May 25, 1992, approx 9am.
Our son's girlfriend's daughter
joyfully proudly brought
us a little Blue Spruce. The
8yr. old yanked it from the
ground and left the roots
bare. We were camped at
3 forks in the White Mtn of
Arizona. Gayle wrapped the
roots in wet paper towels
hoping to save it. Arriving
home at 3pm. we placed
the little spruce in a
2gal bucket of Vita Planta
+ water. 2 hrs later we
transplanted the spruce to
a large clay pot. The tree
never went into shock and
has new growth on all limbs.

June
May 16th 8:00 P.M.
Applied Vita Planta
to our garden

June 17th 8:00 AM.
A heavy frost and
unexpected post of approx.
26° F had hit our garden.
We had tomatoes, corn,
Bush beans, snow peas,
radishes, and potatoes up.
We lost the tomatoes,
all snow peas made it,
all radishes, though all bush
beans made it. The tops
of the potatoes were burned
as was the corn. We
are hopeful Vita Planta
will help revitalize the
corn and potatoes. We
planted new Early Girl
tomatoes and will watch.

June 21

Corn is 2" high
We used Vita Planta
on all of the garden

June 24

Applied Vita Planta
to garden
corn is now 4"

June 28

Applied Vita Planta
Corn is 6"
Peas are doing well
Built string fence for
peas to climb

July 6 Applied Vita Planta

July 13 + 17 applied
Vita Planta. I must
mention that this garden
was tilled in May and
consists of cinder & dirt,
clay and rotted bark,
no fertilizer or mulch
was added.

July 24 Corn approx 24"
Tallest 32" Measured
tall. New peas are
coming faster than we
can pick them.

Only 3 pepper have
been lost.

Short story

On May 31st Gayle planted our young 7 ft tall aspen tree in our front yard. It promptly started losing all its leaves. In two weeks time we thought it was dead only a few leaves remained. My wife started making 2 gal buckets of Vita Planter and putting that amount on the tree everyrite starting on June 18th. By June 24th all limbs are covered with leaves starting to unfold and ~~no~~ no limbs ^{have} died.
