

SULONG CALABARZON features LGU Rosario, Cavite

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite, (PIA) -- The Philippine Information Agency (PIA)- 4A's Sulong CALABARZON FB Live episode on May 18, 2021 featured the Municipal Government of Rosario, Cavite represented by Public Information Officer, Professor Pedro Arnel Laparan.

Citing the latest report from the Rural Health Office, Laparan said their municipality recorded a total of 653 Confirmed cases of COVID-19, including 33 active cases and 592 recoveries. On the other hand, the municipal government reported 28 COVID-19 related deaths as of May 17.

Laparan shared that the strict implementation of the quarantine protocols, quick conduct of contact tracing, and the immediate

isolation and treatment of positive cases helped contain the spread of the CoViD-19 in the municipality.

During the lockdown last year, the municipal government used its funds to distribute relief packs which included vegetables, rice, canned goods, vitamins and medicines, and other food items every two weeks to ensure that the affected families need not leave their homes.

Meanwhile, the gov-

ernment official said the municipality already began inoculating its citizens using Sinovac and AstraZeneca CoVid-19 vaccines.

The LGU had also partnered with SM Rosario which served as a vaccination site to speed up the vaccination for priority groups.

Among the 973 healthcare workers (HCWs) and frontliners in the municipality, 621 of them received Sinovac jab, while 63 were inoculated with AstraZeneca vaccines.

On the other hand, only 298 out of 9,649 senior citizens in the town were vaccinated with Sinovac jabs.

#EndTB campaign continues with 3,171 Cavite City households reached

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite, (PIA) -- The #EndTB campaign of the USAID's TB Platforms Projects in partnership with the Cavite Positive Action Group (CPAG) had reached 3,171 households since the start of the campaign in January 2021.

CPAG and USAID's TB Platforms continue to conduct community TB education in six barangays in Cavite City. The city is one of the highly burdened of TB cases in CALABARZON region, according to the Department of Health.

In collaboration with CPAG's barangay champions, households were provided information regarding TB symptoms and the high-risk groups for the disease with regular house-to-house visits and community outreach activities.

They encouraged stakeholders such as the high risk groups and those experiencing TB symptoms for immediate TB screening in the nearest health facilities.

Likewise, city government officials and barangay leaders fully supported the public awareness campaign as Mayor Bernardo Paredes joined their community out-

reach while daughter Apple Paredes participated in media interviews promoting awareness for TB down to the barangay level.

CPAG Executive Director JC Honra said, "We are grateful that our City Mayor Bernardo Paredes and her daughter, ABC President, Apple Paredes are with us to help raise public awareness that TB is a killer disease but it is treatable and preventable. Our health of-

also collaborating with us to promote health-seeking behaviour for TB amid the CoViD-19 pandemic." CPAG not only educates people about TB but also helps address stigma related to TB and HIV (people with HIV are at higher risk of TB infection) in selected barangays of Cavite City. Sa Hunyo, darating ang Moderna at mayroon nang negosasyon sa Sinovac at AstraZeneca na malapit na ring dumating. Malapit na rin umanong matapos ang kasunduan sa Johnson & Johnson.

Ayon kay Galvez, target niyang magkaroon ng mass vaccination sa Setyembre at kapag nangyari ito magiging maganda na ang Pasko para sa mga Pinoy. Ayon pa sa vaccine czar, may mahigit 2.6 million doses na ang naibakuna.

Climate change fuels need for community gene banks: expert

MANILA – An expert is recommending the establishment of community gene banks in remote farming areas nationwide.

Aside from helping preserve crop diversity for future farming, University of the Philippines-Los Banos professor Teresita Borromeo said the banks will enable farmers in those areas to more easily store and access genetic materials of crops they grow.

"It's best if they have gene banks where they have control over access to traditional varieties and farmer-bred varieties," she said in a recent online Farmers and Fisherfolks Congress.

Borromeo, the specialist in plant genetic resources conservation and management, said easy access to genetic materials of crops is important particularly during calamities so farmers can resume planting and growing these as soon as possible.

Being able to do so will help them bounce back from calamities and adapt to climate change, she added.

The Philippine agriculture and fisheries sector must adapt accordingly as climate consultant and weather specialist Lourdes Tibig noted Earth is warming so the climate is changing.

She said Earth's temperature rose by less than 1°C over the years but this warming's impacts on such sector are already intense.

Among the impacts she cited is an onslaught of increasingly strong tropical cyclones that adversely affected crop production in the country.

Warming of seas is reducing fisheries production, she continued.

"From now till 2100, temperature can rise by 4°C - how will agriculture and fisheries survive that?" she pointed out during the congress.

She said the world can no longer prevent climate change but may still try to decrease the rate of increase in Earth's temperature.

"If we can't reduce that rate to avoid 4°C, we won't run out of problems in production, fisheries and human health," she said.

Continuous accumulation of greenhouse gas emissions in the atmosphere is increasingly trapping heat so Earth is warming, causing the climate to change.

Borromeo said climate change, pollution, invasive species and disease, over-exploitation of species as well as changes in land and sea use are threatening biodiversity including organisms in agriculture and fisheries.

There are already fewer sightings of several species including water chestnuts which used to be common in paddies, she noted.

"Some species are disappearing so there's no chance to know them," she added. (PNA)

**PH commits to prioritize health, nutrition, FP at UN meet
Filipino ambassador to head UN population body in 2022**

The Philippines is keen on strengthening efforts on family planning, as well as population and development (POPDEV), as government agencies led by the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) and the Commission on Population and Development (POPCOM) strongly commit to advance and protect gains of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) Program of Action in the midst of the pandemic.

At the 54th session of the United Nations' Commission on Population and Development (CPD) on April 19 in New York City, Socioeconomic Planning Secretary Karl Kendrick T. Chua articulated the national government's goal of providing every Filipino with basic services that will enable them to contribute to the country's achievement of its potential for growth, as well as those that will ultimately benefit their health and welfare, which parallel the Philippines' POPDEV goals.

Speaking before the 47-member body of the CPD, Chua affirmed the national government's strong commitment to the protection and advancement of the gains of the ICPD—a gathering of global stakeholders, which includes those from the Philippines as an active member-state.

The ICPD aims to fulfill the promises in a Program of Action focused on sexual and reproductive health care services as well as rights. It strives to achieve universal access to sexual and reproductive health, which cover family planning, safe pregnancy, women's empowerment and gender equality.

"Population planning and food security are key to unlocking [the Philippines' growth potential, as well as] the health and welfare of all Filipinos," Chua told the global gathering. "Our...goal is to give every Filipino access to quality healthcare, nutrition services, and family planning [by implementing laws on Universal Health Care, as well as those for Responsible Parenthood and Reproductive

Health]."

The newly appointed head of NEDA cited concrete examples to the assembly convened by the United Nations Population Fund that key reforms have enabled the government to improve agriculture productivity and food security: "We enacted the Rice Tariffication Law in 2019 to bring down rice prices for the benefit of all Filipinos especially the poor, improved the country's food security, [while enhancing] productivity and competitiveness of rice farmers."

The NEDA chief however pointed out that the level of malnutrition in the country remains high. He noted that as of 2019, among children under five years old, 5.8%, or around 600,000, are victims of acute malnourishment; 19%, or 2.1 million, are underweight; and 28.8%, or 3.2 million, are subject to stunted growth.

"The COVID-19 pandemic has exacerbated the challenges we are facing in securing food, nutrition, and good health for all Filipinos. Overcoming this unprecedented crisis requires stronger collaboration," the head of NEDA concluded, as he exhorted the CPD for collective action: "Let us continue to work hard together to ensure that our common goal of human capital development is fully realized."

Reinforcing Chua's statements, Undersecretary for POPDEV Juan Antonio Perez III, MD, MPH said the government is aggressively pursuing strategic actions to ensure reproductive health and rights of every Filipino are promoted, fulfilled and protected against persistent threats of the present health crisis.

"Our whole-of-nation approach is laying concrete efforts to ensure availability and access of family planning, as well as other reproductive health-information and services at the community level as a critical pandemic response," POPCOM's executive director remarked. "This includes policies in strengthening the national family planning program and establishing mechanisms to influence internal migration toward highly urbanized areas."

Amid ongoing vaccine rollout, Bong Go emphasizes importance of complying with priority order and warns against complacency after inoculation

Senator Christopher “Bong” Go on Thursday, May 20, stressed the importance of complying with the government’s vaccine priority list given the limited global supply of COVID-19 doses.

Asked if students may be considered as part of the priority groups, Go said that it is something that may be recommended to the National Task Force Against COVID-19 but may not be advisable per guidelines of the World Health Organization-led COVAX Facility.

“Pwede rin po i-recommend natin at pag-aaralan po

ito ng NTF about the students kasi marami po ‘yan. Pero s’yempre, 18 years old and above, ‘yun pa rin po ang babakunahan sa ngayon. ‘Yun po ang kasunduan ng COVAX. May edad na sinusunod, priority list. Darating din tayo d’yan,” explained Go during the launch of the 113th Malasakit Center at the San Pablo City General Hospital in San Pablo City, Laguna.

“Kung ako lang ang masusunod, kung sobra-sobra naman ang bakuna natin, bakit hindi? Importante din po ang mga estudyante para unti-unti na silang makabalik sa kanilang pag-aaral. Pero kailangan muna nating sundin ang priority list dahil limitado po ang bakuna. Bagama’t may dumarating, we are 110 million Filipinos. Ang bakuna po na dumarating ay wala pang ten million kaya pinagkakasya pa po ito sa lahat ng nasa priority list,” he added.

the strict allocation of scarce vaccines to healthcare workers who are caring for COVID-19 patients, elderlies, and individuals with comorbidities.

President Rodrigo Duterte himself emphasized and instructed concerned agencies and local authorities

to comply with the vaccination priority list, says Go. He, however, shared that the vaccination drive may soon be opened to A4 and A5 groups.

“Nasabi na ito ni Pangulong Duterte. Dapat walang piliin. Sumunod tayo sa priority list kung sino po ang nasa A1, A2, A3. Hintayin n’yo lang po, sa

usunod na buwan o soon, bubuksan na ang A4. Mga essential workers, delivery riders, under A4 po ‘yan. Ang mga indigents po under A5 ay susunod na rin po,” shared Go.

DOT eases travel restrictions in NCR Plus

(PIA) --Travel restrictions will be eased in the areas within NCR Plus, which includes Metro Manila, as well as the provinces of Rizal, Laguna, Cavite and Bulacan after the Inter Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) ordered more lenient travel guidelines until May 30.

In a press release, the Department of Tourism (DOT) said it welcomed the IATF-EID Resolution No. 115-A which places Metro Manila, Bulacan, Rizal, Laguna, and Cavite — collectively known as NCR Plus — under General Community Quarantine (GCQ) with heightened restrictions.

However, the DOT noted that while only essential travel is allowed within the area, the Resolution allows the implementation of “specialized markets of the Department of Tourism” which includes Point-to-Point (P2P) Air Travel for Leisure Purposes from the NCR Plus Area, and the Staycation program, subject to the observance of mini-

mum public health standards.

“The easing of restrictions in NCR Plus is good news for our tourism stakeholders. This means more tourism workers will go back to work, and economic activities will continue,” Secretary Bernadette Romulo Puyat said, reminding industry stakeholders that health and safety protocols must be observed in tourist destinations.

Under the IATF-EID Resolution, outdoor tourist attractions can now open at 30 percent capacity with strict adherence to minimum public health standards. Indoor dine-in services can operate at 20 percent of venue or seating capacity, while outdoor or al fresco

dining can open at 50 percent of venue or seating capacity.

Meanwhile, DOT Administrative Order No. 2021-003, allows P2P Air Travel from the NCR Plus Area to a resort in an area under General Community Quarantine (GCQ) or Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ), provided, that such travel must be undertaken through a chartered flight, which may involve short, private transfers by land or sea.

Only Accommodation Establishments that have been granted a Certificate of Authority to Operate for point-to-point travel (CAO-P2P) may accept guests from NCR Plus.

On the other hand, staycation for tourists aged 18 to 65 years is allowed for Accommodation Establishments in NCR Plus that have been granted a Certificate of Authority to Operate for Staycation. (PB)
