

# A Message from the Legion Commander, Vince Reynolds - Hayfieldmnlegion.org

In 1919, The American Legion was founded on four pillars: Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism, and Children & Youth. Each of these pillars encompasses a variety of programs that benefit our nation's veterans, its service members, their families, the youth of America and ordinary citizens. Sometimes it's good to reflect on the foundation and reason why the American Legion was established. Since 1922, Rothie Post has supported all four pillars and I feel that we continue to hit the mark on all of them today.

With summer right around the corner, we start getting into our busy time of the year. This summer will be busy with Memorial Day commemoration, field of flags, a flag retirement ceremony, parades, and local celebrations. With all of those events, we continue to look for ways to improve the post, the club, and support the four pillars within our community. If you have an idea of how we can further the American Legion's mission (and are willing to spearhead the effort) please bring it up at the next meeting.

Looking ahead to August, this year we are honored to host the 2025 State of Minnesota Junior Division II American Legion Baseball tournament. The tournament will bring in teams from all over the state. We have not yet identified what our role will be, but it's a great opportunity to showcase our local athletic facilities and we expect to have increased traffic in the club.

#### Rodney Peterson - May Veteran of the Month

Rod Peterson graduated from Albert Lea High School in 1976 and attended the University of MN Waseca.

Peterson joined the 135<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment of the Army National Guard at Albert Lea in June 1977. He did his Basic Training at Fort Leonard Wood, MO. and his AIT in Infantry at Fort Benning, GA. He's proud of his 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish with Automatic Weapons in the post-wide competition.

In April 1980, Rod successfully completed the year-long OCS, (Officers Candidate School) at MN State Officers School located at Arden Hills, MN. He was commissioned as an Infantry Second Lieutenant and assigned to the 135<sup>th</sup> Infantry Battalion.

Rod was promoted to First Lieutenant in April 1983, and shortly thereafter attended the Officer Infantry Basic long course. He held numerous positions in the 135<sup>th</sup> Battalion at Rochester, from rifle platoon leader to Battalion XO. He took part in many training opportunities, culminating in attending the Army War College, and attaining a Masters degree in Strategic Studies. Peterson was promoted to Captain in Sept. 1985 and Major in December 1990. Rod assumed command of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> Brigade, 34<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division at Mankato with the rank of Lt. Colonel in 1998. As an Infantryman, Rod is very proud of being awarded the Expert Infantryman badge.

In 2002, Peterson retired from the Army National Guard, after 25 years, and then spent another 8 years with the Army reserves where he was promoted to full Colonel. Rod served thirty plus years. His service gave him opportunities to deploy to numerous military bases, plus service in ten countries including Germany, Norway, Japan, Korea, Kuwait, Afghanistan, Iraq, and Qatar.

In 2003, Rod was sent to Iraq supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom as Deputy Corp Distribution Chief. He was charged to oversee the distribution of most of the materials, supplies, fuel, ammunition, parts, and equipment for the theater. He earned numerous awards, medals, and honors while serving, including the Bronze Star medal for meritorious service in a combat zone.

He graduated from the Wm. Mitchell College of Law and worked in numerous positions, including his own private Law practice while still serving in the National Guard.

Rod and Teresa were married April 13, 1985, and they have three children: Robyrta, Bailey, and Zachary.

#### Tom O'Connor - June Veteran of the Month

Tom O'Connor graduated from Hayfield in 1976 and worked at number of jobs before enlisting in the Army for three years in 1981. Tom came from a military family with three brothers also serving! He did his basic training at Fort Leonard Wood in the heat and humidity of June, July, and August!

Tom was sent to Fort Lee for training as a Cook and graduated second in his class! He was transferred to Fort Jackson where they prepared three meals a day to 1,500 Basic Training troops of the 12<sup>th</sup> Battalion.

O'Connor's next assignment was cooking for the 61<sup>st</sup> MP unit at Fliegerhorst Kaserne, a WWII German underground Air Base. Tom qualified for "security clearance" here. They did considerable training at Hohenfels, a huge facility used for training NATO troops. They fed their men "T" Rations under temporary tents.

He was given an "early out" in May 1984, and went to work for Hormel in Austin. While on "Strike" in August 1985, a recruiter signed Tom up for the Army Reserve with "Charlie Med" at Rochester, which was composed mainly of medical personnel. Much of their work was supporting Regular Army troops from Alaska. From 1985-1990 they did their summer training at Camp Ripley and Fort McCoy.

O'Connor was a Dining Facility manager and was promoted to E-6 (Staff Sgt). However, there were no "spots" for E-6, so he took a reduction to E-5 and was assigned to Fort Snelling with the 114 MASH Unit.

From 1994-1999, Tom was with the 1133<sup>rd</sup> Iowa National Guard at Mason City training to support the 81<sup>st</sup> and 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division. He then moved to training for driving, 18-wheel six-speed automatic tractors and trailers to and from California.

O'Connor's next assignment was at Fort Letterkenny, PA. He was able to tour Washington DC and Gettysburg while stationed there. He recalls the emotion of standing on top of Round Top Rock and looking down on the Civil War battlefield!

In October 2000 he transferred to the 417<sup>th</sup> Maintenance Company at Faribault. While on Active Duty in February 2003 his unit was called to support Fort McCoy, WI. In 2003, O'Connor was extended six months while in charge of the firing ranges until 2004.

Tom retired in March 05, as an E-6, with a total of 24 years in the service. Tom raised one son Jordan.
