

# C. Luzon expressway extension to open in first half of 2023

MANILA – The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) is looking to operate a portion of the expressway in Central Luzon at the connection of the Subic-Clark-Tarlac Expressway (SCTEX)/Tarlac-Pangasinan-La Union Expressway (TPLEX) in Tarlac City, Tarlac up to San Juan, Aliaga, Nueva Ecija toward the first half of 2023.

In his report to Secretary Manuel Bonoan, Senior Undersecretary Emil Sadain said the DPWH Unified Project Management Office - Roads Management Cluster 1 (DPWH UPMO RMC 1) is working to complete an additional 7-kilometer segment from Guimba-Aliaga Road intersection to San Juan Interchange that will extend to 25 kilometers the already accessible 18-kilometer section of the Central Luzon Link Expressway (CLLEX).

“The DPWH UPMO RMC 1 team with the contractors and consultants have worked hard to overcome challenges along the way, such as bad weather, right of way issues, difficulty in the transport of construction materials and Covid-19 impact that caused some delays,” he said.

Other than the four-lane, two-way expressway with a design speed of 100 kilometers per hour, the DPWH is also undertaking the construction of three interchanges – Zaragoza, Aliaga, and San Juan that will allow motorists from the secondary and provincial roads to access CLLEX.

Once completed, the 30-kilometer CLLEX Project will facilitate fast, safe, comfortable and reliable travel.

# Marcos declares Dec. 26 as special non-working day

MANILA – President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. has declared Dec. 26 this year a special non-working day throughout the country to “give the people the full opportunity to celebrate the holiday with their families and loved ones.”

Marcos made the declaration through Proclamation No. 115, according to a news release from Malacañang.

“A longer weekend will encourage families to get together and strengthen their relationship towards a more productive environment, and will promote tourism,” the proclamation read.

He also ordered the Department of Labor and Employment to issue the appropriate circular to

implement the proclamation for the private sector.

Christmas Day, which falls on a Sunday, is observed as a regular holiday.

Malacañang earlier updated the list of regular



holidays and special non-working days for 2023, allowing “long weekends.”

Proclamation 90, released Nov. 11, amended Proclamation 42, declaring

## First Aid Sa Na-High Blood

*Health tip mula kay Doc Willie Ong*

Kapag ang blood pressure niyo ay lampas sa 140 over 90, marahil ay may high blood ka na. Ngunit kapag ika'y pagod, nagagalit o nag-e-ehersisyo, tataas din ang iyong presyon pero hindi ibig sabihin ay high blood ka na. Ang tamang pagkuha ng blood pressure ay kung ika'y nakapahinga at walang ginagawa.

Ano ang sintomas ng high blood? Kadalasan ay walang nararamdaman ang isang taong may high blood. Kaya nga tinatawag na "silent killer" ang high blood pressure dahil nanganganib na pala ang buhay ng pasyente pero wala pa siyang nararamdaman. Pero may ilang tao ang nakararanas ng sintomas tulad ng pananakit ng batok, mabigat ang ulo at pagkahilo.

Heto ang first aid para sa mga na-high blood:

1. Siguraduhing tama ang pagkuha ng blood pressure. Kapag palagi itong mataas sa 140 over 90, ito ay nangangahulugang may high blood ka na.
  2. Paupuin muna ang pasyente ng 15 minuto. Sabihin sa kanya na huminga ng mabagal at malalim. Pagkatapos ay kuhanan muli ng blood pressure.
  3. Kung may maintenance medicines ang pasyente para sa high blood pressure, ipainom ito sa kanya.
  4. May 2 pagkakataon kung kailan puwedeng bigyan ng karagdagang gamot ang pasyente: (1) Kapag ang blood pressure ay lampas sa 140/90 at may nararamdaman ang pasyente, at (2) kapag ang blood pressure ay lampas na sa 160/100.
  5. Ang pangkaraniwang first aid medicine na ibinibigay para bumaba ang presyon ay ang (1) Clonidine (Brand name: Catapres) 75 mcg, isang tableta lamang o (2) Captopril 25 mg, isang tableta din.
  6. Tandaan na hindi lahat ng mataas ang presyon ay kailangan bigyan agad ng gamot sa high blood. Minsan ay kailangan lang ma-relax ang pasyente.
  7. Depende sa kondisyon ng pasyente, puwede mo siya dalhin sa Emergency Room ng ospital o ipakonsulta sa klinik ng doktor.
- Maraming komplikasyon ang high blood pressure katulad ng stroke (pagdugo sa utak), pagkabalug, sakit sa bato at atake sa puso. Magpatingin sa doktor kapag ang presyon niyo ay lampas 140 over 90 para mabigyan kayo ng lunas. God bless po.

Marcos led a gift-giving activity at the Rizal Park in Manila and promised that his administration will continue providing much-needed aid for the poor, vulnerable and underprivileged.

Marcos, in several speeches, said the government will strive to ensure that every Filipino child will have a Christmas.

He also invited the public to visit the

Malacañang Palace Grounds to view the Malacañang Christmas Tree and lanterns and attend the Simbang Gabi.

The Palace grounds will be open to the public from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. on Dec. 18 to 24.

Simbang Gabi, which traditionally starts on Dec. 16 and ends on Christmas Day, will be at 4:30 a.m. in front of the Mabini Hall. (PNA)

**Boost sexuality education to further reduce teenage pregnancies**

MANILA — Senator Sherwin Gatchalian on Thursday highlighted the need to strengthen sexuality education in the K-12 curriculum to sustain the gains of the Responsible Parenthood and Reproductive Health Act of 2012, including the drop in teenage pregnancies.

“Bagama’t may nakikita tayong pagbaba sa bilang ng mga maagang pagbubuntis, kailangang masuri pa rin natin kung paano natin tinuturuan ang ating mga kabataang kababaihan na iwasang malagay sa sitwasyon ng pagiging mga batang ina (While we notice a decrease in teenage pregnancies, we must still assess how we teach our female youth to avoid being put in the dire situation of a teenage mother),” Gatchalian said in a statement.

Gatchalian made the statement after Department of Health (DOH) officer-in-charge Maria Rosario Vergeire reported that the adolescent birth rate in the country is now at 25 per 1,000 women, which is lower than the 2022 target of 37 per 1,000 women.

Vergeire bared this in a forum organized by the Philippine Legislators’ Committee on Population and Development (PLCPD), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and the Commission on Population and Development (POPCOM).

But despite the drop, Gatchalian said the numbers of teenage pregnancy “remain high.”

“Mahalagang mapigilan natin ang paglobo ng mga bilang ng maagang pagbubuntis sa mga kabataan, lalo na’t ang mga batang ina ay madalas hindi nakakatapos ng kanilang edukasyon at napagkakaitan ng magandang kinabukasan (It is important to prevent an increase in teenage pregnancies, especially since young mothers usually fail to finish their education and deprives them of a bright future),” the chair of the Senate Committee on Basic Education said.

Gatchalian earlier filed Senate Resolution No.13, which seeks to assess the comprehensiveness and effectiveness of the Department of Education’s



(DepEd) current policy on the Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE).

In filing the resolution, Gatchalian noted that adolescent pregnancy is generally not the result of a deliberate choice, but “a consequence of having little or absence of access to school information, or sexual and reproductive health care.”

He said the UNFPA has declared that “there is a long delay in the integration and implementation of the CSE in the K to 12 Curriculum.”

“This delay is a significant missed opportunity to provide young people with non-judgmental and scientifically accurate and

age-appropriate sexual and reproductive health information that would curb the knowledge gap and provide life skills needed to make informed decisions related to risk behaviors with consequences to their health,” he said.

Gatchalian said there is an urgent need to review DepEd’s existing CSE policy for the purpose of assessing the comprehensiveness of its scope and the effectiveness of its implementation, not only to prevent the occurrence of teenage pregnancies, but also strengthen the CSE and integrate effective measures in the basic education system. **Japan scholarship slots now open for Filipino teachers, students**

MANILA – Filipino teachers and Japanese studies students may now apply for Japan’s 2023 scholarship program.

Two categories under the 2023 Monbukagakusho Scholarship Program were opened, targeting foreign teachers and university students taking up Japanese studies.

For the “teacher training” category, the applicant must be aged 35 years and below, has at least five years of experience, and is working as a teacher in elementary or secondary education or a teacher training school.

Once approved, Japan would fund the applicant’s research on the fields of education management, methods of education, special subjects and observation study in a university in Japan.

Filipino students aged 18 to 29 years and are currently majoring in Japanese studies, on the other hand, are eligible for a one-year scholarship, also in Japan.

Both categories require the scholar to return to the Philippines, the Japanese Embassy in Manila said Thursday.

Application forms and information on prerequisites may be viewed and downloaded from the Embassy website.

Deadline for submission is on Jan. 20, 2023.

The process, the embassy said, consists of a docu-

ment screening, written examinations and an interview. (PNA)

## 90% of firms complying with general labor standards: DOLE



MANILA – The Bureau of Working Condition (BWC) of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) on Thursday reported that as of November, the compliance rate of business establishments nationwide on General Labor Standards is at 90 percent.

DOLE-BWC Director IV Alvin Curada said five regions recorded the highest compliance rate.

“Our compliance rate on General Labor Standards is at 90 percent as of November 2022. There were only slight difference in every region but the high compliance rate were recorded in Cordillera Administrative Region, Mimaropa, Region 6, Region 7 and Region 10,” he said at the Laging Handa briefing.

As for the Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) Compliance, Curada said many challenges were encountered.

“Based on the establishments we inspected, the challenges include the lack of first aider and safety officer. There were no Fire Safety Inspection Certificate issued by the Bureau of Fire of Protection, while other companies failed to implement Occupational Safety and Health programs.

So these are the five aspects of Occupational Safety and Health Law that needs to be looked by the inspection next year,” he said.

Curada added that over 80,000 establishments were inspected by the DOLE as of November, the figure is more than the target of 75,000 companies for the year.

“Our target for 2022 is 75,000 but as of November 2022, we already inspected 80,915 establishments. We are over our target for the year,” he said.

“We usually carry out a routine inspection, programmed inspection. This is based on a list of establishments that we get from the Philippine Statistics Authority, the local government units, and it is programmed for inspection from January to October 2022,” he added. (PNA)

## PCUP eyes more livelihood programs for urban poor in 2023

MANILA – The Presidential Commission for the Urban Poor (PCUP) on Thursday bared its plan to implement more livelihood programs for the urban poor in 2023.

This came after PCUP chairperson, Undersecretary Elpidio Jordan Jr., emphasized the need to push for more livelihood projects to empower the urban poor communities.

“This is the surest way for us to support and be successful in our beloved President Ferdinand ‘Bongbong’ Marcos Jr.’s efforts to alleviate the suffering of our poor countrymen,” Jordan said.

Jordan said government services intended for the country’s marginalized and underprivileged sectors should also include sustainable livelihood programs for the poor. He said concerned government agencies must work together to promote the welfare and interests of every poor Filipino household.



A total of PHP6.435 million were distributed to around 429 beneficiaries from 16 Sustainable Livelihood Program Associations during the ceremonial pay-out held at the Barangay Opao Gym in Mandaue City, Cebu in November.

PCUP Visayas area coordinator Julito Layon said the recipients went through a meticulous process set by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) and qualified after passing the criteria for the distribution of startup funds.

The livelihood assistance from the DSWD will serve as seed capital for the beneficiaries’ chosen enterprises.

The PCUP has vowed to carry out initiatives that will help the Marcos administration realize its goal of reaching a single-digit poverty rate by 2028.

Created in 1986 under the Office of the President, the PCUP is tasked to promote and protect the rights of urban poor organizations and communities, including informal settler families.

The PCUP serves the direct link of the urban poor to the government in policy formulation and program implementation addressed to their needs.

The commission specifically responds to issues on urban poverty such as demolitions, reclamation, and housing and provides assistance to the poor. (PNA)

Libreng makadaan ang mga motorista sa mga naturang expressway sa loob ng walong oras na toll holiday. Ayon sa pamunuan ng San Miguel Corporation, inaasahan nila ang mabigat na daloy ng trapiko sa mga expressway ngayong Kapaskuhan dahil sa mas pinaluwag na travel restrictions, kaya’t inaabisuhan nila ang mga motorista na maging mapag-pasensya at magingat habang nasa daan.

Nakaantabay naman ang mga traffic management staff ng SMC Infrastructure na handang magbigay ng roadside assistance.
