

## DA agri interventions awarded to Cavite farmers, fisherfolks

Silang, Cavite (PIA) – The Department of Agriculture (DA) headed by Secretary William D. Dar led the Awarding and Distribution of Agricultural Interventions activity on Tuesday, November 9, 2021 at the Cavite State University (CavSU) – Silang covered court.

More than a year after



the Taal Volcano erupted on January 12, 2020, the DA thru the IV-A regional office had continuously supported the fisherfolks and farmers in Cavite that were heavily affected by the natural disaster with P 176M funds allocated for the province under the Taal Rehabilitation and Recovery Program.

During the event, DA Secretary William D. Dar awarded P 144.5M of the funds to the province with a certificate of the grant received by Provincial Administrator Alvin Mojica.

A total of 103 farmers' associations or 6,384 registered farmers in twelve (12) cities and municipalities in the province benefit from the program with their representatives receiving the certificates during the event.

The beneficiaries were from the cities of Dasmariñas with 12 farmers' associa-

tions, 517 farmers; General Trias with 7 farmers' associations, 316 farmers; Tagaytay city with 9 farmers' associations, 269 farmers; Trece Martires with 3 associations, 400 farmers; and the from the municipalities of Silang with 11 farmers' associations, 1,417 farmers; Amadeo with 10 associations, 274 farmers; Alfonso with 7 associations, 492 farmers; Gen. Emilio Aguinaldo with 9 associations, 1,045 farmers; Magallanes with 11 associations, 557 farmers; Mendez with 4 associations, 174 farmers; Indang with more than 20 farmers' associations, 900 farmers; and Maragondon with 35 farmers.

### Fuel subsidy sa PUV drivers, nasaan na?

Nasaan na pangakong fuel subsidy sa mga drayber ng pampublikong sasakyan. Sabi ng Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) noong nakaraang linggo, inihahanda na raw ang subsidy. Naglaan daw ng P1 bil-yong pondo ang pamahalaan para ayuda sa mga drayber ng pampublikong sasakyan na apektado ng mga serye ng oil price hike. Anong nangyari at hanggang ngayon, wala pa ang ayuda?

Hindi kaya tumamlay na ang pangakong ayuda dahil nag-rollback ang presyo ng diesel at gasolina noong Martes at sa susunod na linggo ay meron pa uling bawas?

**SSS approves 7,158 online funeral claim applications worth P166.31 million**

The Social Security System (SSS) has settled a total of 7,158 online Funeral claim applications from January to June 2021, amounting to P166.31 million, higher by 313.7 percent from the second semester of 2020.

SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Aurora C. Ignacio said that more members are now comfortable using its various online service facilities, which is evident in the tremendous increase received and processed for settlement.

"Now that the My.SSS Portal is very accessible for members and claimants to virtually transact with SSS and conveniently receive their cash benefits through their disbursement accounts; we are highly receiving positive feedbacks from stakeholders that our services have greatly improved through the years. Long queues in branches have been reduced while the processing time for benefit settlements has also been shortened." Ignacio said.

In compliance with Republic Act No. 11032 or the Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Services Delivery Act of 2018, the SSS implemented the mandatory online filing of funeral claims through the My.SSS Portal, along with other services and programs, last July 2020 to provide claimants with an easier, simpler, and faster means of filing funeral benefit claim applications through its brand campaign, ExpreSSS.

Funeral benefit, which ranges from P20,000 to P40,000, is granted to whoever defrayed the cost of funeral expenses of the deceased SSS member, permanent total disability pensioner, or retirement pensioner.

To submit applications, the claimant must have a registered account in the My.SSS Portal in the SSS Website and enrolled disbursement account under the Disbursement

Account Enrollment Module (DAEM) located in the E-services Menu of the same portal. Member-claimants with no My.SSS account may now proceed with the registration link <http://member.sss.gov.ph/members>.

Under the current Circular No. 2021-007 issued by the SSS last July 2021, having an issued SSS Unified Multi-Purpose ID (UMID) or SSS digitized ID or application for UMID card is no longer a pre-requisite for online filing of the funeral claim.

Meanwhile, non-SSS member claimants may submit their duly-accomplished funeral claim application and supporting documents at the nearest SSS branch.

Step-by-step procedure on submitting funeral claim application online and over-the-counter, as well as the list of documentary requirements, can be accessed through this link <https://bit.ly/3dai4TK>.

Those who have submitted their application online will receive e-mail notifications upon successful submission of the funeral claim application indicating the concerned branch assigned for processing the claim and the subsequent approval or rejection of such.

Payments of funeral benefit shall be automatically credited to the claimant's UMID card enrolled as ATM, or their preferred disbursement account registered by the claimant through DAEM, if without a UMID card enrolled as ATM.

**Elderly to get DSWD indigent pension quarterly in 2022 DA agri interventions....**

**MANILA** – The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) will release the social pension of indigent senior citizens every three months, instead of the current bi-annual schedule, starting next year.

This, following the adoption of Resolution No. 1047 of the House of Representatives' Special Committee on Senior Citizens.

Starting 2022, beneficiaries of the Social Pension for Indigent Senior Citizens will receive their PHP500-monthly stipend on a quarterly basis pursuant to DSWD Memorandum Circular No. 16.

The DSWD said on Tuesday the payout will be facilitated by Special Disbursing Officers in coordination with local government units (LGUs).

Social pension beneficiaries who are affected by the restrictions may send their authorized representatives to claim the stipend, the DSWD said in a statement.

To be presented are the original and photocopy of the representative's valid identification (ID); pensioner's valid ID; authorization letter, indicating the representative's legal name; and certification from the village that it is on lockdown.

As of September, DSWD has released the pension to more than 3.07 million beneficiaries, or 80.19 percent of its total target for 2021.

The DSWD is also exploring other modes of delivery, such as cash cards, to fast-track the release of the social pension.

It is coordinating with the Land Bank of the Philippines regarding the application, production, and actual implementation of cash cards to make the release of the stipends more convenient.

Other service providers or payment facilities are also being considered.

Deputy Speaker Rufus Rodriguez, the author of the resolution, said the pandemic caused the displacement of workers, including senior citizens who are still productive members of society.

He said waiting every six months to receive assistance is too long for indigent senior citizens. (PNA)

The awarding and distribution ceremony was graced by 5th District Representative Dahlia Loyola, municipality of Silang Mayor Corie Poblete, DA-4A OIC-Regional Executive Director Vilma M. Dimaculangan, Assistant Secretary for Operations Arnel V. De Mesa, Undersecretary for Operations and Agri-fisheries Mechanization, Ariel T. Cayanan, DA-4A Regional Technical Director (RTD) for Operations Engr. Abelardo R. Bragas, and other DA officials, and the local chief executives of Amadeo and Alfonso, Mayor Redel B. # ANOTHER CONSORTIUM has submitted an unsolicited proposal to develop the Sangley International Airport

In a statement by the group, composed of Cavite Holdings, Inc., Yuchengco Group of Companies, MacroAsia Corp., Samsung C&T, Munich Airport International GmbH, and Arup Group, said an unsolicited proposal has been submitted to Cavite Governor Juanito Victor C. Remulla.

Mr. Remulla had yet to respond to BusinessWorld's request for comment at the deadline.

"The Cavite provincial government recently declared a second failed bidding when it received no bids for the airport project after the Oct. 20 deadline," the group noted.

The group is proposing to partner with Cavite province for the development, design, financing, construction, operation and maintenance of the Sangley airport project.

The consortium said its member Cavite Holdings, Inc. "was responsible for the development, design, and construction of the Manila-Cavite Expressway (Cavite) project."

Cavite is a joint venture project of Cavite Infrastructure Corp. (CIC) and the Philippine Reclamation Authority. CIC has been a Metro Pacific Tollways-managed subsidiary since 2013.

Meanwhile, the Yuchengco Group is engaged in construction, infrastructure development, banking, insurance, and automotive services, among others.

The group said Lucio C. Tan's MacroAsia will provide management and technical services for the aviation support and logistics component of the project. The company will be a non-equity member of the consortium.

"Joining the local team... [is] Samsung C&T Corp. of South Korea that built the Petronas Twin Towers in Kuala Lumpur, the iconic Burj Khalifa in Dubai,



Terminal 1 of the Incheon International Airport, and the extension of the Changi International Airport," the consortium noted.

Another foreign member of the group is Munich Airport International GmbH, the management services arm of Munich Airport.

The last international member is the London-based design and planning company Arup Group.

MacroAsia and its partner China Communica-

tions Construction Co. Ltd. had negotiated with Cavite for the project last year, but the latter canceled its notice of selection and award in January due to the "various deficiencies in the submission of requirements to conclude the joint venture agreement."

The province had issued a new invitation for firms to submit joint venture proposals for the airport project but received no bids. — Arjay L. Balinbin



## PRRD poised to approve limited use of face shields: Go

MANILA – Senator Christopher "Bong" Go said President Rodrigo Duterte agreed with the proposal of the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) on the limited use of face shields.

"Sa pag-uusap namin ng Pangulo, aaprubahan na niya ang proposal ng IATF para limitado na lamang na paggamit ng mga face shields (Based on my discussion with the President, he will approve the IATF proposal for limited use of face shields)," Go said in a news release on Sunday.

Go earlier appealed to the IATF-EID to re-evaluate the mandatory use of face shields, citing the decreasing number of cases in the country and the increasing number of individuals who have been vaccinated.

"Ang pangunahing proteksyon naman natin ay ang mask at ang bakuna. Dagdag na proteksyon ang face shield pero pwede nang hindi gawing mandatory 'yan (Mask and vaccine are our main protections. Face shield is just additional protection but it would no

longer be mandatory)," he said.

Under Resolution No. 148-D (s. 2021) dated Nov. 11, 2021, the IATF-EID proposed the mandatory use of face shields in community settings for areas under Alert Level 5, enhanced community quarantine, and granular lockdowns.

For areas under Alert Level 4, the local government units and private establishments are given discretion to mandate the use of face shields.

For areas under Alert Levels 3, 2 and 1, the use of face shields shall be voluntary.

The said protocols are unaffected by the continued mandatory usage of face shields in medical and quarantine facilities, as well as the requirement that healthcare professionals use them in healthcare settings.

Go earlier supported the proposal to make use of

face shields non-mandatory but urged the public to wait for the advice of authorities and experts.

He also called on Filipinos to remain vigilant amid the ongoing threats of Covid-19 to not put to waste the efforts to overcome the pandemic.

"Ako naman po, personally, as Senate Committee on Health chairperson, ay kung maaari ano na lang, huwag nang gawing mandatory [sa mga low-risk] (Personally, as Senate committee on health chairperson, if necessary, it should not be mandatory in the lower risk areas)," Go said during the distribution of assistance to residents of Antipolo City in Rizal on Nov. 9.

Go also supported the gradual relaxation of physical and mobility restrictions, especially for fully vaccinated individuals, that will boost the recovery of the economy. (PR)
