### Jerry Hugeback Veteran of the Month

Jerry Hugeback graduated from Hayfield High School in 1966. He attended Dunwoody Institute in Minneapolis majoring in Electronics.

In the fall of '68, he checked his status with the Dodge County draft board, and discovered he was number two on the list! So, he went to Minneapolis and enlisted in the US Navy! Hugeback reported to San Diego Naval Training Station on October 28, 1968 to begin his four-year enlistment. He remembers most of the young men in his group were from Minnesota.

Jerry had a 10 day leave to come home for Christmas and returned to finish boot camp.

He was assigned to the USS Hooper, a Destroyer Escort, which was used for two-week training sessions for Naval Reservists. He was assigned to IC (Internal Communications) with a rank of E-2, Fireman. His responsibility was to operate, and maintain, the gyroscope compass, the sound-powered phones, and the entertainment equipment. He was also in charge of selecting the movies for the troops. He recalls most of them were rather old movies, but he did the best he could with what was available to him. Hugeback spent two years on the USS Hooper and advanced in rank to Petty Officer 3<sup>rd</sup> class.

In April of 1970, Jerry was assigned to the USS Morton, DDG 948, located at Pearl Harbor. This was a destroyer which had been re-commissioned and the guns had been replaced with rocket launchers. In Sept. of '71, they left for WESTPAC, (Western Pacific) and spent seven months at sea. During the seven months they would port in the Philippines for repair and re-supply.

Their next assignment was to Vietnam for fire support, and plane guarding. They went through a nasty storm where the gyro indicated a 45 degree list, or tilt. (Very nearly capsizing!) As they crossed the equator, Hugeback was initiated in the King Neptune court and became a "shellback". This is an initiation for first-time equator crossings! They made stops at New Zealand and Australia before returning to Pearl Harbor.

Hugeback was released from active duty on Oct. 12, 1972 as an E-5, Petty Officer 2<sup>nd</sup> class. He worked briefly as an electrician in Elgin before becoming a maintenance supervisor for Stauffer Chemical in Rochester

Jerry married Dawn Severson May 8, 1971 and they raised two children; Mike and Heather.

#### Steve Jensen Veteran of the Month

Steve Jensen graduated from Hayfield High School in 1974, and attended RCTC for a short while before enlisting in the Navy in December 1975.

He reported to the Naval Training Center at Orlando, Florida for 10 weeks of Boot Camp. (Incidentally Dave Groteluschen of Sargeant was in his training company; #182.) Steve fondly recalls that he was a member of the base choir! He completed Boot Camp in February and had a ten-day leave before reporting to San Diego for 14 weeks of Radioman "A" school.

Following a 2-week leave at home, Steve spent 33 hrs flying to Pearl Harbor, Philippines, then to Seoul Korea, where his brother, Randy, had been stationed 5 years earlier! After 2 week of TDY, Jensen flew to Pusan, Korea where he boarded his ship; the USS Ogden LDP-5 which would be his home for the remainder of his enlistment. She was an amphibious transport dock, with a crew of 450 men, and capacity for 900 Marines. They could land two helicopters at a time on the deck, and could hold nine LST's (Landing Crafts) below deck. As was customary, he spent his first 90 days in the mess hall, although he was primarily assigned to the "Chief's mess hall, which put him in contact with all the "brass"! Steve was a part of the "Radio Shack" which was manned "around the clock" to send and receive messages. He had to climb the mast to maintain the integrity of the antenna regardless of the weather! He delivered most of the messages to the Captain, or the Exec, Officer, so he was well acquainted with each of them. Steve made two "West Pac" tours in '76 and '78.

Jensen became a member of the ship's soccer team. The Vietnam War was over, and they were considered ambassadors for the USA. They practiced on the deck, or below in the "hold", which resulted in lots of scrapes and bruises! They played teams in the Philippines, Korea, Australia, Japan, and Taiwan. While they generally couldn't speak their language, sharing a beer with the teams after the match produced some camaraderie! Their ship's commander told them they were the "champions" of the 7<sup>th</sup> Fleet, though they never saw the commendation!

Jensen recalls being docked at Hong Kong in 1978, as a typhoon was approaching. The MP's swept the area and ordered everyone back to the ship in order to get out of the harbor as 25-foot swells were moving into the area!

Jensen crossed the equator in '76 and was initiated in the King Neptune court and became a "shellback". When he crossed it again in '78 it was a very different event for him as a "Golden" shellback!

Steve was released from active duty Nov. 29, 1979 as an E-5, Radioman 2<sup>nd</sup> class Petty Officer. He spent 40 years in flooring sales in Rochester.
