City News:

Property Abatement:

The city council has been discussing property abatement with the chief of police and the justice of the peace. In this context property abatement is cleaning up a property. Removal of weeds, trash, junker cars and/or trailers fall under property abatement. If a citizen complains about a property nuisance, such as a neighbor not mowing and not removing weeds, in the event the property becomes a fire hazard and has noxious weeds, to the city, this is part of code enforcement. The code enforcement officer visits the property and asks the owner to fix the problem. Usually, the owner is given a couple weeks to remedy the code violation. If the violation is not fixed, or the owner doesn't have a plan to fix the violation, the city issues a ticket. This creates a court date 2-4 weeks out. Court may provide another 30 days. If the citizen comes into compliance the ticket usually goes away. Lack of compliance can lead to liens against the property. Sometimes the city must clean up the property and absorb the cost since the property may become a hazard. The city is looking for solutions to recoup costs when they are forced to clean a property. This process can take months to years from the initial complaint.

Take OR 7 towards Sumpter from Baker, turn on OR 410 towards Granite, continue onto Granite Hill Rd (520), this road becomes NF 73, turn right on NF 7345 and continue to the end. The last ½ mile is poor road. The trail has some inclines, declines and flat. It is a fairly easy trail. There are at least 3 trails into Baldy Lake.
