Mother Nature is truly remarkable! For example, just consider the relationship and co-existence of the American Eel and freshwater mussels in Elk Lake.

Freshwater mussels, believe it or not, can survive up to 70 years in good habitat. But how were they introduced to Elk Lake? Where did they come from?

Marine scientists give credit to the American Eel. Mature eels from the USA and Europe return to the Sargasso Sea in the Atlantic Ocean to mate and have their offspring. When the young eels are about 4 inches long and have developed fins, they are called elvers and begin their migration to their native waters.

On their journey from the Atlantic to the Delaware River, Lackawaxen River, Van Auken Creek, and into the stream flowing out of Elk Lake, the young eels nibble on the flesh of mussels' open mouths and get sprayed with babyforming mussels, known as glochidia. The mussel larvae attach to the gills of the eels and detach, when developed, in adaptable and suitable habitats, like Elk Lake.

Mussels help keep our lake clean by filtering algae, bacteria, and other tiny substances. Fish, muskrats, otters, raccoons, and herons' prey and consume mussels.

Thanks, in part, to our mussel inhabitants, Elk Lake is regarded by many to be clean and pristine. But swimmers BEWARE! Mussels can be razor-sharp so please wear water shoes while swimming in our lake.




