Darrin Hongerholt - March Veteran of the Month

Darrin Hongerholt graduated from Lanesboro High School in the spring of 1986. He attended Winona State College for a year and a half, while working part time for his father. Dad was a heavy equipment contractor building roads, driveways, and other earth moving projects. Darrin operated road graders, front blade caterpillars, and packers too.

Hongerholt enlisted in the army for five years with a promise that he would indeed train and work with heavy equipment, including the rank of E-2. He reported to Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri on January 11, 1990. He happened to be assigned to the new brick barracks (with individual rooms), while the company across the road was housed in the old wooden bare-wall facilities! It was cold and damp nearly every day, though not extremely cold for a Minnesota farm boy!

Hongerholt's AIT (Advanced Individual Training) was at Fort Leonard Wood for Heavy Equipment operator. Darrin could have been the instructor for the course as he could operate and maintain all of the equipment!

At the completion of his training, he had a brief leave back home, and reported to Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. He was assigned to the 84th Engineer Battalion as part of the 45th support group. One of their first assignments was to build a huge water containment facility on Kwajalein Atoll (part of the Marshall Islands.) in repayment to the natives for using their communities for combat practice. Darrin made E-4 after one year!

The 84th participated in Cobra Gold annually, which is one of the largest and longest running military exercises in the Indo Pacific region. It has evolved into a multi-lateral exercise involving numerous countries. The exercise focuses on improving coordination in both combat and humanitarian operations. Cobra Gold focuses on making it a vital component of regional defense and cooperation.

They were also part of the CAT (Civil Action Team) on numerous small islands of Micronesia while building water systems, causeways and roads to maintain goodwill with the natives.

Hongerholt completed his five-year enlistment in November of 1994 and was released as an E-4. Darrin and Norma were married in September 1998.

Norma and Darrin raised four daughters: Dee Dee, Melissa, Amanda, and Anastasia.

Adam Johnson - April Veteran of the Month

Adam Johnson signed up for "Delayed Entry" into the US Navy while he was still in high school. He was promised that his "A" School would be the Submarine Command Course.

Adam graduated from Hayfield High School in May 2007. That November, Johnson was on his way to Great Lakes Naval Training Center near Chicago, when he was injured at O'Hare Airport. He ruptured his MPFL (Medial Patellofemoral Ligament) This is the ligament which stabilizes the kneecap.

Johnson met with his Petty Officer to learn what his options in the navy could be. The news was not good; in fact, the Navy was insistent that separation would happen soon! While in separation, he was in a barracks with well over 100 other sailors going home. At one point, one of the other sailors got a sharpie and put an exclamation point at the end of his name on one of his shirts. Later, this caused him to get into some hot water during inspections.

Adam, along with several men, were expected to strip and wax the decks in the barracks! Johnson was released on December 3rd, 2007, after 23 days of active duty in the US Navy!

Adam found employment at The Great Harvest Bread Company in Rochester doing milling, mixing, kneading, and baking many kinds of specialty breads. After six years, he left and started a new job with Custom Alarm in Rochester. He developed many useful electrical skills and decided he'd like to pursue a career as an electrician.

In July of 2017, Johnson began a five year apprentice program with Sunlight Electric and the IBEW (International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Union) in Rochester.

While Adam was studying for his Journeyman Electrician license, he pursued his license to be an electrical inspector.

Now he works for the city of Rochester as an electrical inspector. Johnson and two other inspectors are responsible for the flawless electrical installation of the massive Mayo Clinic expansion in downtown Rochester!

Adam married Sondra Roerish on June 21, 2014, and they are expecting their first child on July 4, 2026!

Adam has been a member of Post 330 for 19 years.
