Brian Vegter from Churchill School estimates that for some music shows at their venue up to 80% of the attendees are from out of town. Crossroads has partnered with the Oregon Trail Interpretive Center because of the natural joining of tourism and art. Art improves academic performance. Studies of students who are engaged in arts learning have higher GPA's and standardized scores than peers who don't partake. Arts improve well-being.
