

Gov't target to build 6M housing units to benefit 30M Filipinos



MANILA – The administration of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. has stepped up efforts to address housing woes with the kick-off of its flagship program aimed at constructing over 6 million houses, which is expected to benefit some 30 million Filipinos.

The Pambansang Pabahay para sa Pilipino (4PH) Program envisions to construct 6.15 million housing units over the next six years and involves the transformation of informal settlements into prime residential sites and waterfronts and the rehabilitation of esteros, according to the administration's 2022 year-end report.

Among the features of the program are in-city resettlement, high-density/vertical housing emphasis in

highly urbanized areas, utilization of idle government lands and support of government financial institutions (GFIs) and private banks to provide development loans and end-user financing, among others.

It also involves the provision of interest support to reduce beneficiaries' monthly amortization, local government units (LGUs) as the lead in implementing housing projects and participation by private sector developers and contractors as partners.

As of Dec. 22, 2022, the Department of Human Settlements and Development (DHSUD) has signed

Busway.

Anang LTFRB, lahat ng PUB units na bibiyahe sa EDSA Busway ay kailangan mag-apply ng Fare Matrix/Guide upang makasingil ng pamasaha sa mga pasahero.

Ang Fare Matrix/Guide ay nagbibigay ng otoridad sa mga PUV drivers na sumingil ng pasaha base sa fare rate na nakasaad sa naturang Fare Matrix/Guide.

Nagpaalala rin ang LTFRB sa mga PUB drivers na sumunod sa mga polisiya ng ahensya upang matiyak ang kaligtasan at seguridad ng mga pasahero.

Babala pa nito, ang sinumang mahuhuling lumalabag sa mga natu-rang polisiya ay papatawan ng karampatang parusa tulad ng pagkansela ng kanilang Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC) o prangkisa.

Marcos Jr. sinuspindi 2023 PhilHealth rate hike kontra 'high inflation'

MANILA, Philippines — Sinuspindi muna ni Pangulong Ferdinand Marcos Jr. ang mas mataas na kontribusyon sa PhilHealth premium mula 4% patungong 4.5% dahil sa bilis ng pagtaas ng presyo ng bilihin sa ilalim ng kanyang administrasyon.

Ito ang ibinahagi Office of the President sa pamamagitan ng Office of the Press Secretary, Lunes, patungkol sa nakatakdang premium rate hike ngayong 2023.

Kasama rin sa pinasususpindi ang pagtataas ng income ceiling mula P80,000 patungong P90,000 para sa bagong calendar year alinsunod sa Section 10 ng Re-

public Act 11223 o “Universal Health Care Act.”

“In light of the prevailing socioeconomic challenges brought about by the COVID-19m pandemic, and to provide financial relief to our countrymen amidst these difficult times, please be informed that the President has directed the PhilHealth to suspend the abovementioned increase in premium rate and income ceiling for CY 2023, subject to applicable laws, rules and regulations,” ayon sa memorandum na nilagdaan ni Executive Secretary Lucas Bersamin sa utos ni Marcos.

Lalo pang nag-umigting ang pagnanais ng mga mambabatas na maitigil ang POGOs nang lumala ang kidnapping sa bansa na ang sangkot ay mga operator ng POGOs. Mga kapwa Chinese ang kinikidnap at saka pinatutubos. Bukod sa pangi-ngidnap, sangkot din sa human trafficking ang POGO operators. Bukod sa ugat ng krimen ang POGOs, pasanin na rin ito ng pamahalaan. Ang masaklap, wala nang naiakyat na pondo o kita sa pamahalaan ang POGOs. Ngayong 2023, sikapin nang lusawin ang POGOs.

CIDG credits PBBM's support in successful anti-criminality ops

MANILA – The Philippine National Police (PNP) Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG) ended 2022 with a string of major accomplishments following the intensified anti-criminality operations.

CIDG chief Brig. Gen. Ronald Lee said the group was able to keep the momentum of the government's campaign against illegal drugs when it arrested 114 suspects during the 61 operations they conducted throughout the year.

A total PHP6,752,170 worth of illegal drugs was seized during these operations while 28 cases were filed in courts.

In the campaign against illegal gambling and game fixing, CIDG conducted 1,233 operations that resulted in the arrest of 4,136 people. At least PHP3 million worth of cash bets were confiscated and 1,083 cases were filed.

Lee also said CIDG conducted 8,621 manhunt operations against most wanted persons for various crimes across the country.

As for the campaign against loose firearms, a total of 1,582 operations were conducted that led to the arrest of 780 individuals and the filing of 387 cases. At least 13 people were killed during these operations while 918 firearms, 4,095 explosives, and 15,241 ammunition were confiscated.

Lee also said the CIDG held 183 operations against smuggling and counterfeiting that led to the confiscation

of over PHP50 million worth of counterfeit items and the arrest of at least 300 people.

Meanwhile, CIDG conducted nine operations against illegal recruiters and traffickers. Fifteen were arrested in these operations while four cases were filed with the courts.

Also, the CIDG's campaign against unlawful destruction of natural resources resulted in a total of 262 operations, with 487 persons arrested, the confiscation or recovery of illegally cut lumber and other items worth PHP75,676,899 and the filing of 150 court cases.

Lee attributed these successes of the CIDG in its anti-criminality operations to the continuous support of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.

"With the support of our President Ferdinand Marcos Jr., this resulted in an intensified law enforcement operation and a high satisfaction rating from our compatriots," Lee said in a statement issued on New Year's Day.

"These flagship projects have proven to be an effective and efficient law enforcement tool in providing the maximum or ultimate result in response and support to maintain peace and security in the country," he added.

Lee also took pride as CIDG supported other agencies and units in making breakthroughs and landmark accomplishments in several cases, including the neutralization of the notorious Warla Criminal Group of transwomen engaged in gunrunning and kidnapping of foreign nationals.

The group also played a vital role in solving the controversial case of missing cockfighting aficionados, and the continued investigation of Percival "Ka Percy Lapid" Mabasa's assassination.

The CIDG was also part of several police operations against unlicensed or illegal POGO operations, wherein operators were allegedly involved in the kidnapping and illegal detention of its employees and players who were mostly foreign nationals.

The CIDG Director said the success of the group was a concerted effort and a unified desire of those who championed a peaceful and safer nation for all Filipinos. (PNA)

MANILA, Philippines — Hinimok ni Senator Christopher "Bong" Go ang Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) na palawakin ang libreng medical check-up at konsultasyon sa ilalim ng Comprehensive Outpatient Benefits Package nito.

Ito'y matapos aprubahan ang kanyang iminungkahing espesyal na probisyon sa ilalim ng badyet ng PhilHealth na tumutukoy sa paggamit sa P21 bilyong badyet para sa pagpapalawak ng benefits package sa ilalim ng Universal Health Care Act sa General Appropriations Act (GAA) ng 2023.

Nilagdaan ni Pangulong Ferdinand Marcos Jr. ang Republic Act No. 11936 o 2023 GAA sa isang seremonyang dinaluhan ni Go sa Palasyo ng Malacañang noong Disyembre 16.

"I commend the adoption of my proposed special provision under the PhilHealth budget. I earlier proposed that this budget should be used for the expansion of free dialysis coverage, mental health outpatient coverage, the implementation of the comprehensive outpatient benefit package, including free medical check-ups and other increases in benefit packages," sabi ni Go.

"Regalo na natin iyan sa ating mga kababayan ngayong Pasko tungo sa Bagong Taon," dagdag niya.

Pinuri rin ng senador ang state insurer sa pagbibigay prayoridad nito sa kanyang panukala na magbigay ng libreng medical check-up sa lahat ng Pilipino sa pamamagitan ng Konsultasyong Sulit at Tama (Konsulta) Package.

Ang mga serbisyong inaalok sa PhilHealth Konsulta ay medical check-up, health screening at assessment, laboratory at diagnostic sa mga piling klinika, at mga piling gamot.

Marcos administration prioritizes cheap, renewable energy

MANILA – The administration of Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. will continue to pursue measures and policies to ensure the availability of cheap and reliable energy through the promotion and utilization of renewable energy (RE) sources.

This was the promise made by the Department of Energy (DOE) in its yearend report which identified major plans for 2023 including updating the Philippine En-



ergy Plan, pursuing contingency measures and activities to ensure energy supply during critical periods, and pushing for the continued development of alternative fuel and improving access to electricity.

Marcos, in his first State of the Nation Address (SONA), said energy will be a “key sector” in the administration’s push for economic growth and increased employment.

He said the country is searching for new power sources while improving the mix of the energy supply between traditional and renewable sources.

As part of these efforts, the DOE, in collaboration with the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC), is set to develop policy and framework for new and emerging renewable energy (RE) technologies.

“These include offshore wind, waste-to-energy, expanded rooftop solar program as well as ocean and tidal stream energy,” the DOE said in a news release on Sunday.

The DOE said the Marcos administration has increased investments in RE projects to meet the target of a 35 percent RE share in the country’s power generation mix by 2030 and 50 percent by 2040.

From July 1 to Dec. 14, 2022, the DOE said it has awarded 41 RE service

the regulatory framework for the immediate development of the OSW.

Other accomplishments under the DOE include initiating the development of alternative fuels and implementing the government’s Energy Resiliency Compliance Plan.

The DOE launched on Dec. 14 last year the National Energy Contingency Plan (NECP) for “The Big One,” aimed at crafting harmonized multi-sectoral contingency plans and disaster response measures from energy stakeholders.

Together with the National Power Corp. (NPC), the DOE will also undertake its renewable energy development program, including the hybridization of diesel generating facilities, considering that 89 percent of the energy generation and capacity mix in off-grid areas came from oil-based sources.

Marcos, in his SONA, also expressed belief that it is time also to re-examine the country’s strategy towards building nuclear power plants in the Philippines while complying with the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) regulations for nuclear power plants.

The DOE said nuclear power is also an important part of the energy mix that the DOE is eyeing.

It will also update the existing Nuclear Road Map to guide both the Nuclear Energy Program Implementing Organization (NEPIO) and the Nuclear Energy Program Inter-Agency Committee (NEPIAC) in addressing the challenges of the country’s nuclear energy program. (PNA)

contracts with a potential capacity of 9.2 gigawatts (GW).

Of this number, around 6.2 GW of equivalent capacity will come from offshore wind (OSW) service contracts.

The DOE also issued 18 Certificates of Award to the winning bidders of the 1st Green Energy Auction Program (GEAP), with an aggregate capacity of 1,866.93 megawatts (MW).

To encourage more investors to develop and utilize RE, the DOE increased the annual percentage of Renewable Portfolio Standards for on-grid areas from 1 percent to 2.52 percent beginning 2023 and started preferential dispatch of all RE-generating units in the Wholesale Electricity Spot Market (WESM).

In November last year, the DOE also allowed 100 percent foreign capital in RE projects by amending the implementing rules and regulations (IRR) of the RE Act that had previously limited foreign ownership of RE projects to 40 percent.

The DOE has also endorsed to the Office of the President the draft Executive Order that would strengthen and rationalize

PNP compliant with SIM registration law



MANILA – As one of the major agencies tasked to go after cyber criminals, the Philippine National Police (PNP) has directed its personnel to immediately comply with the Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) Registration Act.

PNP chief, Gen. Rodolfo Azurin Jr., said their 227,000 officers and rank-and-file staff are also encouraged to ask their families and household members to register as mandated by Republic Act No. 11934.

“I directed the PNP DICTM (Directorate for Information and Communications Technology Management) to monitor the compliance of our personnel,” Azurin said in a statement on Saturday.

The 180-day registration period started on Dec. 27 but may be extended by another 120 days if needed.

Existing SIM cards that will not be registered will be deactivated while new purchases should be registered upon purchase.

Over the years, Azurin said the threats of crimes involving technology are evolving and have even invaded

personal communications.

“Through this timely and relevant legislation, we are closing all windows of opportunity for criminal elements to take advantage by soliciting the immediate compliance to the law of all mobile phone users,” said Azurin.

“Rest assured that the PNP, under my leadership, will do all our best within our authority and mandate to make this happen,” he added.

In a previous statement, Interior Secretary Benjamin Abalos Jr. said the “law will enable the Philippine National Police and other law enforcement agencies to quickly act on complaints and cases involving mobile scams as they will be able to easily track offenders and resolve misconduct involving telecommunication devices.” (PNA)
