#### **Doug Miner January Veteran of the Month**

Doug Miner graduated from Blooming Prairie High School with the class of 1988, and 2 days later he reported to Fort Dix, NJ for his Basic Training. Miner had opted for "delayed entry" as a 16 year old junior in high school! At Basic Training he was named "Soldier of the Cycle", and was promoted to E-2.

Doug was selected for AIT (Advanced Individual Training) as a Nuclear Weapons Specialist at Redstone Arsenal near Huntsville, AL. This training required Top Secret clearance, with a very extensive background check. Miner made E-3 upon completion of this part of his training. He remembers thinking his MOS was stressful, but not as much as the EOD (Explosive Ordinance Disposal) guys who were training near them and dismantling live explosives!

After AIT, Miner was transferred to Fort Sheridan, IL and assigned to the Nuclear Weapons Support Branch. Here, Doug's primary job was maintaining and instructing the Field Artillery Units in the Midwest. They traveled throughout much of the Midwest by van with their training materials and Doug was one of the "lead" instructors. In 1990, Miner attended Primary Leadership Development Course at Fort Campbell, KY where he received his E-4. During his time at Fort Sheridan, he was awarded "Soldier of the Year by the 4th Army"!

Miner completed his three-year enlistment in June 1991 with the rank of E-4. At that time, he came home to rural Blooming Prairie to work on the farm and in the snowmobile repair shop with his dad. He also worked full-time with Blooming Prairie Well Company. Upon returning home, Miner joined the Austin National Guard, and became a 63T (Bradley Fighting Vehicle Mechanic).In early 2000, he attended BNOC (Basic Non-Commissioned Officer Course) at Fort McCoy, WI where he was promoted to E-5.

In 2005 Miner successfully graduated from Warrant Officer Candidate School at Fort Rucker, AL. And, in 2006 was promoted to Chief Warrant Officer-2. A Chief Warrant Officer combines both technical expertise and leadership responsibilities. In early 2007, Miner spent a month on active duty in New Mexico for Border Patrol. Later that year he was deployed to Camp Bondsteel in Kosovo, where he was the Battalion Maintenance Officer. He was granted a brief leave back home during his one-year deployment. Doug recalls how difficult it was to return to active duty in Kosovo, leaving his wife and 1 ½ year old daughter!

Miner retired from the military with twenty-one years of service: Three years active, seventeen years National Guard, plus one year deployed.

Doug married Kristi Van Deest on November 11, 2000. Together they run their business, Miner's Outdoor which they opened in 2001. They reside on their family farm where they are raising their four children: Elizabeth (19), Derek (15), Alexa (12), and Maverick (10).

#### Don Konken February Veteran of the Month

Don Konken graduated from Hayfield Schools in 1966, and worked at the Austin Veterinary Clinic. Konken was drafted into the US Army on January 25, 1968. He did his Basic Training at Fort Campbell, Kentucky. Don remembers it snowing in mid-April and the non-Minnesota boys complaining loudly as they tried to make their way around the base!

Konken's AIT was in Military Intelligence at Fort Meade, Maryland. They were housed in WWII barracks. The base was being de-activated so the facilities were in disrepair and declining by the day!

Don left for Vietnam on July 1<sup>st</sup> and made stops in Alaska and Japan before landing at Ben Long. He was assigned to Company A, 519 Military Intelligence Battalion. They lived in hooches, and in the cold weather, the kept the wood-burning heaters well supplied with anything that would burn!

Konken made E-3 after about four months in Vietnam. He was part of CDECK (Combined Document Exploration Center) in support of field units. He observed many young North Vietnamese boys, maybe 10-12 years old, carrying two RPG's which weighed about 20 pounds each, coming from the North and headed for action in South Vietnam.

Don spent a lot of time in enemy territory north of the Ben Hai River, DMZ( Demilitarized Zone), looking for enemy gatherings or movement. He was often accompanied by Vietnamese guides. Konken never wore a military patch which would indicate his work with Intelligence. Being in enemy territory, he was often sprayed with Agent Orange. This has caused several very serious medical conditions for Don.

Konken remembers coming back to camp from an assignment of gathering information. He was met by General Creighton Abrams, commander of military operations for the Vietnam war! Colonel Abrams wanted to know all that Konken had seen and heard! Another memory for Don was listening to the radio program called "Good Morning Vietnam" hosted by Air Force DJ, Adrian Cronauer

Don and Leah married in 1973, Leah died in June 2025 after 52 years of marriage! Over the years they hosted five "Foreign Exchange" students in their Brownsdale home.

Konken was released from service in September 1970 with the rank of E-3. He remembers being spit upon when he arrived back at the airport in Oakland, CA!
