Merry Christmas, which seems to be coming sooner each year. Wish all a wonderful holiday season. Try not too eat to much keeping in mind there are those less fortunate who cannot afford a meal. We send our prayers and donations.

There was a time not too long ago that many of our South City folks had hard times like the 1930's. But looking at our history we begin with the Native Americans who lived here the first 5000 years plus with their living habits that incorporated native science. They joined with the Spanish/Mexicans that brought us Rancheros and cows (methane gas). Charles Lux, a wealthy San Franciscan, was the first businessman to purchase land on the peninsula where he teamed up with Henry Miller to form a cattle industry business. Lux was able to control the cattle pricing throughout the U.S. with a ticker tape machine in his home. Swift followed and the first planned city west of the Mississippi was developed.

As time goes this is just the beginning which is why it is important to remember our history and where we came from. We welcome you to visit our museum and Plymire-Schwarz house open Saturdays 1-4pm.




Society News





Vintage South San Francisco Barbershop Postcard


I often search online auction sites for vintage South San Francisco memorabilia and photos. In doing so I usually come across the same ol' photos – sweet and historic familiar scenes of Grand Avenue, City Hall, Western Meat Company, the High School when it was on Spruce Avenue ...

One day I happened upon a photo postcard of the interior of a beautifully-appointment barbershop identified as being in South San Francisco. At first glance I was skeptical – how could the seller know this was South San Francisco? As I read the description, I became convinced:

"There are several signs visible in the background including a calendar for "United States Faucet, Co" dated 1910. Other signs include ... "Majestic Bar and Pool Hall, R. Luttrell, Prop", and one for "French Laundry, South City, J. Beigbeder, J. Laborde, Props."

Yep – those all checked out as old South San Francisco businesses! I contacted the seller and asked if I might be able to get a scan of the card should I be outbid. Assured that he would accommodate my request, the following day I was told the postcard was being removed from auction and due to a glitch in the auction site I was no longer able to communicate with the seller. I was beyond disappointed that this unique postcard was not going to be added to our collection.

Two weeks later I got the surprise of my life – the seller sent me the original photo as a donation to the museum!
