Roger Stone is a former Deputy Assistant to the President and the Director of White House Information Technology, where he directed and approved all IT strategy, policy, procurement, and processes for the White House. Roger previously served as the Senior Director for Resilience Policy at the National Security Council and as a member of the Senior Executive Service (SES), where he served as Deputy Assistant Administrator at the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and Chief of the National Response Coordination Center (NRCC), responsible for coordinating federal resources in support of state and local disaster response and recovery efforts.

Roger has served as a member of the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) Communications Security, Reliability, and Interoperability Council (CSRIC), and has chaired the National Advisory Council's Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS) Committee.

Roger is retired Marine Corps officer and has held various private sector management and consulting positions including at CACI, Akima, and the Patuxent Partnership.
