#### Health:

#### Oregon Medicaid (Oregon Health Plan (OHP)):

There is a lot of talk in the news about Medicaid because of federal cuts. There are a lot of pros and cons floated about in the news and social media to cutting or ending Medicaid. This article focuses on some facts about Medicaid in Baker County and allows the reader to be informed.

- 35.6% of Baker County is on OHP according to Oregon Health Authority. This means that if you are at the grocery store with 17 other people there would be 6 on OHP, or a little more than 1/3 of the people in Baker have OHP.
- A family of four with 2 adults earning Oregon minimum wage grosses about \$57,000 per year. Net is substantially less after SS benefits, Medicare, fees and taxes are taken out. This family would qualify for OHP.
- 550,000 people annually in the US declare bankruptcy because of medical bills and medical crises contribute to half of all home foreclosure filings nationally
- Oregon spent \$13.1 billion on Medicaid in 2023, the Feds spent \$17.94 billion on Oregon.
- Only 8% of Medicaid recipients went without care or delayed care versus 28% of uninsured

This newsletter supports healthcare for all. While Medicaid may need changed, drastic cuts with loss of insurance would translate into more medical crises including lack of care, and bankruptcy. Runaway health costs need curtailed in a humane way.

#### Measles:

Measles is a vaccine preventable disease. The vaccine is highly effective. Insurance covers a measles vaccine, but if it didn't the cost would be about \$100. As of March 11<sup>th</sup>, there have been 29 hospitalizations and 1 death in Texas alone. Google AI estimates that a single hospitalization may cost society at least \$47,000. That is 470 vaccines that could have been administered for just 1 hospitalization. Please check your measles vaccine status at any pharmacy, your doctor's office or the Department of Health.
