Ski for the Health of It (SFTHOI):

SFTHOI is a program to introduce youth to skiing and snowboarding, as well to grow their skills in these sports. This is a phenomenal program available locally. Students spend 8 sessions on Fridays at Anthony Lakes Mountain Resort. A mandatory lesson, rentals and lift passes are included in the program for \$80. Generous help from Community Bank and Leo Adler Fund make this possible. This year Crossroads Carnegie Art Center teamed with Anthony Lakes to raise funds from donations to attempt to sponsor more students. Even with the help there are 95 students on the waitlist! The theatre currently operates out of the Basche Sage place in a very small space. EORT owns the Orpheum Theatre, located behind the colorfully painted plywood downtown. EORT hopes to finish renovating the Orpheum and move into the new space in 1 to 3 years. The entire Orpheum project is funded by donations and grants. Live theatre is always a little different every night, it has not been edited in a cutting room. Laura Ingalls Wilder Christmas opens December 6th and runs 2 weekends. Keith Taylor brings his piano skills to the show with extra music. The actors shine with a large live audience, so come see a play this year! Memberships make great Christmas presents!
