Dallas Ausrud Nov. '22 Veteran of the Month

Dallas Ausrud graduated from Hayfield High School in 1964. He attended Austin Vocational School in the Machining Program while working as a milk truck driver and later as a lab assistant at the Hormel Institute. Ausrud was hired by IBM in March of 1966.

His draft number was getting close, and he wanted to serve in the Air Force. He enlisted in the Air Force on February 20, 1967. Dallas remembers riding the bus from Rochester to Minneapolis and staying at the Andrews Hotel. After processing, they rode a bus to Lackland AFB near San Antonio. He recalls they arrived about 3:00 am and were back up at 5:00 am for PT and processing! The first week was mostly "Detail" and KP duty while the company waited for the full complement of troops to arrive to begin Basic Training. He was promoted to Airman 3rd Class upon graduating from basic.

Ausrud was assigned to Radio Equipment Tech School at Keesler AFB at Biloxi, Mississippi. Dallas and Carol (Rocek of Hayfield) had been married in Sept 1966, and she was able to join him at Keesler. They lived near the post and Carol worked for an attorney. Dallas was promoted to Airman 2^{nt} Class upon completion of this training.

After completing his schooling, Ausrud was assigned to the 5th Mobile Communications Group at Warner Robbins AFB south of Macon Georgia. They were expected to be ready for deployment anywhere in the world in 24 hours. They experienced numerous "alerts", but were never deployed. Dallas was promoted to Airman `1st Class at the completion of this training. They have fond memories of a leave he had before shipping out to Korea. They traveled to Florida to take in the sights of Cypress Gardens and Cape Canaveral.

The next assignment for Ausrud was at Eglin AFB (East of Mobile, AL) for Combat Survival training in preparation for deployment. At this point, Carol moved home with her parents. Dallas got orders for Korea in June 1969. He flew to McChord AFB, Washington for more processing before flying to Japan, and eventually to South Korea. He arrived at Tageau AFB, (SE Korea) and worked with a small Communications Group (a total of seven troops) and later was moved to Osan AFB (not far from the DMZ). Dallas recalls the extreme heat and humidity that summer.

Ausrud was released from active duty on October 13, 1969 at McChord AFB as an E-4 (Senior Airman), flew back to Minnesota and returned to work at IBM at Rochester in January 1970.

Dallas and Carol raised three children: Craig, Chris and Becky.

Chet Boyd December '22 Veteran of the Month

Chet Boyd was a member of the class of 1975 at Blooming Prairie High School, though he signed up for a two-year enlistment with the army in November of 1973!

Boyd did his basic training in the rain, drizzle, snow and ice at Fort Leonard Wood, MO. He had a two-week leave to spend Christmas at home with his family, and then finished his basic training in early March.

Chet's AIT was at Fort Sill, OK on the "Honest John" missiles, plus the next class of missiles, called the "Lance" missile system. They were both nuclear-capable surface-to-surface rockets. The training was intense as they assembled, loaded and launched these track-mounted missiles. He made E-2 upon graduation.

Following a 30 day leave, Chet went to Fort Dix, NJ for processing, and then boarded a plane for Germany. He was assigned to the First Infantry Division at Hurtzelganera, a small military base 20 miles S.E. of Nuremberg. At the time, they were phasing out of the "Honest John" missile system and replacing them with the "Lance" system. Boyd was responsible for training the team in the new rocket system. He made Spec. 3 shortly after he completed the change-over.

Chet was sent to White Sands, NM for a week of training where their crew actually fired the "dummy" warheads. His team came within 20 feet of the intended target! Upon return he was put in charge of 18 men and given Sergeant Stripes...but not Sergeant pay!

In 1974, Boyd's older brother Calvin, was stationed at Nuremberg for a short time, but unfortunately their schedules never matched up for a personal get-together!

In late '74, the entire 1st Division was put "on alert", to get ready for shipment to Vietnam as they were still using old "Honest John" missiles there. Chet was thankful that order was eventually canceled!

Early 1975, they were sent to Crete for more training. A time of high stress for Boyd's nuclear rocket team occurred the day they were given the order to stop "assembly" and cover the weapon. It turned out a Soviet sub had surfaced just off-shore! He also remembers making numerous scary trips to Spain in Huey and/or Chinook helicopters to bring back nuclear warheads for their rockets!

In November '75, Boyd flew to Fort Dix, NJ to be mustered out as an E-4. He joined the National Guard at Austin and completed his 8-year commitment with that Transportation company. He worked several jobs, spending 20 years with Jerome Foods at Dodge Center.

Chet married Michonne Nelson in August of 1979 and they raised three children: Jesse, Derek, and Emily
