Tell us about yourself.	I was raised in Brackettville and have spent my life working with the public, including serving three years on the Del Rio school board. Though I currently work in the oilfield, my heart is in public service, and I'm ready to give back to my community once again. With a Master's degree and full-time availability, I'm ready to serve San Angelo as a dedicated, bilingual mayor.	l am the senior pastor of a global church, a chaplain with Shannon Medical Center, a volunteer San Angelo Police chaplain for 8 years, a former Board President at ADACCV, a former Downtown San Angelo board member, and a volunteer Bible teacher at the Tom Green County Jail.
