have reaffirmed their commitment to providing more affordable and decent housing to city residents and employees.

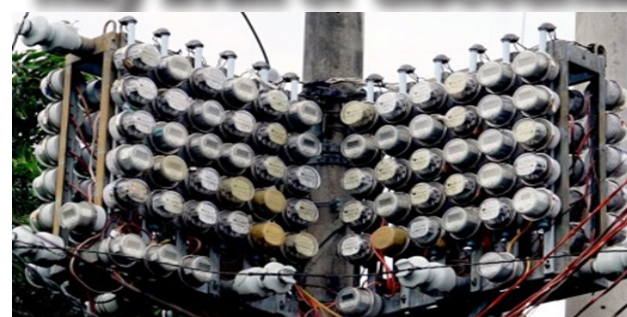
In a news release on Thursday, the agency said the move was a significant step in bolstering local housing efforts under the Marcos administra-

PBBM: Listahanan beneficiaries may avail of discounted electricity

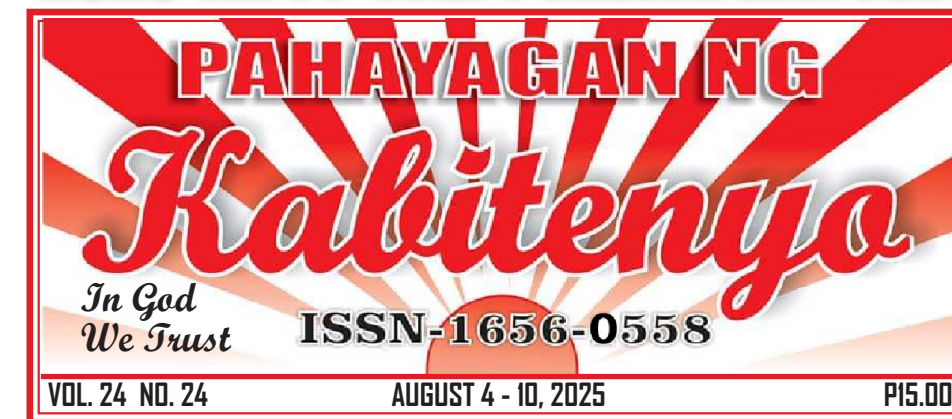

Mga Dapat Gawin Kapag Umaatake ang Gout

Ang gout ay isang uri ng arthritis na sanhi ng sobrang uric acid sa dugo, na ka-laua'y bumubuo ng parang buhangin o mala-kristal na namumuo sa mga kasu-kasuan o paligid ng mga tissue.

Ang biglaang pag-atake ng gout ay napakasakit at madalas ay nangyayari sa gabi. Maaari nitong gisingin ang pasyente sa gitna ng pagtulog dahil sa matinding sakit na para bang sinusunog ang kasu-kasuan.

Maraming salik ang maaaring magpataas ng panganib ng gout, kabilang dito ang labis na katabaan, sobrang pag-inom ng alak, mataas na presyon ng dugo, mataas na lebel ng kolesterol, diabetes, at namamanang gout sa pamilya.

Narito ang mga inirerekomendang hakbang na dapat gawin kapag umatake ang gout:

1. Uminom ng sapat na dami ng likido araw-araw.

Uminom ng 8 hanggang 16 na tasa ng tubig o likido bawat araw upang mapanatiling hydrated ang katawan.

Makakatulong ang malinis na tubig, clear broth soup (malinaw na sabaw), at unsweetened drinks o hindi matamis na inumin sa pag-flush out ng sobrang uric acid sa katawan.

Iwasan ang matatamis na soft drinks o mga inuming mataas sa fructose, dahil maaaring tumaas lalo ang uric acid levels.

2. Iwasan ang pag-inom ng alak.

Ang alak, lalo na ang beer at red wine, ay nagpapataas ng uric acid sa katawan. Kapag may atake ng gout, ang alkohol ay maaaring magpalala ng pananakit at pamamaga, kaya mas mabuting umiwas muna rito, lalo na kung madalas ang pag-atake.

3. Pumili ng mas malusog na uri ng protina.

Huwag tuluyang iwasan ang protina, ngunit piliin ang low-fat na galing sa gatas, tokwa (tofu), o itlog.

Sa kabila ng ilang paniniwala, hindi ipinagbabawal ang munggo at tokwa sa mga taong may gout—sa katoninayan, mababa ang uric acid content ng mga ito at maaaring isama sa diet.

4. Bawasan ang pagkain ng karne, isda, at manok.

Ang mga pagkaing ito ay may mataas na purine content, na siyang nagiging uric acid sa katawan.

Kung hindi maiiwasan, limitahan ang konsumo ng karne sa maliit na bahagi lamang bawat kain, at mas piliin ang mga lean cuts o hindi matabang bahagi.

Iwasan ang mga lamang-loob tulad ng atay, balunbalunan, at utak—ito ang may pinakamataas na purine.

5. Panatilihin ang tamang timbang.

Ang labis na timbang ay nagpapataas ng panganib ng pagkakaroon ng gout. Subukang magkaroon ng regular na ehersisyo tulad ng paglalakad o paglangoy, at siguraduhing balanse ang pagkain upang mabawasan ang timbang sa ligtas at unti-unting paraan.

Iwasan ang biglaang pagda-diet o pag-aayuno, dahil maaari itong magpalala ng gout attack.

6. Magpatingin agad sa doktor kung may lagnat o matinding pamamaga.

Kung ang kasu-kasuan ay mainit, masakit, at namamaga, lalo na kung may kasamang lagnat, maaaring ito ay senyales ng impeksiyon, at hindi simpleng atake lang ng gout.

Kailangan ng tamang pagsusuri upang mabigyan ng angkop na gamot gaya ng antibiotics kung kinakailangan.

7. Gumamit ng cold compress sa apektadong bahagi.

Maaaring makatulong ang malamig na tuwalya o yelo na binalot sa tela at ipinatong sa namamagang kasu-kasuan upang mabawasan ang pamamaga at sakit.

Huwag direktang ilagay ang yelo sa balat upang maiwasan ang frostbite o iritasyon.

8. Uminom ng gamot ayon sa reseta ng doktor.

Karaniwang inirereseta sa gout attack ang mga gamot gaya ng colchicine, NSAIDs (non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs), o corticosteroids.

Huwag basta-basta uminom ng gamot nang walang gabay ng propesyonal, upang maiwasan ang masamang epekto.

Paalala:

Ang tamang kaalaman at pamumuhay ay malaking tulong upang maiwasan ang paglala ng gout. Huwag balewalain ang mga sintomas, lalo na kung pabalik-balik ang sakit. Ang maagap na konsultasyon sa doktor at pag-aalaga sa sarili ay susi upang makontrol ang kundisyon at mapanatili ang magandang kalidad ng buhay.

DTI, OVP, and LGU Paete Unite to Launch Mag Negosyo Ta 'Day Livelihood Program

Paete, Laguna — The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Laguna Provincial Office, through Negosyo Center Paete, in partnership with the Office of the Vice President (OVP) and the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Paete, successfully conducted the orientation meeting for the Mag Negosyo Ta 'Day (MTD) project on July 14, 2025.

of the 4Ps, families included in the Listahanan that have limited earnings and consume not more than the lifeline rate are now part of the program," he said in his speech at the Batasang Pambansa complex in Quezon City.

The subsidy is mandated under Republic Act (RA) No. 11552, otherwise known as an Act Extending and Enhancing the Implementation of the Lifeline Rate, which amended Section 73 of RA 9136, or the Electric Power Industry Reform Act (EPI-RA).

Households qualified for the lifeline rate should register with their distribution utilities to avail of the discount. Figures posted on the DOE website showed that the latest number is only up of July 10, 2023. Citing data from the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC), DOE said only around 1,816 consumers out of the 24 million 4Ps beneficiaries around the country have availed of the program. It said only 31 distribution utilities (Dus) have received Lifeline program applications, while 110 have not received any applications.

A check with the Manila Electric Company (Meralco) said it has around 20,000 customers who have availed of the program to date. (PNA)

It also expressed interest in availing Pag-IBIG Fund's Acquired Assets Group Sale Program, which offers special discounts for bulk home purchases. This move would enable the city to provide affordable housing options to its employees.

Pag-IBIG Fund Chief Executive Officer Marilene Acosta said working closely with local government units help more Filipinos achieve their dream of homeownership.

Meanwhile, Quezon City Mayor Joy Belmonte said the partnership allows synchronized efforts and leveraged strength in delivering inclusive housing solutions.

The partnership is expected to further strengthen inter-agency collaboration in support of the national government's housing agenda.

This is in line with President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s directive to reduce the housing backlog and uplift the lives of Filipino families through secure and sustainable shelter. (PNA)

"The 165,000 classroom shortage was mentioned by EDCOM... The Department of Public Works and Highway's budget is P1 trillion. Do you want to end the lack of classrooms in a year? If per classroom costs P1 million, that accounts to only P165 billion — almost half or two-thirds of the DPWH budget," wika niya.

Pinuna niya rin ang mga bigong pangako ng K to 12, kabilang ang mga specialized track para sa mga high school student at paglipat ng General Education (GE) subjects mula kolehiyo sa high school upang paikliin ang kolehiyo sa tatlong taon.

"The promise in K to 12, even in first year high school, junior high school, there's already a track... Another promise is that for the GE subjects, we'll transfer that to high school so that the colleges are promised to be cut to three years," aniya.

Hindi ito ang unang pagkakataon na tinutulan ni Cayetano ang programang K to 12. Noong 2013 nang ipasa ito bilang batas, isa siya sa mga senador na bumoto laban rito.

Inulit niya ang kanyang posisyon noong 2022 kung saan binatikos niya ang matamlay na implementasyon ng K to 12. Sabi pa niya, "we have to either i-suspend ang K to 12 for five to 10 years until we have enough resources, or fund the K to 12 now as it was envisioned."

Binigyang diin din niya na ang puno't dulo ng krisis sa edukasyon ay sa basic education. Aniya, nakakadagdag sa problema ang kakulangan sa oras ng pag-aaral ng mga estudyante, at mga kakulangan sa mga guro at pasilidad.

"In Metro Manila and many highly urban-

ized places, job matching, et cetera is still far away. Why? There are no more classrooms, teachers. Most of them don't have tablets or Apple computer labs or anything like this. Nag-additional two years ka pa (sa K to 12), pero half day ka naman sa klase. Ano iyon, diba? The problem is really much, much more basic. The bigger part of the problem goes back to pre-K to 12," paliwanag niya.

Ginamit ni Cayetano bilang halimbawa ang scholarship program ng Lungsod ng Taguig, kung saan sa kabila ng malaking tulong ay nananatiling mataas pa rin ang dropout rate dahil sa mataas na gastos sa pag-aaral.

"In Taguig, we have a 100 percent scholarship program. If you graduate from high school, we'll automatically give you P15,000 to enroll, whether it's for TESDA (Technical Education and Skills Development Authority) or college. If it's a center of excellence like UP (University of the Philippines), we'll give you P50,000. If you're a teacher or a police officer, we'll give you P80,000 to P120,000 to enroll for a Masters degree," wika ng senador.

"But check our dropout rates. It's still comparable to other places. Because our scholarship program and our full scholarship, that's only 30 percent of the expenses. The out-of-pocket amounts to 70 percent, which is still massive," dagdag niya.

Kaya naman nanawagan si Cayetano sa Senado na gumawa ng mahihirap na desisyon sa 2026 education budget.

"Let's make the hard decisions and put our money where our mouth is," wika ng senador. ###

SSS to Roll Out Historic Pension Reform Program Starting September 2025 Three-Year Pension Increase to Benefit All Types of Pensioners

The Social Security System (SSS) will implement a landmark Pension Reform Program starting September 2025, in line with the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. and following the discussion of Finance Secretary Ralph G. Recto with the President on the matter. Supported by comprehensive actuarial studies, the program features a structured, three-year increase in pensions for all SSS pensioners – the first multi-year adjustment of its kind in the institution's 68-year history.

The SSS Pension Reform Program was approved by the Social Security Commission (SSC) under Resolution No. 340-s.2025 dated 11 July 2025. Corresponding SSS Circular on the Program shall be published accordingly in a newspaper of general circulation.

Anchored on Republic Act No. 11199 (Social Security Act of 2018), particularly Section 4 empowering the SSC to adjust pension benefits, this reform answers the long-standing call for higher pensions while ensuring the fund's long-term stability.

"We've heard the clamor for higher pensions loud and clear," said SSS President and CEO Robert Joseph M. De Claro. "With the guidance of Finance Secretary and SSC Chairperson Ralph G. Recto, and after careful actuarial review, we are rolling out a rational and sustainable pension increase that uplifts all pensioners without compromising the fund's actuarial soundness." Pension Increases from 2025 to 2027

- The increases will be implemented in three annual tranches every September:
 - September 2025 (for pensioners as of 31 August 2025):
 - o 10% increase – Retirement and Disability Pensioners
 - o 5% increase – Death or Survivor Pensioners
 - September 2026 (for pensioners as of 31 August 2026):
 - o Additional 10% increase – Retirement and Disability Pensioners
 - o Additional 5% increase – Death or Survivor Pensioners
 - September 2027 (for pensioners as of 31 August 2027):
 - o Additional 10% increase – Retirement and Disability Pensioners
 - o Additional 5% increase – Death or Survivor Pensioners

2027):

- o Additional 10% increase – Retirement and Disability Pensioners
- o Additional 5% increase – Death or Survivor Pensioners

After three years, pensions will have increased by approximately 33% for retirement/disability pensioners and 16% for death/survivor pensioners. Reform Principles The program is guided by three principles: Uplifting all pensioners through inclusive benefit adjustments. Recovering from inflation to protect purchasing power.

Promoting the value of working, saving, investing, and prospering, as mandated by RA 11199.

Impact and Financial Sustainability According to the SSS Chief Actuary, the reform will result in only a manageable reduction of fund life from 2053 to 2049, offset by stronger cash flows from previous contribution reforms and enhanced collection efforts.

"Our actuarial team confirms that the fund remains financially sound," De Claro stressed. "We are committed to restoring fund life back to 2053 through coverage expansion and improved collection efficiency."

The reform will benefit over 3.8 million pensioners, including 2.6 million retirement/disability pensioners and 1.2 million survivor pensioners, and is projected to inject P92.8 billion into the economy from 2025 to 2027.

No Contribution Increase This Pension Reform Program (PRP) will not necessitate any contribution increase unlike the P1,000 additional benefit allowance given to all pensioners starting 2017 that immediately required contribution increases to restore financial stability to the SSS fund.

The SSS Pension Reform Program of 2025 marks a historic step toward a more inclusive and responsive social security system—one that protects the dignity and well-being of Filipino retirees and their families. #

The Bacoor LGU currently operates two vacuum trucks that circulate throughout the city to clean drainage systems. However, these large trucks cannot access tight or hard-to-reach areas. The FlexShaft machine complements this by being compact yet powerful enough to clean drain lines in cramped spaces, commonly found in residential and commercial areas. It offers fast setup, cordless convenience, and

efficient cleaning. Its chain knockers expand for thorough pipe cleaning. Mayor Strike emphasized the importance of this machine for barangays, enabling them to have their own reliable equipment for de-logging activities. This will help ensure that canals are thoroughly cleaned, reducing flooding risks by maintaining proper water flow. The machine is also equipped with a built-in camera that can be used to inspect drainage canals and is invaluable in emergency situations, such as locating trapped individuals during disasters. Mayor Strike envisions equipping every barangay in Bacoor with this tool to improve disaster preparedness and maintain the city's drainage systems effectively.
