A burn ban is in effect for Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) lands and Baker City. You may use LEGAL fireworks in city limits but not on any ODF land. All fireworks are banned in the Sumpter area because of fire danger.

Halfway

Halfway features evening events starting at 5pm. A parade, beer garden, concessions, band, pie auction and of course fireworks.

Haines

Haines has extended their celebration to 4 days this year. The 4th is still the biggest day but there is rodeo action all 4 days. The activities start on the 3rd with the Haines Stampede at 5pm. The 4th is packed from early morning to late night. It starts with a fun run/walk, then breakfast, a parade, BBQ in the park, art in the park, vendors, the rodeo starts up again at 1:30, and the day ends with fireworks at dusk. The Haines Stampede Jr. rodeo picks up the banner on the 5th and 6th with rodeo events.

Sumpter

Sumpter has always been known for its 4th flea market but last year they added a Renaissance Faire. The Faire will be bigger with more vendors this year. Events will take place all 3 days, the 4th, 5th and 6th. Come out and
