### A Message from the Legion Commander, <u>Vince Reynolds</u> ..... <u>hayfieldmnlegion.org</u>

Spring is just around the corner and the first event we will have is **Memorial Day**. We are looking to have a member be the point of contact for each of the cemeteries in our area. This person would be responsible for identifying the Veterans who are buried there, placing the US Veteran markers, and putting flags out for Memorial Day and then taking them down. Like many things, this has been done by the same people for so long that we just assume that it will get done. Unfortunately, we had a couple fall through the cracks last year and we cannot let that happen again. If anyone would like to volunteer to be the point of contact for one of these cemeteries, please let me know or sign up at our March meeting.

We will have the **Dodge County Veteran's Service Officer** speak at our March meeting. He will talk about what is available for Veteran's **health care benefits** as well as the **VA Disability Claim Process**. He will speak to both the Post and Auxiliary members at 7 PM. We will begin our regular meetings at the conclusion of his presentation.

I am happy to announce that we have increased the number of Scholarships we are awarding this year. We will be giving **four \$500 Scholarships** to four graduating seniors from Hayfield High School who will be attending a post-secondary education or training program. They must submit an essay about "**How a Veteran has impacted their lives**." Students are encouraged to pick up an application at the high school office.

The **Department of Minnesota** sent out **postcards** in an effort to update their database. I received more than two dozen calls from members, mostly expressing concern about what it was all about. I reached out to the Department of Minnesota and got a response from the Department Adjutant. He confirmed that they are updating their database, but are also working with a book company to collect Veteran's stories and publish a book. Know that when you make that phone call, you will be asked to tell your story, and then be asked to purchase that book. I am not discouraging anyone from making that phone call, but I wanted to communicate to everyone what is actually going on.

However, in order for the funeral director to get your flag, they need a copy of your **DD-214 (Separation Papers)**. Our flags are distributed through the Hayfield Post Office ... **AND** they need a copy of your **DD-214** to account for each flag given out! I have gotten several calls from family members hoping we have a copy of your **DD-214** ... we do not!

So, please make a copy available to your family, or at least tell them where they can find it when needed. Thank you!

Norm Hauschildt graduated from Wanamingo High School in 1965. He worked at Maple Island Dairy until February1966 when he signed up for a 3-year enlistment in the army with a	Bill Fahrennholz graduated from Winona High School in 1963. He helped his dad on the farm, and also did construction work.
guaranteed assignment to Alaska! Norm did his basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, MO and his AIT in armor was at Fort Knox, KY. He was "held over" after completing his AIT and eventually sent to Drill Corporal School to become part of the cadre for basic trainees. His mission was as an assistant to the drill sergeant, which came with a rank of E-3. Eventually Norm was sent to the NCO academy and in the summer of 1967, he was promoted to E-5 (Buck Sergeant) and was issued the coveted "Smoky Bear" hat as a Drill Sergeant. Hauschildt was assigned to Basic Training	<ul> <li>Bill was drafted into the army in February 1968, and did his</li> <li>Basic Training at Fort Leonard Wood, MO. He credits his</li> <li>Sharpshooter badge honors to his hunting experiences back home on the farm!</li> <li>About the first of May, he was sent to the 369<sup>th</sup> Signal</li> <li>Battalion at Fort Gordon, GA for his AIT in communications. They were trained to provide, and maintain communication networks. Midway through this training, Fahrennholz was sent to Fort Sill, OK for training</li> </ul>
Company D, 2nd Battalion,1st Training Brigade to train new recruits at Fort Knox, KY Hauschildt received orders to Vietnam in December 1967, and	on the Pershing Missile systems. By August 1968, he was shipped back to Fort Gordon for additional Signal Corp training. He was promoted to E-4 in late August 1968.
had a 30 day leave at home in Wanamingo. Following overseas processing at Fort Lewis, WA he flew to Cam Ranh Bay, Vietnam which came under fire after they landed. They didn't have any equipment yet, so were instructed to get under bunk mattresses for protection!	He was home on leave, for 16 days, in September and then reported to Oakland Army Base, California for overseas processing. They refueled in Greenland, and landed at Tan Son Nhut, Vietnam in September 1968.
Norm was assigned to the 4 <sup>th</sup> Infantry Division, II Corp as a replacement at Camp Enari near Pleiku, in the Central Highlands of South Vietnam. He was assigned to B Troop 1 <sup>st</sup>	Bill was assigned to the 1 <sup>st</sup> Signal Brigade. He remembers the 115-120 degree heat and extreme humidity. You were constantly wet with sweat!
squadron with the 10 <sup>th</sup> Cavalry as a "tanker"! In June, 1968 his tank commander completed his tour, and Norm moved up to an M-48 tank commander. He was promoted to E-6; however his paper work never caught up with him. He did receive a copy of those orders after his release from active duty in January 1969!	His squad of 5-7 men, plus a native Vietnamese Montagnard, would be sent into the jungle to search for signs of Viet Cong activity, such as campfires, or troop movement, and report to headquarters. Each man carried a backpack, weapons, ammunition, radios, and MREs. When the MREs ran out, you lived off the land as best you could!
Norm enjoyed a 7-day R & R to Sydney, Australia in Oct. '67. The Red Cross notified Norm that his dad had a heart attack, so he boarded a C-141 Transport at Tan Son Nhut Air Base for the states. They landed in Alaska in a snowstorm, and that's how close he came to his "guaranteed Alaska" assignment!	They communicated using wire strung between outposts. However, they also used PRC-77 which was a transistorized system. It utilized a radio signal beamed up into the atmosphere and "bounced" back to Earth bypassing extreme terrain. Bill recalls that when you fired a weapon, you did it on the move, so the Viet Cong couldn't pin point your
After his leave back home, Hauschildt had about 30 days left on his enlistment time. He received orders to a Nike Missile base near Fort Snelling, though he never actually served there. He was separated from active duty in January 1969 as an E-5.	<ul><li>position. He was 4-5 years older than most of the troops, so the others relied on his judgment when under stress!</li><li>Fahrennholz was released from duty in February 1970, at Oakland Army Base, California as an E-5.</li><li>Bill married Ruby Staton on Oct. 28, 2003, and they raised two children Katrina and Pernell. She died of a brain tumor</li></ul>
Norm married Jeanette Post from Zumbrota in September 1969 and they raised two daughters; Sara and Martha.	
He had several jobs after the service, including Heavy Equipment operator with Ulland Brothers and later as an instructor for the Operating Engineers at the Rosemont training site.	April 8, 2011.


