Duterte signs proclamation creating IT center in Cavite

MANILA – President Rodrigo Duterte has signed a proclamation creating an Information Technology Center Special Economic Zone in Bacoor City, Cavite.

Proclamation 1196, signed by Duterte on Thursday and released to the media on Friday, also designated a building that would be named CBC Asia Technozone.

The planned special economic zone will be situated along Emilio Aguinaldo Highway, Barangay Talaba VII in the city.

It will have a gross

floor area of 50,277.76 square meters situated in a land area of 7,000 square meters.

The President created the special economic zone at the recommendation of the Board of Directors of the Philippine Economic Zone Authority (PEZA).

Special economic zones are defined in Repub-

lic Act 7916 or The Special Economic Zone Act of 1995 as "selected areas with highly developed or which have the potential to be developed into agro-industrial, industrial tourist/recreational, commercial, banking, investment, and financial centers."

An ecozone may contain any or all of the following: industrial estates, export processing zones, free trade zones, and tourist/recreational centers. (PNA)

LRMC says LRT-1 Cavite Extension 60% finished

THE Cavite extension project of the Light Rail Transit Line 1 (LRT-1) is now 60% complete, its private operator Light Rail Manila Corp. (LRMC) said.

"The current progress for the Cavite extension is that it has reached about 60% completion," LRMC President and Chief Executive Officer Juan F. Alfonso said at a recent press briefing of the Metro Pacific Investments Corp. (MPIC).

"The viaduct construction is now crossing from the Parañaque River, crossing Cavite (Manila-Cavite Expressway) and going to Roxas Boulevard," he added.

LRMC is scheduled to complete the viaduct by the end of the year.

"Afterwards, we will start with the electromechanical works — the laying of the rails and the installation of the electrical system as well as the stations," Mr. Alfonso said.

The P64.9-billion LRT-1 Cavite extension project, a public-private partnership (PPP) venture that the National Economic and Development Authority board approved in No-

vember 2013, aims to add an 11.7-kilometer Baclaran-Bacoor, Cavite segment to the current 18.1-kilometer train line. The new stretch will have eight stations.

The first phase of the extension consists of a seven-kilometer stretch with five stations between the Redemptorist Church area in Baclaran and Dr. Santos Ave. in Parañaque.

The Baclaran-Dr. Santos segment is expected to start partial operations in the first quarter of 2024, the Transportation department said. The government plans to conduct trial runs in March 2023.

The Cavite extension is expected to be fully operational by the second quarter of 2027.

Once completed, the Transportation department expects daily ridership along the entire line to increase to

800,000 passengers from 500,000, and Baclaran-Bacoor travel time to be cut to 25 minutes from up to two hours.

LRMC is the joint venture of Ayala Corp., Metro Pacific Light Rail Corp. and Macquarie Infrastructure Holdings (Philippines) Pte. Ltd. It holds the P65-billion, 32-year PPP contract to operate LRT-1 and build its extension to Cavite.

MPIC is one of three Philippine subsidiaries of Hong Kong's First Pacific Co. Ltd., the others being PLDT, Inc. and Philex Mining Corp. Hastings Holdings, Inc., a unit of PLDT Beneficial Trust Fund subsidiary MediaQuest Holdings, Inc., maintains an interest in BusinessWorld through the Philippine Star Group, which it controls. — Arjay L. Balinbin

8M Pinoys embrace modern methods of family planning in 2020

MANILA – The Department of Health (DOH) and the Commission on Population and Development (POPCOM) have renewed their call to stakeholders, particularly local government units (LGUs) to continue the provision of family planning (FP) as one of the vital and essential health services, especially during the health crisis brought about by the Covid-19 pandemic.

The DOH and POPCOM will have a joint health event in celebration of the National Family Planning Month this August with the umbrella theme: “Usap Tayo sa Family Planning atbp.”

It will be anchored on the principles of informed choice and promotion of open conversations about family planning and allied topics.

In the Joint Memorandum Circular between the two agencies, the observance will have four sub-themes that include: “Usap Tayo sa FP so you can Practice Safe Sex”; “Usap Tayo sa FP para sa HIV-Free ‘Pinas’”; “Usap Tayo sa FP dahil ang Pamilyang Planado, Protektado!”; and “I CHOOSE #MalayaAkongMaging”.

The celebration is aimed at integrating the messaging on family planning within the context of sexual and reproductive health during health crises, Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) including human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection which can lead to acquired immunodeficiency syndrome

(AIDS), informed choice and responsible parenthood, and adolescent health and development.

The National Family Planning Month also features two virtual health events entitled ‘Usap Tayo sa National Family Planning 2021’ held on Aug. 4 and ‘Usap Tayo sa Family Planning Experts’ conducted on Aug. 18.

Regional Offices of both agencies will also conduct local events such as online press conferences, webinars, social media campaigns, among others to generate widespread attention on the importance and benefits of FP in promoting the overall health and wellness of the Filipinos.

In 2020, a total of 8,085,000 Filipinos used modern methods of FP, a 6-percent increase from last year. However, there were also reports on dropouts which can be attributed to difficulties in accessing FP services due to Covid-19 restrictions and lockdowns.

“The Covid-19 pandemic is an unprecedented event that has put the world to a standstill, yet the Philippines still managed to make progress in FP. We commend our service providers and

partners in the field for their unwavering dedication and efforts in making sure that FP services are available and accessible, especially during these trying times. This is a testament that the pandemic should not be a hindrance to pursuing open conversations and continuous service provision in family planning for our kababayan,” Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III said in a news release on Wednesday.

“Protecting ourselves from COVID-19 is as equally important as shielding our families from the burden of unintended pregnancies that may hinder our nation in achieving secure and comfortable lives we aspire for every Filipino family, thereby allowing our nation to reach its full economic productivity potential and improve educational outcomes,” said Undersecretary Juan Antonio Perez III, Executive Director of POPCOM.

The DOH, POPCOM, and various partners, will remain relentless in investing in the health and rights of women as well as couples, so they can have the power to choose, plan and attain their goals and dreams for themselves and their families. (PR)

S4CP bill must be given priority: DOST exec

MANILA – An official of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) on Thursday said the Science for Change Program (S4CP) must be a priority bill, as this would provide guaranteed funding for research and development (R&D) and establishment of niche centers.

“It should be a priority bill. Without substantial R&D funding, (the Philippines) will forever be in a catch up mode on developing technologies for the people's needs, from responding to a pandemic, to making our agricultural and manufacturing sectors more competitive,” DOST Undersecretary Rowena Cristina Guevara told the Philippine News Agency.

The bill, which aims to address the disparity in R&D funding in the regions and the lack of R&D in the private sector, hurdled the House Committee on Appropriations on Aug. 4.

Guevara said the measure seeks for the establishment of the S4CP, and guarantees funding for the succeeding years.

“This way, R&D funding will increase yearly, until 2 percent of the GAA (General Appropriations Act) is achieved as an R&D budget. Currently, it is at 0.47 percent,” she said.

With a guaranteed funding for the S4CP, she said more niche centers could be established, and more “RD leaders” could be deployed to universities, institutions that need them.

“RD leaders” are tasked to help higher education institutions (HEIs) increase their published works in journals, their patents and other innovative products. They will also guide the HEIs in their research and in improving their laboratories.

Meanwhile, the DOST noted that S4CP as a program, has achieved various scientific outputs since 2016.

The DOST has funded 38 niche centers in the regions for R&D (NICER) in 17 regions, with a funding of PHP1.89 billion for universities and R&D Institutes (RDI).

At least 42 “RD leaders” were deployed in 16 regions to share their expertise and promote regional development, the DOST added.

Guevara said the Economic Development Cluster (EDC) headed by the Department of Finance pushed for the approval of the S4CP bill.

“The EDC members see the importance of investing in R&D for economic and social development,” she said. (PNA)

DSWD clarifies financial assistance payout

CALOCAN CITY, (PIA) -- The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through the Office of the Secretary, clarified that the payouts for the cash assistance for affected individuals in the National Capital Region (NCR) are yet to be set by the Local Government Units (LGUs).

This clarification was made following a news article that misquoted the DSWD Spokesperson, Director Irene Dumlao, of saying that cash aid payouts in

NCR may start on August 7. In her radio interview where the news article was lifted, Director Dumlao expressed “hopefully... mailabas na nga ang Local Budget Circular (LBC) and sana pati na ang notice of cash allocation.” This, as she explained that funds for the financial assistance will be downloaded directly by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) to the LGUs, as contained in the Memorandum of the Executive Secretary dated August 03, 2021.

It can be recalled that on August 06, 2021, the DBM issued LBC No. 138 setting the budget parameters for the financial assistance. Pursuant to this, the DILG, DSWD, and DND crafted the Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) which will be the guide of the LGUs in distributing the financial assistance.

The said JMC has been signed today, August 07, 2021 and will be issued by the DILG to the LGUs for their onward scheduling of payouts. (DSWD/PIA-NCR)

Biz groups express support for 2-week ECQ in NCR

MANILA – Despite being vocal against another strict lockdown, businesses have expressed their support for the government's decision to place the National Capital Region (NCR) under enhanced community quarantine (ECQ).

"Business is against lockdown because it is disruptive and harmful to the economy. But if DOH (Department of Health) finds it necessary due to (the) unexpected surge of the Delta variant, then business will comply," the Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PCCI) said in a statement.

On Friday, Presidential Spokesperson Harry Roque announced that the NCR would be placed under ECQ for two weeks from August 6 to 20, as coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19) infections in different parts of the country continue to increase amid the threats of the more infectious Delta variant.

Trade Secretary Ramon Lopez told reporters

in a text message, "In yesterday's (Thursday) meeting, unfortunately, the numbers presented showed increasing Delta variant cases, especially in some cities in NCR. Some cities in NCR reported cases almost doubled in one day."

The PCCI, however, expressed hope that the ECQ in the NCR would be lifted as soon as possible.

"The biggest challenge is to regain the stalled momentum, sustain the recovery trajectory, keep the workers, and meet fixed operating expenses," it added.

In a separate statement, the Financial Executives Institute of the Philippines (FINEX) also welcomed the two-week ECQ in Metro Manila.

"We, in the Financial Executives Institute of the

Philippines, welcome the two-week ECQ as a preemptive move against the surge of Covid-19 cases that will wreak more havoc to the economy and our people. Short-term sacrifice for long-term gain, so to speak," it said.

FINEX also reminded its members "to leave no stone unturned" in taking care and helping their employees during the ECQ period.

It urged Filipinos to maintain minimum public health protocols and do their part in mitigating the risks of contracting Covid-19 by getting vaccinated.

"We strongly urge that the importation of more vaccines be treated with urgency and that an aggressive and efficient vaccination program and effective contact tracing be given heightened attention, especially in areas that substantially contribute to our economy," it added. (PNA)

Consumers to benefit from open finance

MANILA – More Filipino consumers can benefit from a bid to make financial services accessible to everyone through an open finance framework.

"With open finance, Filipino consumers will be able to have a consolidated view of their personal data, and their financial transactions, access more affordable services that fit their needs, and ultimately make more informed financial choices," Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) Governor Benjamin Diokno said in a virtual briefing on Thursday.

He said the idea behind open finance is that customers are the owners of transaction data thus, "data should be shared if the customers wish to do so."

Diokno said BSP has established the guidelines on

open finance framework through Circular No. 1122, which is a major factor for digital transformation and financial inclusion.

"It promotes consent-driven data portability, interoperability, and collaborative partnerships among entities who adhere to the same standards of data security and privacy," he added.

Under this framework, customers, as owners of transaction data, may opt-in and opt-out when they want to withdraw or change the scope of their consent.

Diokno said regulators are seeking the financial sector's support in this bid,

adding that participation in the open finance ecosystem is not mandatory.

"In establishing the open finance ecosystem, the BSP sees the value of placing the governance of the industry into a single body with explicit formalized self-governance structure where the industry standards and inter-participant business rules are housed," he said.

An Open Finance Oversight Committee (OFOC) is now being formed and this will include representatives from each classification of banks, non-bank financial institutions, electronic money issuers, operators of payment systems, and other related sectors, he added. (PNA)



DTI readies livelihood, loan programs amid ECQ in Metro Manila

MANILA – Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Secretary Ramon Lopez said on Friday the agency is ready to help poor communities via its livelihood program and small-scale businesses that will be affected by the two-week enhanced community quarantine (ECQ) in Metro Manila.

In an interview during an online program, Lopez said they are distributing livelihood kits to poor communities nationwide.

He added that the DTI's regional and provincial offices distribute livelihood kits worth PHP5,000 to PHP10,000 as grants to those who would like to start their own micro businesses such as sari-sari store and carinderia (eatery) among others.

To date, the agency has provided livelihood kits to more than 57,000 beneficiaries.

DTI's financing arm

Small Business (SB) Corp. also provides zero-interest loans for existing micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs).

Lopez said the Covid-19 Assistance to Restart Enterprises (CARES) program has released over PHP5 billion worth of loans to MSMEs affected by business closures due to lockdowns amid the pandemic.

SB Corp. continues to implement this project, and affected MSMEs due to another ECQ in the National Capital Region can tap this program, he added.

"Every year, SB Corp. has PHP1.5 billion budget," Lopez said.

'Ayuda' not wage replacement

Admitting that the PHP1,000 to PHP4,000 cash aid is not enough to cover family expenditure for two weeks as Metro Manila faces another ECQ measure, the DTI chief said the cash aid is not supposed to replace wages but to help poor families.

The government is allotting PHP12 billion as cash aid for poor families in NCR for the next two weeks.

Earlier, the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) said a one-week ECQ in Metro Manila would cost the economy PHP105 billion.

From Aug. 6 until Aug. 20, NCR is under the most stringent quarantine measures amid the threat of the more transmissible Covid-19 Delta variant. (PNA)

BACTERIA IN MT. MAYON SOILS DISCOVERED TO HAVE ANTIBIOTIC, ANTI-CANCER POTENTIAL

University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB) researchers examined 30 bacterial species from Mt. Mayon soils and discovered that there are some which exhibited antibiotic and anti-cancer properties.

One of these bacteria was Streptomyces sp. A1-08, a new bacterial species to be given the name "Streptomyces mayonensis A1-08" if ever verified to be novel. It has "activity against numerous potentially pathogenic microorganisms and anti-colorectal cancer potential."

Kristel Mae Oliveros, an assistant professor in the Microbiology

Division of UPLB and also the project leader, expressed that their team is looking forward to identifying more undiscovered species considering a volcano is one of the least studied fields.

In their research, Oliveros said that they utilized organisms that represented some of the major groupings of microbes.

Alongside Oliveros, Albert Remus Rosana, a University of Alberta, Canada Ph.D. student and one of the members of this project, also stated that they considered test organisms that are related to the human pathogen list identified by the World Health Organization (WHO) that poses an immense threat to public

health by 2050 owing to antibiotic resistance.

The 30 species of microorganisms from which chemical compounds may be produced have potential pharmaceutical, medical, and cosmeceutical benefits.

However, Streptomyces sp. A1-08 was one of a kind due to the antagonistic effect it has on all test bacteria even on the methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus or simply MRSA. MRSA itself is highly resistant to antibiotics which makes it challenging to cure infections.
