointment at the high school or BCHD.

Cold and Snow:

Make sure you are dressing for cold weather. Multiple layers are the way to go. If you do not have adequate clothes for the cold check in with Marla's Mall (free) at the High School (541-524-2309) or the Compassion Center at the Nazarene Church (free) (541-523-9845). Salvation Army and People Helping People have inexpensive clothes options too. Heavy snow can become a hardship for people as well. Especially the elderly and people with disabilities. Be careful overexerting out in the cold. The YMCA had help posted the last 2 storms. Check their FB page if we get another big storm.
