

DepEd: CSC nod for high school grads in gov't opens doors for learners

MANILA – The Department of Education (DepEd) on Friday lauded the Civil Service Commission (CSC) for allowing the hiring of Junior High School (JHS) and Senior High School (SHS) graduates in first-level positions in the government.

The CSC promulgated Resolution No. 2500229 on March 6, formally recognizing Grade 10 and Grade 12 graduates under the K to 12 (Kinder to Grade 12) curricula as eligible for first-level government positions.

This is in line with the directives of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to ensure the employability of graduates of basic education and address job mismatch in the country.

“We thank the CSC for this landmark decision. It not only opens new doors for our learners but also boosts the government’s talent pool with fresh, young professionals



trained under our K-12 system,” Education Secretary Sonny Angara said in a statement.

In particular, the CSC revised qualification standards for entry-level positions in “clerical, trades, crafts, and custodial services.”

These include structured and sub-professional work, which will be beneficial especially to graduates under the Technical-Vocational-Livelihood track.

Angara said the CSC’s move sends a “powerful signal” to both K-12 graduates and their parents that the basic education

curriculum delivers “real employment opportunities.”

“For years, our SHS students have been trained to be work-ready, but policy gaps kept them from entering the public sector. This reform finally bridges that divide,” he said.

With the new policy in place, JHS and SHS graduates may be hired in the public service once they secure relevant requirements, including experience, training and eligibility for purposes of appointment to said positions. (PNA)

DBM OKs P2K across-the-board allowance hike for teachers, poll workers

MANILA – The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) has approved the PHP2,000 across-the-board increase in the compensation of teachers and other poll workers serving in the May 12 midterm elections.

In a statement on Friday, the DBM announced the new and higher honoraria rates for those in the Electoral Board.

The DBM said the chairperson will receive PHP12,000 instead of PHP10,000, while poll clerk and the third member will get PHP11,000 instead of PHP9,000. Around PHP8,000 will be given to the support staff, higher than the previous PHP6,000.

“This is a realization of the directive of President [Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.], who is truly committed to ensuring we provide needed support for the welfare of our teachers,” DBM Secretary Amenah Pangandaman



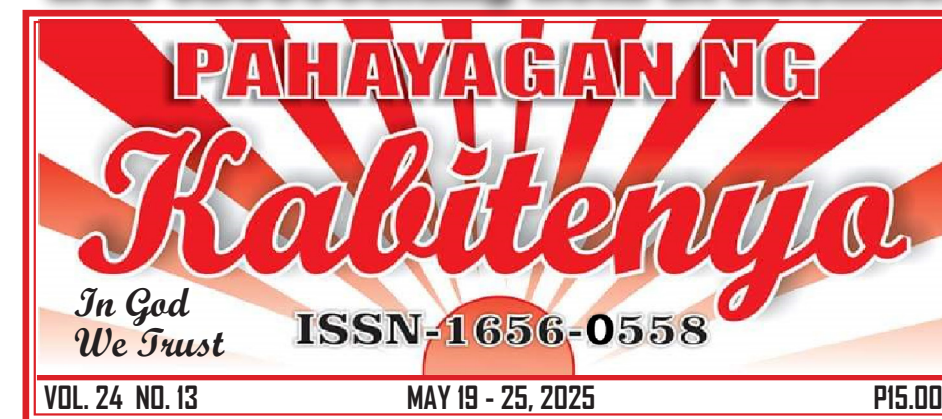
as authorized under the 2025 General Appropriations Act is PHP7.480 billion.

Pangandaman called on concerned agencies to ensure the timely release of higher compensation for teachers and poll workers this coming elections.

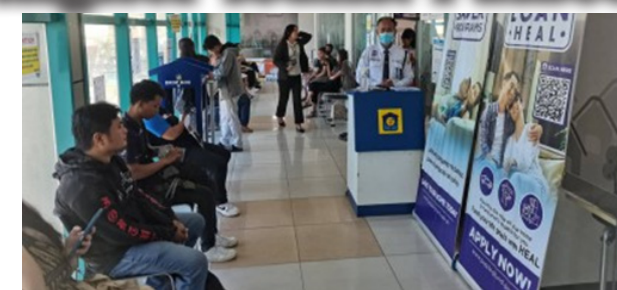

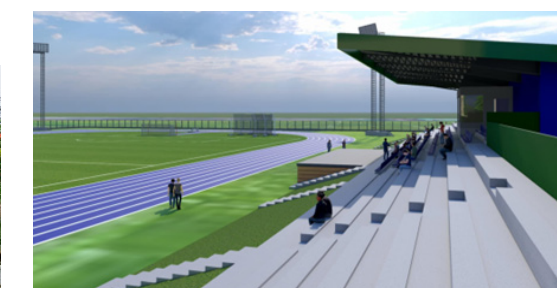

Pananakit ng Leeg:

Mga Sanhi at Kailan Dapat Magpatingin sa Doktor

Ang pananakit ng leeg ay isang karaniwang kondisyon na maaaring makaapekto sa pang-araw-araw na gawain at kalidad ng buhay ng isang tao. Bagaman madalas ay hindi seryoso ang sanhi nito, mahalaga pa ring bigyang-pansin ang sintomas, lalo na kung ito ay paulit-ulit, lumalala, o may kasamang ibang sintomas.

Ang leeg ay binubuo ng mga buto (cervical vertebrae), kalamnan (muscles), litid (ligaments), at ugat (nerves) na lahat ay nagtutulungan upang suportahan ang ulo at bigyang-galaw ito. Kapag may nairita, nabugbog, o naapektuhan sa mga bahaging ito, maaaring makaranas ng pananakit.

Mga Karaniwang Sanhi ng Pananakit ng Leeg

1. Hindi maayos na postura sa pagtayo at pag-upo

Ang maling posisyon ng katawan, lalo na habang nagtatrabaho sa harap ng computer, nagbabasa, o nagse-cellphone, ay isa sa mga pangunahing dahilan ng pananakit ng leeg. Ang “text neck” o ang pagyuko ng ulo habang gamit ang cellphone ay madalas na sanhi ng paninikip at pananakit ng mga kalamnan sa leeg. Ang madalas na pagyuko o pagkakabalukot ay naglalagay ng dagdag na presyon sa cervical spine. Ang pag-upo nang matagal na walang suporta sa likod ay nagpapalalang lalo ng pagkirot sa leeg.

2. Pangangalay ng kalamnan (muscle strain)

Ang biglaang paggalaw ng ulo, pag-ikot nito nang paulit-ulit, o sobrang paggamit ng leeg ay maaaring magdulot ng strain sa muscles. Ganito rin ang epekto ng pagkikiskisan ng ngipin (bruxism) lalo na habang natutulog, na maaaring magdulot ng tensyon sa panga at umabot hanggang leeg.

3. Pag-edad ng kasukasan (joints)

Habang tumatanda, ang ating mga kasukasan sa leeg ay unti-unting nagkakaroon ng degeneration. Isa sa mga madalas na kondisyon ay ang cervical osteoarthritis, kung saan ang cartilage sa pagitan ng mga buto ay unti-unting nauubos. Ito ay nagdulot ng paninigas, pananakit, at kakulangan sa galaw ng leeg.

4. Pagkaipit ng ugat (pinched nerve)

Ang nerve compression o pagkaipit ng ugat sa leeg ay maaaring sanhi ng herniated disc, bone spurs, o pamamaga ng kalamnan. Kapag ang ugat ay naiipit, maaaring makaranas ng:

Pananakit ng leeg na umaabot sa balikat at braso

Pamamanhid o pagkabawas ng lakas sa mga braso o kamay

Pakiramdam ng tusok-tusok o “kuryente” sa katawan

5. Pagkapinsala o trauma

Ang mga aksidente, tulad ng whiplash mula sa banggaan ng sasakyan, ay maaaring magdulot ng matinding strain sa leeg. Ang biglaang pag-urong o paghampas ng ulo ay nagbabanat ng kalamnan at litid sa leeg, na pwedeng humantong sa pananakit, paninigas, at limitadong galaw. Maging ang paulit-ulit na pag-crack ng leeg (pagtunog nito) ay maaaring humantong sa pinsala kung hindi maingat, lalo na kung sobra ang pwersa.

6. Sakit o medikal na kondisyon

Ang ilang seryosong kondisyon ay maaaring magsanhi ng pananakit ng leeg. Ilan sa mga ito ay:

Rheumatoid arthritis – isang autoimmune disease na nagdulot ng pamamaga at paninigas ng kasukasuan, kabilang ang leeg.

Meningitis – isang impeksyon sa protective membranes ng utak at spinal cord. Karaniwang sintomas nito ay matinding pananakit ng ulo, paninigas ng leeg, lagnat, at pagsusuka.

Cancer – sa bihirang kaso, ang pananakit ng leeg ay maaaring dahil sa tumor o cancer na lumalaganap sa buto o ugat sa leeg.

Kailan Dapat Magpatingin sa Doktor?

Ang pananakit ng leeg ay dapat ikonsulta sa doktor kung ito ay inasabayang ng alinman sa mga sumusunod:

Pananakit na bumababa mula leeg papuntang balikat at braso

Pamamanhid o panghihina ng kamay o braso

Panghihina o pamamanhid ng binti

Pagbabago sa pagdumi o pag-ihl (halimbawa, hindi mo na makontrol ang iyong pagdumi o pag-ihl) Kawalan ng kakayahan na ilapat ang baba sa dibdib – maaaring senyales ng meningitis.

Paninigas ng leeg na may lagnat at pagsusuka

Kung ang pananakit ng leeg ay nagtatagal ng higit sa isang linggo, o kung ito ay sanhi ng aksidente, hindi dapat balewalain. Maaaring kailanganin ng X-ray, MRI, o physical therapy depende sa sanhi.

Paano Maiiwasan ang Pananakit ng Leeg

Panatilihin tama ang postura habang nakaupo at nakatayo.

Gamitin ang tamang ergonomic setup sa iyong workspace – siguraduhing nasa eye level ang screen at may suporta ang iyong likod.

Magpahinga at mag-unat kada 30-60 minuto lalo na kung nakaupo nang matagal.

Iwasan ang pagtulog sa maling posisyon – gumamit ng tamang unan na sumusuporta sa leeg. Mag-ehersisyo para palakasin ang leeg at likod.

Iwasan ang stress – maaaring maging sanhi ito ng paninigas ng kalamnan sa leeg at balikat. Kung nais mo, maaari ko rin itong gawing infographic o script para sa video content. Sabihin mo lang!

Scientists finally learn what makes plants grow faster and stronger

Every seed begins life with a simple aim: to reach water, collect nutrients, and stay upright. Beneath the surface, root tips probe the soil and spread into branches that keep the plant alive.

Getting those branches to appear at just the right spot and moment matters even more now that weather swings between long dry spells and sudden cloudbursts.

Researchers have traced that timing to autophagy, the recycling pathway many people associate with health benefits from fasting.

By following a shape-shifting protein through Arabidopsis roots, the team uncovered how brief clean-up pulses let new branches form and help crops cope with tougher conditions.

Plant roots' cellular clean-up crew Scientists at the University of Copenhagen mapped the pathway in living seedlings. They watched the transcription factor ARF7 vanish and return in predictable waves, each tied to a jump in the growth hormone auxin.

“Fasting has become popular as it seems to have a range of health-promoting effects in humans, as periods without food cause the body to activate clean-up processes to dispose of various waste products in cells,” explains Assistant Professor Eleazar Rodriguez from the Department of Biology, who led the study.

“We have proven that the same mechanism, which also exists in the plant kingdom, plays a vital role in the ability of plant roots to grow and absorb water and nutrients for the rest of the plant.”

The process relies on NBR1, a tag that guides used proteins toward a vacuole for breakdown. Each removal of ARF7 resets the signaling circuit so it can fire again a few hours later.

When autophagy slows, ARF7 accumulates, messages run long, and the root loses its usual rhythm.

Autophagy and auxin

Side branches normally form with steady precision. Roughly every four to six hours, auxin peaks at the root tip and switches on genes that mark a patch of tissue for future branching.

“The movement of a root is almost like watching a snake slithering forward in search of water and nourishment in the soil. And we can see that the heartbeat is strongest every time the root meanders forth,” says Rodriguez. Using a luminescent reporter, the team confirmed that ARF7 cycles in step with those hormone pulses.

To investigate the significance of autophagy, the researchers developed a mutant Arabidopsis (thale cress) plant in which its autophagy was disabled which is shown on the right. With an enzyme from fire flies the researchers made it possible to distinguish the normal plant from the plant with its autophagy function disabled. The plant to the right has fewer light areas and thereby fewer potential places to grow new roots with its autophagy function turned off. Click image to enlarge. The pattern resembles the circadian rhythms that guide leaf opening, yet it runs on its own schedule and focuses solely on building the hidden half of the plant.

When autophagy stalls

The group then disabled key autophagy genes to test the pathway's limits. Mutant seedlings produced few-



er lateral roots and soaked up less water.

“When we disrupted the plant's autophagy, there was waste everywhere, and we were able to detect the ARF7 protein among the waste,” says Rodriguez.

Microscopy revealed swollen vacuoles packed with debris. Growth zones that once cleared their protein stockpile before each auxin wave now stayed loaded, leaving no room for a fresh signal. The result was a sparse, inefficient root system.

Why does any of this matter?

Because the recycling toolkit is shared across flowering plants, the findings open new options for breeders and for companies developing microbial soil additives.

Numerous methods to change the genetic characteristics of plants are available today. These can be used to get plants to develop longer roots, faster, and in doing so, become more resistant to droughts or floods.

“One of the methods enlists the help of bacteria that live in symbiosis with the plant and can cause the plant to change its growth pattern. Several companies in Denmark are working on this right now,” explains Ph.D. student Jeppe Ansbøl, who co-authored the study.

Tuning autophagy or adjusting NBR1 tags could let roots chase moisture deeper in the soil and capture stray fertilizer before it washes away, improving harvests without extra inputs.

Autophagy makes stronger roots

“The more roots the plants have, the more water and nutrients they can take up, so the plants grow better, faster,” Rodriguez summarized.

“We're heavily dependent on plants because they feed us, extract CO2 from the atmosphere and produce the oxygen we breathe. As such, it is extremely important to understand them fully, to which end we have just taken a big step forward.”

Pilot plots in Denmark are already testing these ideas under shifting rain patterns. Early observations hint that crops with tweaked recycling bounce back more quickly after both saturation and dry spells.

What next for crops and autophagy?

Upcoming work will examine whether other auxin response factors move through the same recycling pathway and how changes in light, temperature, or soil chemistry adjust the schedule.

Studies in mosses and liverworts, which split from flowering plants roughly 400 million years ago, may reveal how old the link between autophagy and development really is.

For farmers, a timely cellular tidy-up could translate into sturdier yields. By keeping root cells clear of clutter, plants gain the freedom to build the networks they need to thrive in a climate that rarely sits still.

Comelec proclaims 12 Senate winners

MANILA – The Commission on Elections (Comelec) officially proclaimed on Saturday the 12 winning senators just five days after the national and local midterm elections.

The proclamation ceremony, led by Comelec Chairperson George Garcia, was held at The Manila Hotel Tent City.

Incumbent Senator Christopher "Bong" Go garnered 27,121,073 votes to lead the winners.

"Now, therefore, by virtue of the power vested in it under the 1987 Constitution, the Omnibus Election Code, and other election laws, the Commission on Elections, sitting en banc as the National Board of Canvassers, hereby declares the 12 candidates as the duly elected senators of the Republic of the Philippines in the May 12, 2025 National and Local Elections," stated Comelec Resolution No. 08-25, as read by Garcia.

Each commissioner read a Certificate of Proclamation for the senators-elect, who were called to the stage one by one to receive their certificates.

Reelectionist Senator Imee Marcos was the first to be proclaimed, clinching the 12th spot with 13,339,227 votes.

She was joined by her mother, Imelda Romualdez-Marcos, and her sons, Borgy and Michael Manotoc.

Marcos, clad in the polo of her father, the late presi-



dent Ferdinand E. Marcos Sr., said her priority bills would focus on food security, job creation and social assistance.

"Suot ko ang damit ng tatay ko dahil dala ko ang mga pangarap ng bawat pamilyang Pilipino sa pagkain na abot kaya ng lahat, mga gastusin na hindi labis na mahal at sa trabaho at pag-asa ng ating mga kabataan (I am wearing my father's cloth, carrying the dreams of Filipino people for food and commodities that are affordable, as well as more jobs and hope for the youth)," she said.

Proclaimed next were Senator Lito Lapid in 11th place (13,394,102 votes), Las Piñas City Rep. Camille Villar in 10th (13,651,274) and Senator Pia Cayetano in ninth (14,573,430).

All three expressed their gratitude to their supporters and the administration coalition, Alyansa Para sa Bagong Pilipinas.

Cayetano said she would advance her pet bills focused on health, education, ener-

gy, and women and family. Former senators Ping Lacson and Vicente Sotto III placed seventh and eighth with 15,106,111 and 14,832,996 votes, respectively.

Lacson said he had already discussed with some incoming and incumbent senators the formation of an "independent, credible and transparent" Senate in the 20th Congress.

"Kung sino man ang masuportahan, ito lang ang lagi naming ipagdidiinan, kailangan independent tayo, kailangan transparent at kailangan competent tayo (Whoever gets support for Senate presidency, we would emphasize the need to be independent, transparent and competent)," he said on the sidelines of the proclamation ceremony.

Sotto said his priority in the Senate is to "propose right away" bills that would combat fake news and provision of a 14th-month pay.

SAGIP Party-list Rep.

Rodante Marcoleta ranked sixth with 15,250,723 votes, while former senator Francis Pangilinan claimed fifth spot with 15,343,229 votes.

Pangilinan is in the United States for his daughter's graduation. He was represented by his siblings.

ACT-CIS Party-list Rep. Erwin Tulfo, fourth with 17,118,881 votes, called for unity in the Senate and urged fellow lawmakers to set aside political differences for the greater good.

Senator Ronald "Bato" Dela Rosa, who finished third with 20,773,946 votes, thanked his supporters for granting him another six-year term.

Former senator Bam Aquino, second overall with 20,971,899 votes, expressed appreciation to the youth for their support and vowed to champion free education and improved quality of life for all citizens.

There will be four sibling pairs in the Senate for the 20th Congress -- Senators Jinggoy Estrada and JV Ejercito; Senators Mark and Camille Villar; Senators Pia and Alan Peter Cayetano; and Senators Raffy and Erwin Tulfo.

The newly elected senators will assume office on June 30 and will serve until 2031.

The Comelec completed the canvassing of 175 Certificates of Canvass just three days after the elections on May 12, the fastest in the agency's history. (PNA)

Palayan housing project shows admin's transformative vision

MANILA – House Speaker Ferdinand Martin Romualdez on Monday inspected the Palayan City Township Housing Project in Nueva Ecija and described the site as a symbol of real and lasting transformation under the Pambansang Pabahay Para sa Pilipino (4PH) program of the Marcos administration.

In a speech, Romualdez reflected on the progress made since he joined President Marcos during the groundbreaking ceremony of one of the largest 4PH developments so far, nearly two and a half years ago.

Now, he said, real changes are happening in the housing project.

Of the 24 planned mid-rise buildings in the first phase, eight are already under active construction. Two buildings, comprising 538 units, are currently in the Pag-IBIG Fund's loan takeout process, while another 538 units are on track for turnover by June 2026.

Several families have already moved into their new homes, complet-



ing interior work with help from the local government and the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD).

The development also boasts several completed amenities, including a clubhouse, swimming pool, basketball and tennis courts, a central park, and open recreational areas. The facilities were donated by BellaVita Land Corporation, a subsidiary of the Ayala Group.

"Kaya saludo po tayo sa kanila. Iyan ang tunay na bayanihan -- ang pagtutulungan ng gobyerno at pribadong sektor para sa kabutihan ng mga tao (We salute them. This is the real collective action – the collaboration between the government and the private sector for the good of the people)," Romualdez said.

Enhanced protection for children in armed conflict situations pushed

MANILA – The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) is set to come up with a more refined protocol on handling children in situations of armed conflict (CSAC) to enhance the agency's capacity to protect them from all forms of abuse, violence, neglect, cruelty, discrimination, and other conditions prejudicial to their development.

"Here in the DSWD, we are very true to our mandate to serve our kababayans (fellow Filipinos). Para hindi ma-compromise 'yung quality ng serbisyo natin para sa kanila (So as not to compromise the quality of our service to them), we ensure that protocols which guide our implementers in aiding people from different sectors are constantly revisited and enhanced," Undersecretary Alan Tanjusus of the DSWD's Peace and Development Group said in a news release on Friday.

Under Republic Act (RA) No. 11188 or the Special Protection of Children in Situations of Armed



Conflict Act of 2019, CSAC refers to children involved in armed conflict, children affected by armed conflict and internally displaced children.

Tanjusus said the draft CSAC protocol of the DSWD is aligned with its roles and responsibilities as part of the Inter-Agency Committee on Children in Situations of Armed Conflict (IAC-CSAC) which is responsible for the implementation of RA 11188.

"This is still under review by the DSWD's Executive Committee, but we envision that once it has been officially approved, it will be of immense help to our social workers, local social welfare and development officers and allied professionals who are also

on life.

"These new initiatives will put a premium on the agency's unwavering commitment to protecting children affected by armed conflict through its package of intensified initiatives and direct interventions," he said.

In 2024, the IAC-CSAC assisted 763 children affected by armed conflict; 314 internally displaced children; and four children involved in armed conflict.

The DSWD's concerned field offices were able to assist these children and their families through the agency's Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation.

Four children who were recruited by the New People's Army have been reunited with their families and were also endorsed to the DSWD-Northern Mindanao for further intervention and assistance. (PNA)

Let this Order be published at the expense of the Petitioners in a newspaper of general circulation which will be raffled by RTC Br. 90 City of Dasmariñas, Cavite, before the scheduled date of hearing at least once a week for three (3) consecutive weeks. The Clerk of Court of this Court is directed to include this Order in the raffle of notices of publication.

The Petitioner is also directed to furnish the Office of the Solicitor General and the Civil Registry of the City of Dasmariñas, Cavite with a copy of the petition and to show proof of compliance thereof.

members with upgraded Regular Savings can avail of a larger loan, as loan entitlement is directly based on their total savings.

"Para sa miyembro, dinagdagan at in-upgrade ang kanilang regular saving lalo pang tataas ang kanilang loan amount dahil nakabase sa kanilang ipon ang kanilang mahihiram. Sa kabuuan, mas malaki ang maaring matanggap ng mga miyembro mula MPL upang lalong makatugon sa kanilang pangangailangan (For members, their regular savings have been increased and upgraded, which will further increase their loan amount because their loans are based on their savings. Overall, members can receive more from the MPL to better meet their needs)," she said.

Castro said higher loan amounts and faster eligibility also apply to members with 12 months of Pag-IBIG contributions can now apply for a loan, faster than the previous 24-month requirement.

"Pinaigsi narin ang panahon para maging eligible ang miyembro sa pag-avail ng loan (The time for members to become eligible to avail of the loan has also been shortened)," Castro said.

"Dahil dito mas maaga na maka-access ng pondo ang mas nakakaraming miyembro para sa kanilang mga agarang pangangailangan (This means that more members will be able to access funds sooner for their immediate needs)," she added. (PNA)
