new to the game this year and with so many participants just lost their names.



Winter fishermen still must be ELDA members or invited guests of Elk Lake members. When ice fishing, please carry your ELDA membership card or obtain an ELDA Access Permit from Gene Pryor who resides on Clubhouse Road. He can also be reached by phone by calling 570-466-5984.

The same fishing limits apply and catch-andrelease is encouraged:

- Walleye 20 inches minimum; max 2 per day.
- Bass 15 inches minimum; maximum 2 per day.
   Observe seasons in accordance with a valid, yearly Pennsylvania fishing license:
- Walleye Through Dec 31<sup>st</sup> with a 2019 fishing license; Jan 1<sup>st</sup> - mid-March with a 2020 license. (Please check FishInPa.com for specific date) Walleye season re-opens on early May 2020.
- Bass Through Dec 31<sup>st</sup> with a 2019 license; Jan 1<sup>st</sup>

   Apr 13<sup>th</sup> with a 2020 license
   Bass season re-opens on mid-June 2020.

(Please check FishInPa.com for specific date)
ALSO, remember for your safety, PFDs must be
worn on open waters on any canoe or kayak and
boats less than 16 feet from Nov 1st to April 30th.

### Hydrilla or No? NO!

On August 15<sup>th</sup>, the Wayne Conservation District came to Elk Lake and took samples of a weed from two locations on Sensentine shore. It was confirmed that the weed was <u>not hydrilla</u>, which is good news. We still need problem and Harvey's Lake is also fighting this invasive weed. If you use any watercraft on another body of water and then plan on bringing it to Elk Lake, <u>it is imperative</u> that you clean your craft thoroughly and let it dry completely before putting it back in Elk Lake. This includes all powerbooks.

This includes all powerboats, fishing boats, wave runners, kayaks, canoes, etc. In the Spring newsletter we had suggested that if anyone saw a weed that might be hydrilla they should pull it pull any weed out because that just might increase the spread of the weed. We would rather have a professional

For your information, the weed that the conservation district found is "Elodea", a plant that provides excellent cover for aquatic insects and fish and serves as food for various pond wildlife. Modest amounts of elodea are generally considered beneficial to the lake's ecosystem, but dense growth will interfere with fishing & boating and

Of course, overgrowth is a direct result of excessive nutrients, and is <u>prevented</u> by....

Maintaining Septic Systems!! Please! Also helpful: maintaining thick vegetative buffers at the lake's edge to stop runoff from entering the lake. Our fish thank you!
