# No Tricks, Just Treats - Halloween 2021



# **Notes from the Museum**

Our museum opened its doors again in June with new hours of 1 to 4 pm on Saturdays. The first 5 months have gone well thanks to the excellent work of our dedicated docents. The museum committee continues to make small improvements to make the museum user and volunteer friendly. The office area has been re-organized and updated. We are working on a new database program for inventorying our new donations and eventually, the existing archives.

The museum committee has also been working with the South San Francisco Library to secure a community grant from Genentech. This grant has the following goals:

- 1. To increase visibility of collections held at SSFPL History Room and Historical Society of SSF.
- 2. To process collections currently held at SSFPL that are not accessible to the public of staff.
- 3. To encourage more community engagement with the historical collections in our city.
- 4. To enhance the community's understanding of how the city's diversity shapes and contributes to the city's history through the ongoing collection and preservation of materials that reflect South San Francisco's diverse communities.

Shortly after the war Fred Benetti, John Benetti and Gart Tuccori opened the Southwood Food Center on El Camino Real. The trio built during a time when building costs were at a peak. Business observers predicted that such a location along with high building costs would keep the store just another neighborhood market.

Today, nearly three years later, the trio has completely outgrown the El Camino location and are now opening their second store. The brentwood Super Market is among the largest grocery stores in San Mateo county.

Months of careful study and planning with architects was necessary before the plans could be prepared for the super market. The market is conveniently located at the entrance to Brentwood just off El Camino

Hard work and a constant desire to give service to customers has enable the trio to constantly increase their business sufficiently to encourage them to open the city's largest market.
