Baker Area:

National Park Service (NPS), Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and US Forest Service (USFS) have had thousands of layoffs. The local USFS, Wallowa-Whitman National Forest, office has had 34 employees fired in Baker. USFS has lost 3400 workers, BLM has lost 800 workers and the NPS has lost 1000 workers nationwide to terminations. Another large number of workers chose to take the buyout. There are those saying the media is blowing the layoffs out of proportion. Let's talk proportions. We have about 190 federal employees in Baker County and about 25% have been cut. Seems like a huge proportion to this newsletter.

I have read of people happy that the layoffs are occurring, cheering that "leeches on our backs were pulled off". Let me be clear these are our friends, family and neighbors. There are decent humane ways to downsize a government. Offering early retirement and as people retire not replacing those jobs. Allowing natural attrition to occur. Retrain and shift workers into needed roles while downsizing the roles you wish to eliminate. The current method grabs headlines and appeals to the vicious few, but those of us who care about our communities and neighbors are appalled. I am putting a call out to check on those people you know who are affected. With the number laid off in this county alone chances are it is someone you know.

Food Insecurity:

The rate of food insecurity in Baker County is 13.2%. What does this mean? This means that about 1 out of every 8 people in Baker does not know where their next meal is coming from, or if they will be able to buy groceries and feed their family. 36.71% of the county is eligible for SNAP benefits. This is where free school breakfast, snacks and lunches are extremely important and how much the Backpack Program means. Low cost senior meals at Community Connections(CC) help. You can help with a donation to the Backpack Program or sponsorship at CC. Or go to Bi-Mart or Grocery Outlet and buy non-perishable food to put in a Sharing Pantry.

Dog Impound:

A temporary agreement has been reached with Baker Veterinary Hospital to provide impound services. The fees have gone up drastically. Avoid fees by keeping your dogs secure. The new fees are \$35 per night and \$50 per night for dangerous dogs. The city will continue to work on a long-term solution.

Cliff Bentz Townhall:

Cliff Bentz, congressional district 2 representative to the US Congress, held a townhall Wednesday the 19th. Issues raised included: wildfire maps, watershed fuel problems, Elon Musk and DOGE, federal job cuts, the deep divide created between people, taxes and the gap between rich and poor widening. 
