Sigma Awarded Crown Chapter!

From the Convention 2024 introduction of Crown Chapter Awardees: "Zeta Tau Alpha established the Crown Chapter Awards in 1983 as a way to recognize chapters that maintained high standards of excellence. Crown Chapter is not a competition. We don't have Crown Chapter "winners." We have Crown Chapter recipients.

Chapters receive this award for having the determination to achieve excellence and for working together to maintain those high standards. In working together, sisters share a common purpose – and common purpose builds sisterhood."

It was just announced that Sigma Chapter received Crown Chapter recognition for the 2024 – 2025 academic year. Sigma Chapter has attained Crown Chapter status 32 times since the inception in school year 1983 – 1984. Congratulations to our collegiate sisters and keep up the momentum!

WHAT HAS THE HOUSE CORPORATION BEEN UP TO?

For those of you who weren't at the Sigma of ZTA House Corporation annual meeting at STAG in May, we missed you, and hope you will plan to join us next year on May 17, 2026. The meeting is short, the information good, the fellowship and cross-generational sisterhood great! And dinner was excellent!

For the fiscal year that began June 1, 2024 and ended May 31, 2025, the House Corporation paid out \$121,000.

This was comprised of taxes, insurance, security, lawn maintenance and other miscellaneous items - with repairs and maintenance making up more than \$63,000 of the total.

The House Corporation made the decision to re-start the window replacement project, delayed because of COVID and smaller membership than normal, for summer 2025. This was necessary due to the deteriorating condition of the windows and siding on the northwest side of the house. So, 11 windows and all the siding on the house around those windows is new. New plantation shutters on the first floor for the new windows, and blinds for the new bedroom windows were part of the overall project along with patching, painting, etc.

The south sleeping porch was turned into a "Quad" room, connecting to room 13 which is now a dressing room with added closet space and dressers. The members have been requesting a 4-person room for some time, so we're pleased to be able to provide one now.

The crumbling north steps were addressed, as was the constant problem of front porch repairs. We won't be able to kick the can down the road on the front porch much longer without a permanent, expensive solution.

The informal is the most popular spot in the house for our members, so it gets the most wear and tear. It got new area rugs this summer. Notice the new indoor/outdoor mat at the front door that was customized with ZTA on it adding a classy welcome to visitors and residents alike.

All the usual, and some unexpected but necessary, summer maintenance items were completed. The House Corporation has a long list of items to be considered in the near future in order to keep our home away from home comfortable, updated, and competitive.
