

Volcanic smog continues over Taal

MANILA – The Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs) on Tuesday afternoon said a continued volcanic smog (vog) has been observed over the Taal Volcano's caldera, as it also received reports of ill effects from residents around the area.

If volcanic smog continues, the local government unit can temporarily evacuate severely exposed residents to safer areas, Phivolcs Director Renato Solidum, Jr. told the Philippine News Agency.

In an advisory, Phivolcs said reports of "adverse effects" came from residents of Lakeshore Tanauan City and Talisay Municipality facing Taal Volcano Island, and from some workers of aquaculture in Taal Lake.

Solidum said that most of those reports included throat irritation and difficulty in breathing.

"Those (working in) fingerling hatcheries de-



scribed the air as stinging," he said.

High levels of volcanic sulfur dioxide (SO₂) gas emissions and tall, steam-rich plumes have been observed from the Taal Main Crater since this past weekend, according to the advisory.

SO₂ emission on Monday (June 28) averaged 14,326 tonnes/day -- the highest ever recorded in Taal.

On Tuesday, atmospheric temperatures of

34°C, relative humidity of 53 percent and wind velocities of 1 to 4 meters/second within three kilometers of the atmosphere prevail over Taal Volcano.

With the continuous and unprecedented high SO₂ degassing from Taal (see page 6)

Solon wants overhaul of K-12 system

MANILA – A lawmaker at the House of Representatives on Friday called for an overhaul of the country's curriculum and a focus on functional skills, critical thinking, and good citizenship.

Albay Rep. Joey Salceda made the call in reaction to a World Bank report that found that more than 80 percent of children in the country “do not know what they should know in school.”

The report showed that across the three global assessments, only 10 percent to 22 percent of Grades 4, 5, and 9 students in the Philippines posted scores “at or above minimum proficiency.”

“We will get through this pandemic. Economic crises come and go. But literacy and its permanent effects on growth and intergenerational poverty stay. That is why this report is alarming. Unless we make drastic changes to this situation, our actual economic growth will always be much less than our potential. And poor kids will likely have poor families and have poor kids,” Salceda said.

The World Bank said there is a “crisis” in Philippine education, “which started pre-Covid-19 (coronavirus disease 2019)” and has been “made worse” by the pandemic.

The problem is “fundamental”, Salceda said, noting that learners are stunted and undernourished, learning materials are substandard, the curriculum is impractical, teachers are overworked, and schools are underequipped.

He said the proposed Comprehensive Education Reform Agenda, which is a series of 10 bills on education policy reform, would solve these problems.

The bills, he added, propose universal school meals, an overhaul of the K-12 system, and a renewed focus on technical and vocational (TechVoc) skills and improved school facilities.

Salceda stressed the need for a joint executive and legislative effort on education to address the challenges on education exacerbated by the pandemic and prevent the lifetime consequences of poor education outcomes.

He noted that due to the delays in the reopening of schools and for those who skipped school this year, the estimated costs would be 0.5 percent to 0.7 percent of this year's gross domestic product (GDP), and 0.3 percent to 0.4 percent of the GDP for the entire productive life of this generation of students.

“Over the past five years, joint priorities of the Executive and the Legislative were focused on economic and fiscal reform,” Salceda said. “But education policy is long-term

socioeconomic policy. The Constitution binds us to giving education the highest priority. It's time we sit down with the stakeholders and come up with something the next administration can start with.”

He said Congress should push forward an education reform agenda that “we can realistically pass” within this year.

It must include an investment in learners, better quality of education materials, better facilities, and perhaps an overhaul of the impracticalities of the current system, with a renewed focus on TechVoc skills, he added.

“The World Bank observation points out that our learners don't know what they should. The other side of it is much of the curriculum is impractical. The curriculum tries to be a mile high, but it's just an inch deep,” Salceda said.

Reforms to be introduced

Meanwhile, Presidential Spokesperson Harry Roque said he is confident that Department of Education (DepEd) Secretary Leonor Briones would study and discuss ways to improve the quality of education in the country.

“Huwag po kayong mag-alala, pag-aaralan po natin kung ano ‘yung sinasabi ng report at titignan po natin kung

paano natin mababago ‘yung curriculum, lalung-lalo na sa panahon po ng pandemya (Do not worry. We will study what the report has said and we will check how we can change the curriculum, especially amid the pandemic),” Roque said.

He added that DepEd is introducing reforms in education to allow students to adapt to the new normal.

“We are on blended learning po. We utilize modules. We utilize TV, radio, as well as computer-aided forms of educational material po. But I'm sure the process of adapting to the new normal continues and the DepEd, the Department of Education, will continue to introduce innovations,” he said.

On June 19, Duterte thumbed down DepEd's proposal to resume face-to-face classes even in areas with a low risk of Covid-19 transmission due to the presence of the more infectious Delta coronavirus variant.

Amid the pandemic, new teaching styles, such as online learning, modular learning, television and radio-based instruction, and blended learning, which is a combination of two or more methods of learning, have been introduced. (PNA)

Vax shortage in PH cause of low-rank in Covid-19 resiliency: DOH

MANILA – The low rate of vaccination and availability of vaccines against the coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19) is one of the major factors for the Philippines’ poor ranking in Covid-19 resiliency, according to an official of the Department of Health (DOH) on Friday.

In a virtual presser, DOH Undersecretary Maria Rosario Vergeire said many factors contributing to the country’s vaccination drive are out of its control, noting the global scarcity in Covid-19 vaccines caused by “competition across different countries”.

“Naka-depende po ang ating supplies sa ating mga napag-kasunduang (Our supplies depend on) agreements with the manufacturers where there is a global shortage,” Vergeire said.

Another factor to consider, she said, was the different settings or capabilities of other countries, especially high-income countries with “mature” health systems.

“Pag tinignan po natin, ihahambing tayo sa mga high-income countries, tayo ay may health system na different from them, so ito pong mga ganitong factors ay kailangan nakikita rin po natin (If we compare us to high-income countries, we have a health system that is different from theirs, so these are the factors that we need to consider),” Vergeire said.

She noted that the resilience report also combined positive with negative indicators based on the DOH’s initial analysis.

“Pinagsama-sama lahat ng indicators but some of these indicators should be taken na parang negative indicator. Mas mababa kayo, mas okay para sa atin (They combined all indicators but some of these should be taken as negative. The lower the value, the better it is),” Vergeire said.

Despite the low rank, she said the Philippines remains open to these rankings especially to help improve the country’s Covid-19 measures.

On Monday, Bloomberg released its Covid-19 resilience ranking which showed the Philippines ranking 52nd out of 53 countries.

In response, DOH Secretary Francisco Duque III said most of the parameters used in the report were “skewed” to a high vaccination rate and was “unfair” since richer countries have secured “80 percent of the global supply of vaccines.” (PNA)



Mga estudyante isasama sa priority list ng bakuna

Isinusulong ng Commission on Higher Education (CHED) na maisama ang mga estudyante sa COVID-19 vaccination priority list ng pamahalaan.

“We are pushing to vaccinate faculty members and students of schools who are already conducting limited face-to-face classes. So every layer of protection that is put in, the risk decreases,” pahayag ni CHED Chairman Prospero De Vera.

Tinukoy pa ni De Vera ang UP College of Medicine na nagsimula na rin ng kanilang limitadong physical classes noong Disyembre at ang Our Lady of Fatima University na nagsimula na rin ng face-to-face classes noong kalagitnaan ng Enero, na sa ngayon ay nakapagtatala pa rin ng “zero transmission” ng COVID-19.

“It means that if their facilities have been retrofitted well at the implementation of the guidelines of CHED and the Department of Health is really good, we can lower the risk level for students,” aniya.

Target nilang mapalawak pa ang limitadong face-to-face classes sa iba pang degree programs na nangangailangan rin ng hands-on activities gaya ng engineering, information technology, maritime programs, veterinary medicine, at industrial technology.

Hanggang Hulyo 4, umaabot na sa 93 higher educational institutions (HEIs) sa bansa ang pinayagang makapagsagawa ng limited face-to-face classes.

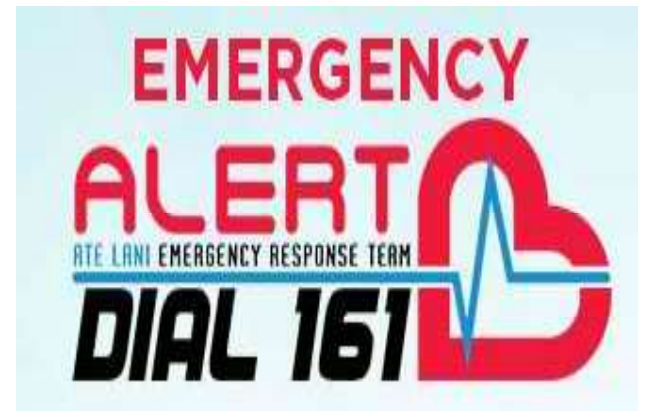
posibleng pagkakaroon ng ‘spike’ sa mga bagong COVID-19 cases sa mga lugar na malapit sa bulkang Taal lalo na sa mga evacuation areas.

Sinabi ni Prof. Guido David, miyembro ng OCTA, na nakokontrol naman ito ng pamahalaan ngunit kailangan pa ring sumunod ang mga residente sa ipinatutupad na ‘protocols’ ng pamahalaan sa mga evacuation sites.

“After these evacuations are over, usually nagkakaroon ng spike, but it’s something we can manage,” ayon kay David.

Bumagal naman umano ang pagtaas ng mga kaso sa mga ‘areas of concern’ kabilang ang Iloilo City, Davao City at Bacolod City habang nagkaroon ng pagtaas sa ‘hospitalization rate’ sa Baguio City na nasa 70% sa ngayon.

Sa kasalukuyan, nasa 5 ang ‘average daily attack rate (ADAR) ng buong Pilipinas. Para maklasipiko na ‘low risk’, kailangan na maibaba sa 1 ang ADAR, ayon sa panuntunan ng US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
