# Cayetano reaches out to Caviteños in Imus and Kawit

Former Speaker Alan Peter Cayetano is set to visit the province of Cavite once again on Thursday, March 4, this time to give P10,000 cash assistance to 20 beneficiaries of the proposed 10K Ayuda Bill from the City of Imus and the Municipality of Kawit.

10 beneficiaries from Imus and 10 from Kawit will be given P10,000 as part of Cayetano's push for the immediate passage of House Bill No. 8597, more popularly known as the 10K Ayuda Bill.

The 10K Ayuda Bill aims to distribute P10,000 cash to every Filipino family (or P1,500 cash per family member, whichever is higher) so they can afford to buy their immediate needs such as food, water, and housing while waiting for the rollout of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Although Congress has yet to act on the 10K Ayuda Bill, Cayetano and his allies have begun distributing P10,000 cash assistance out of their own resources to selected areas.

Cayetano had earlier said the 10K Ayuda Bill would not be a simple dole-out but would also work as a stimulus package as the money circulates in the economy.

Meanwhile, Cayetano is also set to meet barangay health workers (BHWs), barangay nutrition scholars (BNS), day care teachers, and members of tricycle operators and drivers associa-

tions (TODA).

As part of Cayetano's "Bayanihan Caravan," he will be handing over grocery packs to around 550 BHWs from Imus at the Our Lady of Pilar Seminary to say "thank you" for sacrificing their time and risking their health to serve their fellow Caviteños.

Cayetano will be joined by Taguig 2nd District Rep. Lani Cayetano, Cavite 3rd District Rep. Alex Advincula, Mayor Emmanuel Maliksi, and Cavite 6th District Rep. Jonjon Ferrer IV.

Afterwards, Cayetano and his team will head to the Toclong Covered Court in Kawit to distribute grocery packs to around 106 BHWs and 94 BNS and day care teachers from the Aguineldo Elementary School, and to around 200 TODA members who lost their jobs during the pandemic.

He will be joined by Taguig 2nd District Rep. Lani Cayetano, Cavite 1st District Rep. Francis Gerald Abaya, and Cavite 6th District Rep. Jonjon Ferrer IV.

He said this is part of his commitment to making sure the Filipino people get the best service from the government.###



## PENRO-Cavite leads clean-up drive in protected area on World Wildlife Day

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite (PIA) --The Cavite Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Office (PENRO) in cooperation with the local government of Ternate organized a clean-up activity along the roadside of Mounts Palay-Palay-Mataas-na-Gulod Protected Landscape on March 3, 2021.

The activity was held in observance of the World Wildlife Day with this year's theme: "Forest and Livelihood: Sustaining People and Planet" which aimed to clean the road in the protected area, a wildlife habitat, with approximately 5km from Puerto Azul.

A. Unlayao together with MSD Chief Susan L. del Rosario and TSD Reynaldo A. Belen led the clean up activity.

Unlayao stressed that illegal waste dumping and littering are prohibited under RA 9003, also known as the "Ecological Solid Waste Management Act 2020."

"We need to continuously educate the public to avoid littering especially when entering a biodiversity-rich area and to always practice waste segregation where we are," Unlayao said.

Coinciding with PENRO's National Women's Month celebration with this year's theme, "Women Can Make Change Amidst Climate Crisis and CoViD-19," all women employees of the office participated in the clean-up activity, all dressed in purple shirt to honor the

extraordinary role of women in society as leaders and forerunners of change.

**Cayetano reaches out to Caviteños**

Q: Sabi po ni Congressman Sid Ungab may nabawas daw pong ?209B sa 2020 budget at hindi raw po sila kasama sa nag-approve. Kayo raw po ni Cong. LRay ang nandoon that time. Kasama din po doon 'yung ?70B pension at gratuity po ng mga pensioner.

ASC: Unang-una, very very clear ang record namin sa pagtulong ng military. Dalawa lang kami sa lahat ng kandidato noong 2016 ni President Duterte na nangakong dodoblehin ang sweldo ng pulis at militar, at 'yan po ay nagawa natin. N'ung ako po'y naging Speaker, nagkaroon tayo ng pagkakataon, first time in history, may isang bilyong camp development plan ang AFP at one billion camp development plan ang PNP; ilang building sa SAF, crime labs, at kung anu-ano pa. In fact, kung hindi ako naalis bilang Speaker ay mayroon po tayong ?5B para sa C130 dahil ang ating bansa ay parating binabagyo at kailangan nito. And in fact po, ang Navy at Coast Guard ay bibigyan po sana natin ng floating hospitals.

So squid tactics ito pong ginagawa nila, na kinukwestyon ni Mike. Tandaan po natin, n'ung panahon ko po, in consultation with the Senate and the Executive [ang paggawa sa budget]. So kung anuman ang gawin namin noon [ay] with(?) the Senate and the Executive kung ano ang nagagamit at hindi na pondo. Itong huli po na ginawa ng Kongreso na walang sang-ayon ang Executive kasi kailangan nila 'to sa kanilang fund.

Sinabi n'ung ng ating present leadership maglalaan sila ng ?50B, edi thank you. Tapos na dapat ang issue. Pero ako ay naniniwala na lahat ito ay squid tactics kasi ayaw nilang bigyan ng hearing 'yung 10K ayuda. February 1 pa finile 'yan bakit hanggang ngayon hindi ibinibigay sa Senado, ni hindi naghi-hearing? I mean, ang military ay napakaimportante sa atin pero ang military may pinsan din, may anak, may lola, may lola, may senior citizen, may kamag-anak na PWD. Lahat sa military kailangan din ng 10K ang kanilang mga kamag-anak.

So, bakit ba ang pinag-uusapan natin hindi 'yung mga isyung mas kailangan ng tao right now? So 'yun ang pakiusap ko sa leadership, maging mga kasama ko, maging katunggali, i-sentro natin 'yung isyu. Nagiging personalan, nagiging pulitika eh. We are all for the military and police kasi kailangan natin sila. Sila ang tigapagtanggol natin. So, bakit tayo mag-aaway tungkol d'on?

Ngayon, I've only stood up kung ano man ginawa sa budget, panindigan nila budget nila — sila gumawa sa budget na 'yun eh. Marami pa akong hawak na hindi nila pinasok, pero tahimik lang ako. Bakit? Mas importante 'yung 10k eh. Bakit natin pinag-uusapan 'yung kahapon eh ngayon naghihirap ang mga tao at hindi nila alam 'yung kanilang bukas?

So 'yan ang aking pakiusap sa mga pag-uusap sa Congress. I-sentro natin kung ano pangangailangan ng tao.

Q: Pero sir may natanggal bang ?209B gaya ng sinasabi ni Cong. Isidro?

ASC: It's all in the record, and sa Senate tingnan pa lang 'yung committee report n'ung sa Senate.

Pero hindi naman 'yun ang issue eh. Ang issue, ano ba kailangan ng tao ngayon? 10k. Ang issue, kailangan ng militar ngayon sa kanilang pension tinanggalan nang hindi sinabihan ang Executive. N'ung panahon namin, ang Executive ay sumang-ayon na hindi magagastos 'yon. Si LRay ang may alam ng exact figures. Kasi nga, in consultation 'yun with the Executive, kasi inisa-isa namin ang pangangailangan ng militar at ng pulis.

Q: Sir 'yung binabanggit n'yo po 'yung ?20B na sinabi ni Cong. Mike n'ung isang araw?

ASC: I don't know the exact figures. What I'm saying is 'yung inalis nila sa 2021, walang paalam sa Executive 'yon. In fact, sinabi ng Executive n'ung nandoon pa ako, "Wag n'yong gagalawin ito kasi kailangan ito".

But let me just say ha, that's easy to sort out. Upuan ng Appropriation at ng DBM, tapos na, wala nang usapan 'yan. Kaya 'yung speech ni Mike, para maayos; eh imbes na ayusin, gusto nila debate eh na wala namang mananal sa debateng 'yon — turuan lang eh. So n'ung time ko, panay meeting kami, hindi kami nag-aaway sa publiko. Pinapatawag ko ang mga departamento sa opisina ko, inuupuan ko. Walang lalabas sa kwarto na 'to hanggang hindi natatapos 'yung problema.

So madaling ayusin 'yan, kasi may pera naman ang gobyerno eh.

Q: So kung madali lang pong ayusin ito, kailangan pa po bang maghain ng supplemental budget para sa pension fund?

ASC: It depends sa pag-uusap nila kasi malaking din ang

contingency fund ng Malakanyang eh, at ang 2020 budget naka-extend — basta may bahay sa budget na 'yon, pwedeng i-augment. So there's 1001 technical ways to fix that. So kung ang ginawa ng kabila pagkasalita ni Mike ay sinabi, "Noted, patawag tayo ng hearing. Alamin natin kung paano aayusin 'yon," tapos na sana usapan. Pero mas gusto nilang hiluhin ang publiko na kasalanan ni Jose, kasalanan ni Pedro, kasalanan ni Juan. It's not the time for finger-pointing, may pandemic eh, but ibabalik sa kanila ang tanong ngayon: Bakit hindi sila mag-Committee on the Whole? Ang Cha-Cha walang isang buwan natapos eh, itong sampunlibong ayuda bakit hindi natin i-hearing?

Q: So ang gusto n'yong mangyari sa Kamara ay ipasa ASAP ang 10K ayuda Bill?

ASC: Mahirap gisingin ang gising o nagtutulug-tulugan eh. Alam nilang importante 'to, alam nilang kailangan ng tao, alam nilang kayang gawin — ginawa natin sa Bayanihan 1 eh — pero hindi ginagawa. Bakit? Edi kung ayaw nila, sabihin na lang sana nila na ayaw nila. Eh hindi eh, ni-refer na nga lang sa isang Committee hindi pa sa Committee on Appropriations, tapos wala man lang hearing.

Q: Saan po nanggagaling ang pondong inilalaan ninyo para sa mga cash assistance at programa ninyo para sa mga binibisita ninyo sa iba't ibang lugar?

ASC: Imbes na Bayanihan 3, na naka-hold pa, "Bayanihan Me". Katulad sa Quezon City, 'yung mga nasa likod ko n'on — si Mike, 10,000; si Onix, 10,000 — nag-ambagan kami. Dito, nagpadala rin 'yung grupo. May congressman na hindi lumalabas, pinadalhan ako ng isang supot ng 150,000 pesos, may note, "Speaker, isama mo naman ako sa mga ibibigay mo." So, as you see, ilan lang naman 'yan. Like ngayon, sampu (beneficiaries), so that's 100,000 for ten people. BHWs 200 sila, si Blue at ako maghahati d'un sa konting ayuda. So, ito ay nanggagaling sa private at sa tulong-tulong.

But the more important thing is what we want to do. Marami akong kaibigan sa subdivision, marami akong kaibigang negosyante, nagsasabi, "Gusto namin tulungan ang tao pero ayaw namin ng dole out." Pinapaliwanag namin, "Boss, ang dole out, walang COVID kasi pwedeng magtrabaho ang tao pero kung ayaw magtrabaho, ido-dole out mo. Ngayon po gustong magtrabaho ang tao, walang masakyan, walang mapasukan, minsan lugi pa sa pinapasukan kung tatlong araw lang ang pasok d'un sa pamasaha." So hindi ito dole out; ito ay kaunting puhunan o tulugan.

ASC: So actually, in two places already — one is Batangas — sinorpresa ako ng isang Congressman after meeting one group, pina-meet n'ya sa akin mga businessman d'on, mag-ambagan sila — tig-25,000, tig-50,000 — kasi gagawin nila. That's why personally, ako, kung ano ang dinonate na galing Cavite, dito sa Cavite namin ipamimigay; kung ano ang idonate sa Batangas, doon sa Batangas [natin binibigay] kasi bakit natin ilalabas 'yung pera.

But this is very, very small. Ang sinasabi namin ngayon, ang may pera ngayon ay gobyerno. Ang Vietnam po doble ang stimulus [ng] atin. Ang Malaysia po mas maliit [na bansa] sa atin, napakalaki po — more than times three — sa atin ang kanilang stimulus. So napag-aralan na po ito. NEDA na mismo ang nagsabi, 'pag nagbigay ka ng pera sa tao, 'yung household consumption will be the key to reviving our economy. So kumbaga, patikim lang 'to eh, para makita naman ng gobyerno na kailangan at maganda at lalo 'tong umusad.

So for me, balikan n'yo po ang mga nabigyan ngayon after a week or two weeks or three weeks at tingnan mo. Kasi kung pulitika lang ang iisipin namin, bakit namin sila bibigyan ng 10,000? Bigyan natin sila ng tig-500, damihan natin ang tao dito. Pero anong mangyayari sa 'yo sa 500, makakapag-umpisa ka ba ulit? Magiging puhunan ba? Kaya 10,000 po eh, kinwenta na namin 'yan, that's enough na 'yung pang-araw-araw mo for the next few days, but it's also enough may konti kang puhunan makapag-negosyo nang konti.

Q: Sabi n'yo po ay hindi ginagawan ng aksyon ng kasalukuyang liderato ng House ang isinusulong n'yong 10,000. Sabi n'yo rin po ay galing kayo sa Malakanyang, n'ung pinu-pursue po ninyo ito, ano naman po ang naging reaksiyon ng Malakanyang?

ASC: Well, hindi 'yon ang main topic namin. Pero, pinaaabot sa akin na alam nilang may gan'on akong proposal. I'll just stop there na lang kasi medyo private 'yung usapan.
