


#### AUSTRALIAN WAR MEMORIAL

The iconic stadium has hosted cricket games since 1853, played host to the Olympic Games in 1956, Commonwealth Games in 2006

#### MUSEUM OF OLD AND NEW ART

Museum of Old and New Art (Mona) is Australia's largest privately-owned gallery and museum. Showcasing the diverse collection of its owner, Tasmanian gambler and maths nerd David Walsh, Mona exhibits everything from ancient Egyptian funerary objects and modernist masterpieces to a word waterfall and a machine that mimics the human digestive system The Mona site is also home to the Moorilla Winery, the Source restaurant, a bunch of other bars and restaurants, luxury accommodation pavilions, and Tasmania's biggest craft brewery (Moo Brew)

#### **PORT ARTHUR HISTORIC SITE**

The UNESCO World Heritage-listed Port Arthur Historic Site brings Australia's early convict history to life. Port Arthur is the best-preserved convict settlement in Australia and among the most significant convict era sites in the world. It is the place to discover Australian history and explore the origins of contemporary Australian culture, combines history and scenic beauty with innovative interpretation to tell the stories of the harsh discipline and determined industry of the settlement

#### FREMANTLE PRISON

Fremantle Prison is the only World Heritage listed building in Western Australia, built by convicts in the 1850s and decommissioned as an operating maximum security gaol in 1991, it is the largest convict-built structure in Australia and the most intact convict establishment in the southern hemisphere

#### **WA MARITIME MUSEUM**

WA Maritime Museum is symbolic of Fremantle's past, present and future as a coastal city and port and display the vast riches of WA's maritime history by significant objects and vessels that highlight both sporting and adventure heritage, includes the winning America's Cup yacht, Australia II, Jon Sanders' Parry Endeavour and the hugely popular Oberon-class submarine HMAS Ovens

#### NATIONAL ANZAC CENTRE

#### ADELAIDE OVAL

Established in 1871, Adelaide Oval has long been one of Australia's most recognizable and prestigious venues. Its plays host to cricket, Australian Rules Football, concerts, and major events. Visitors can experience the award-winning Roof Climb adventure taking in the city skyline from the rooftop, discover the history behind the icon on the Oval tour or explore the famed Bradman Collection, home of Sir Donald Bradman's private and personal collection

### ADELAIDE, SA

#### **QANTAS FOUNDERS MUSEUM**

Qantas Founders Museum is dedicated to telling the story of Australia's national airline Qantas, which began in outback Queensland in 1920. Enjoy the interpretive displays, interactive exhibits, replica aircraft, the 1922 National Heritage Listed Qantas Hangar and an impressive collection of genuine artefacts, including some significant aeroplanes. Experience the Platinum Tour to view the new Super Constellation display, go behind the scenes and experience a Wing Walk on the Boeing 747 and 707

## LONGREACH, QLD

This outback Queensland town, 1200 km west of Brisbane, holds a special place in Australia's heart as the birthplace of the national airline Qantas, and home to four museums and cultural attractions dedicated to Aboriginal and Outback history and stories
