Planning Housing Assistance RFP

The city received a grant to update the Development Code and Comprehensive Plan as it relates to housing. An RFP is a request for proposals. The city will conduct a selection process to invite qualified consultants/consultant firms to submit proposals for contracted services. The 3 main goals are:

- 1. Create Help Sheets to assist in developing housing.
- 2. Participate in Technical and Public meetings.
- 3. Suggested code amendments in compliance with OR statutes and administrative rules that may assist in helping in housing production.

Overall, they would like to make it easier to build affordable housing in Baker City.

Grab your tokens in advance at Ryder Brothers, Cheese Fairy, or Charley's Deli. Businesses set up downtown Baker City with tasty morsels. Walk from booth to booth and purchase treats with your tokens.

Hike:

Pine Creek Reservoir

This maybe a hike, maybe not. There is a bad road all the way to the reservoir and quite aways past the reservoir, up a ridge. Depending on the capabilities of your transportation, this hike can vary. If you have a standard 4 wheel drive, then the road gets fairly impassable about 1 to 3 km shy of the reservoir. Wear good shoes as the road is very rocky. If you have an ATV you can go all the way to the end of the road. If you can make it to the end, climb the ridge and look over into Rock Creek Lake. If you qualify as a mountain goat there are several peaks around that are some of the highest in the Elkhorns of the Wallowa Whitman NF. To access the road take Pocahontas Rd from Baker to Pine Creek Lane, keep following Pine Creek Lane on into the mountains. There is a gate, just be sure to close it behind you. The road is open otherwise and may not be blocked by private property owners. There is a lot of private property so stay on the road. https://hikingbaker.com/hikes
