

Aaron Boysen - July Veteran of the Month

In 1997, Aaron Boysen graduated from Hayfield Schools and signed up for a five-year enlistment in the Navy. He hoped to enter Aircrew training, a month after high school graduation, Aaron reported for his physical and induction at Great Lakes Naval Training Center Boot Camp. At 18 years old, Aaron had little difficulty with the physical demands of Boot Camp thanks to 10 years of work on the farm.

Boysen's assignment after Boot Camp led him to Pensacola, FL for Naval Aircrew Candidate School. There, he trained extensively on aircraft safety, water rescue, water survival, hazmat, aircraft emergency situations, and swimming. While still in Pensacola, Aaron received a new assignment to AW (Aviation Warfare Systems Operator) "A" school for more advanced training. He then transferred to Brunswick, ME for SERE (Search Evasion Resistance Escape) school. This involved intensive physical and mental training in remote areas under harsh conditions.

Aaron continued his training in Jacksonville, FL at Patrol Squadron 30 (VP-30). VP-30 is a training squadron intended to instruct Naval Aircrew, maintenance technicians, and flight officers on the P3 Orion Aircraft before reporting to the fleet squadrons. Their primary mission was to classify, track, and attack enemy submarines. Other missions involved reconnaissance and surveillance to be the "eyes in the sky" for battlegroups, shore installations, and ground units. Aaron graduated from VP-30 in February 1999 after nearly 2 years of intensive training to become a Naval Aircrewmen.

After earning his wings, Aaron met his squadron, Patrol Squadron 40 (VP-40) on deployment in Misawa, Japan. There he was part of an eleven-man crew which flew 2 to 4 times per week. His second deployment came in June of 2000 with deployments to Masirah, Qatar, Bahrain, and Diego Garcia. There the squadron participated in missions in the Persian Gulf and the Indian Ocean. Additionally, his air crew was part of the initial response to the USS Cole attack. His third deployment brought him back to Japan and Okinawa as well as participating in Operation Enduring Freedom in the Philippines.

Boysen was discharged from active duty in July of 2002 with the rank of E5, Second Class Petty Officer. He used his GI Bill to attend St. Cloud State University and earned an undergraduate degree in Criminal Justice and went on to earn a graduate degree in Police Leadership at the University of St. Thomas. In 2015, he applied to the Minneapolis Fire Department and has served as a firefighter and Fire Motor Operator since 2015.

Aaron married Megen in February 2019 and is stepfather to Max and Chase. He and Megen welcomed two more daughters, Nora and Iris, to the family over the last few years.

Ron Martin - August Veteran of the Month

Ron Martin graduated from Hayfield High School in 1971 and worked numerous jobs in the area. Ron's draft number was number four, so he knew he'd be called soon. Ron, and his twin brother Don, decided to enlist in the Air Force on the "buddy system".

The Martin boys reported to Lackland Air Force Base (near San Antonio) on December 20, 1972. Because of the holidays, they just kind of "existed" until early January when their processing and training began in earnest. They completed their basic training in early March and had a brief leave back home near Sargeant.

Ron reported to Shepherd Air Force Base, near Wichita Falls, Texas for five months of training in heating, refrigeration, and air conditioning. This program prepared him to install, repair, and maintain HVAC/R systems within Air Force facilities. The training included topics like heat transfer, vapor-compression cycles, and the functioning of major system components, ensuring the graduates were equipped with the necessary skills for a successful HVAC/R. He earned his Airman stripe upon completion of his schooling.

Nearing completion of his schooling, Martin put in his request for assignment somewhere warm such as Florida or California. But instead Ron was assigned to the 321st Civil Engineering Squadron at Grand Forks Air Force Base, in Northeast North Dakota for the next 3 ½ years! The base was part of the strategic air defense system with many Minuteman III missiles. The Air Defense was intended to provide early warning, and response, for a Soviet nuclear attack. These Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles were stored in underground silos. They could carry up to three warheads and travel nearly 8,000 miles. Ron's responsibility was to maintain the HVAC equipment in the Air Base facilities which included all office buildings, hangars, refueling alert facilities, cold storage and base housing refrigerators. He was also assigned to maintain refrigeration and compressed air systems at the 15 Launch Control facilities throughout eastern North Dakota.

Martin made Senior Airman (E-4) in June of 1974. He went home in June 1974 to marry Lana Peterson (Dexter). They lived in a mobile home 45 feet from the runway used by the KC 135 Stratotankers!

Martin would volunteer for the night shift of 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. and would work 3 days on and 2 off, then 2 on and 3 off. He became friends with a civil-servant on base who was also a farmer. In Ron's time-off, he worked on a number of planting and harvest seasons for the farmer.

Ron was released from active duty in December 1976 as a Senior Airman. He was employed by IBM, Lab-Tech, and MN DOT

Lana and Ron raised two children: a daughter; Jennifer and a son; Jeff.
