City News:

City Manager:

City Council defined 3 goals they would like to see accomplished by the city manager. Goal 1 settle the Transient Lodging Tax (TLT). Prior to 2003 25% of TLT funds went into the City General Fund. Currently 0% of TLT funds go into the General Fund. Baker County operates the TLT fund with the Commission having the final say. This is an arrangement the city and county have. Baker City would like to have the money go back into the general fund. The council has tasked the city manager with working on this goal. The 2nd goal is to resolve our ambulance situation. There have been several instances where the current service contracted by the county has not been fully staffed or has been unable to respond because of already being deployed. The city is looking at licensing one of its ambulances and being a backup for Baker City. There are some issues with the current service that need investigated, as well as the work to bring one of the city's ambulances back on-line. The city manager has been tasked with resolving the ambulance needs of Baker City. The third goal is to get the finance department where it needs to be. There have been multiple problems with customer bills, residences dropping off the roles, inaccurate estimates of water use, lack of proper oversight and control. The city manager, working with the new head of the finance department, is tasked with getting the department back on track. Proper billing, good customer service and easy accessibility to the public are important parts of this goal.

Policing

The police department will be making property abatement a high priority. This means they will be looking for unlicensed/unmoved vehicles on city streets and right of ways. Trailers are considered vehicles in Baker City. They will be looking for trash left on property creating eyesores or disreputable smell. The police department will begin ticketing. The Justice Court plans to enforce these tickets. The police department has asked the City Council to review some ordinances to assist in cleanup of Baker City streets. With this initiative, the City Council has approved the police department to continue to advertise for qualified personnel to maintain a working staff. Having a working staff frees up detectives to work on drug, pedophile and major crimes cases.
